Her passion to pursue occupational therapy began freshman year when she co-founded a robotics team for children with special needs. The team consisted of three kids with different abilities, strengths, and personalities. Throughout the first year she was talking to one of the boys on the team and his older sister (who helped form the team) about his life and living with Cerebral Palsy. His sister told Cassie about his Occupational Therapist who helped design braces for him, allowing him to walk. From that moment she knew what she wanted to do with her life.

Over the past year, she has volunteered at the Barn at Spring Brook Farm. The Barn is a place where children with disabilities can take care of farm animals in order to develop social skills, as well as gross and fine motor skills. With the Barn, Cassie has worked with many children ranging in age and ability. For most of the year, she volunteers multiple times a week, and this last summer she volunteered for four weeks, five days a week at a summer camp at the Barn. Last summer Cassie also spent 8 days in Rochester, New York volunteering at a sports camp for visually impaired children, Camp Abilities. She was paired with a child and she worked with her to overcome some of her challenges and not let her lack of vision cause her to be left out. This camp is extremely beneficial to the students and the counselors because of the community created over those 8 days. This was truly one of best experiences she has had and truly helped her know she was prepared for college and Occupational Therapy was the right path for her.

Kyle Shah has been named the Avon Grove Lions Club Student of the Month for January from the Avon Grove High School. He is the son of Mrunal and Malini Shah of Lincoln University. Kyle's list of school activities includes AGTV, Computer Science Club, Cross Country, Indoor Track, Robotics and Student Council. Kyle has been active in the community by providing student consulting with the Avon Grove Education Foundation. Kyle's list of honors includes First Robotics (2015, 2016) and he has achieved Honors, High Honors and Distinguished Honors throughout High School. Kyle plans to attend DCCC for his first 2 years of college and then transfer to West Chester University to complete his B.S. in Computer Science focusing on Web Development. Teachers he has most been influenced by are Mr. Childs, Mr. Jones, Mrs. Penn, Mr. Terrizzi and Dr. Zook.
