Our Partnership with Four Diamonds is ongoing. However, this year's contributions are not flowing in very quickly. We are beginning a short-term challenge to help kick start our donations. The challenge is called the

"PRINGLES CAN CHALLENGE"

Pringles come in 3 sizes: Personal snack size, 2.3-ounce size, and full size can.

The main challenge is for each Lion, Lioness and LEO to fill the 2.3 ounce can with pocket change between now and the February Council Meeting.

The Mini Challenge is to do the same with the snack size can.

The EXTREME CHALLENGE is to fill a full size pringles can.

There are 2 ways to turn in the funds collected:

- 1. Bring the filled and counted pringles can to the February Council Meeting (Not Recommended)
- 2. Encourage your clubs to have a "counting party" to count and wrap the money, taking pictures as you do so. The club would deposit the money in their Activities Account and send me a check (Made out to Four Diamonds). Included, with the check should be a list of those who contributed and the amount. Make this a fun event and be sure to report the service on MyLion. Going to Sam's Club and purchasing a couple of cases of the 2.3 Ounce cans and then giving one to every club member will help you to kick off the challenge. PID Cindy and I have completed 2 of the 3 challenges. We have filled the Challenge Can and the Extreme Challenge Can and will continue filling a Challenge Can until the end of the Challenge period. Have Fun with this Challenge. You could place Cans around the community and ask for pocket change. Use your imagination and go for broke.

International Board of Directors Approves Dues Adjustment Resolution

Lions Clubs International supports clubs and members around the world so we can advance our global mission of service together. Our international support and the work of Lions Clubs International is fueled by the international dues of our incredible members.

At the International Board of Directors meeting in October, the Board voted to approve an international dues adjustment resolution that will be voted on at the International Convention in Singapore in 2020.

In recent years, it has become increasingly clear that the services Lions Clubs International has been able to provide to members with the available budget is no longer in line with what Lions need and expect.

The Board of Directors undertook an extensive review of Lions Clubs International's financials, including the implementation of substantial budget reductions. After much consideration, the board proposed to adjust dues by US\$3 effective July 2021, raising dues to US\$46, then adjusted annually for U.S. inflation thereafter. We will use a three-year inflation average not to exceed 3.0% or be lower than 1.5%.

Why an international dues adjustment is needed:

We realize the association has been reluctant to adjust

dues over the years, and we have not adjusted international dues since 2011. The proposed adjustment will help cover our costs and allow us to suitably serve our members' needs. With that said, the Board of Directors did not take this issue lightly, nor are we minimizing the value of each dollar that our members contribute.

As we consider this dues adjustment, it is essential that we keep in mind that our global efforts and initiatives support more than 1.4 million members in 48,000 clubs around the world. Through the support of staff, we are able to serve globally on the level that we do, keeping members and clubs fully supported with service resources, training events and software, club operational support. international meetings, language services, technology. Foundation support, leadership support, and everything else we have come to expect as Lions.

A dues adjustment will allow Lions Clubs International to provide improved support to Lions and to continue to invest in improving programs and digital products such as our website and MyLion. It will also allow us to invest in new programs such as a new online learning platform, development of new curriculum such as digital literacy, training videos, global advertising, marketing automation, digital and video

storytelling and others tools and initiatives that will enhance our impact, our brand, and our membership.

Why your help is needed

Essentially, we have to decide whether or not we want Lions Clubs International to continue to grow and thrive. Lions is more than a way of life. It's also an investment of money, time, energy and passion. As with any good investment, the more we put in, the more returns we see.

We have developed an international dues adjustment FAQ and PPT to help you understand why this decision has been reached and I hope that you will see this adjustment as we do: as an investment in the future of Lions.

Through your support, we can ensure that Lions are positioned for success in the future.

Multiple District 14 State Council Chairperson William H. Morgan has issued a call for the 2019-2020 PA State Council of Lions Clubs' Council of Governors to convene for its third Regular Meeting at 1:00 p.m. Saturday, February 8, 2020 at the Ramada by Wyndham State College Hotel & Conference Center, 1450 South Atherton Street, State College, PA. State Council will also hold a Preliminary Meeting at 2:00 p.m. Friday, February 7, 2020 at the hotel.

In addition to the State Council meetings, select state committees will hold meetings Saturday morning, February 8, 2020 at the hotel. State committee chairpersons and coordinators desiring to be assigned meeting times and space must contact the State Office prior to December 31, 2019.

Two meal functions -- a luncheon and an evening banquet -- will be held Saturday, February 8, 2020, as part of the State Council meeting weekend. An RSVP form is included in this Call of Meeting packet.

Individuals desiring discounted overnight accommodations (\$80.00/night plus tax) at the Ramada by Wyndham State College will need to <u>call the hotel reservation desk at (814) 238 3001.</u> Online reservations will not be available. Please use code "CG07LC" or "the Pennsylvania Lions State Council Meeting" when calling to make reservations. <u>The discounted rate is only valid for reservations made through January 7</u>, 2020.

Committee chairpersons/coordinators who have an Action Item for State Council to consider at the February 8, 2020 meeting <u>must</u> submit that item in written form to the State Office no later than Wednesday, January 22, 2020. Any Action Item proposal received by the State Office less than 14 days prior to a State Council meeting must be approved by a two-thirds vote (12 of 18) of the Council of Governors before it may be presented for consideration. An Action Item that does not receive the needed two-thirds vote for consideration will be tabled until the next State Council meeting. Committee chairpersons/coordinators with Action Items must be present or have a representative at both the Preliminary and Regular State Council meetings. With some notable exceptions, all oral committee reports to State Council will be subject to a three-minute time limit. Complete versions of all written committee reports will be included in the official minutes of the State Council meeting.
