From the Desk of the Governor



As you receive and read this issue of Lion Eyes, I expect to be in Altoona for our third meeting of the State Council of Governors. Below, I will share some good information from the advance reports for this meeting, but first I want to encourage you to set aside Saturday April 13th for our District 14P Convention. It will be held at Trinity EC Church in Boyertown and will feature good seminars including training on the new My Lion app which will replace mylci in July. I hope to see you there.

Our State Convention will be held May 16th to 19th at the Kalahari Resort in the Poconos. This convention will also feature a variety of good speakers including our International President, Gudrun Yngvadottir. Registration forms have been in Lion Eyes and on the district website.

First in the news from the advanced reports for the Council meeting, our District 14P donated \$6450 to the PA Sight Conservation and Eye Research Foundation from August 2017 through June 2018. This amounts to \$5.20 per member and places us sixth among the seventeen districts in the state.

Second, our donations to Lions Clubs International Foundation so far this Lions year total \$9265 and this places us third among the seventeen districts in the state. Remember that LCIF has a new three year capital campaign underway and we ask for your continued donations so that we can serve 200 million people per year in a couple years from now.

Third, is my District Governor project in support of our State Council's campaign to raise \$100,000 this year for the Four Diamonds Foundation. PID Tom Gregg's report for this Council meeting lists seven "gold clubs" which have donated at least \$15.75 per member. Of these seven "gold clubs", three are from our District 14P. These are the Central Berks Lions Club, Eagle Glenmoore Lions Club, and the Kempton Lions Club. I believe we have a fourth gold club, the Boyertown Lions Club, but that check has not yet been delivered due to an illness in the State office. PID Tom Gregg's report lists the PBM Lions Club as a "silver club" for donations over \$10.50 per member and the Oxford Lions Club as a "bronze club" for donations over \$5.25 per member. The Amity Lioness Club and the Honey Brook Lions Club have also donated. Remember that you can donate through our district charities list. It is listed as the District Governor Project, "PA Lions Care for Kids". We sent the first half year of donations in late December and will send the donations for the second half of the year in June.

Along with the childhood cancer global cause, the Eagle Glenmoore Lions have applied for and have been approved for a \$500 matching grant from the PA Lions Foundation to purchase a "Brady Buggy" to be donated to a local children's hospital. These are buggies in the form of an animal (ours is obviously a lion) and are large enough to include an IV pole and give mobility to the children.

In other news, two of our Lions, Linda Long from the Exeter Township Lions Club, and Sue Prutzman from the Boyertown Lions Club will be attending the Regional Lions Leadership Institute at the Wyndam Garden Hotel in York in late February. This is a valuable training session that will help our district and we encourage other Lions to attend in future years.

Through our state disaster relief coordinator, Lion Jim Groff, we helped a family in Bethel that was flooded out last summer and are trying to help another family in Bowers. Thanks for all the Lions Clubs who donated on behalf of the Bethel family.

Finally, Lions Clubs International has approved the reactivation of the Lionville Lions Club to serve as a "cyber club". We wish this new club well in providing service for the community.

Thank you to all our District 14P Lions for this good service and keep up the good work.

There will be new exhibitors and the opportunity to hear directly from them and of course our traditional Basket Raffle plus we are hoping to hold a Service Project.

I have written repeatedly about change and how we do need to spend time reflecting on our successes of the past but it is time for all of us to get serious about it in order to be relevant in our ever changing and fast moving (not to mention extremely cold right now) pace of life. So I sincerely hope you can spare some time to come out and participate

On a different note, I am extremely excited to see the reactivation of the **Lionville Lions Club** – a Club we lost at the end of the 2017 -2018 Lions Year. What is exciting about this reactivation is that this will be District 14-P's first **Cyber Lions Club**, focusing on Service to the Community – some of its's members are transferring from other Clubs **BUT** they have already recruited new Service minded Lions and have also encouraged a number of former Lions to return to our membership.

Despite the extreme weather we are experiencing I am also destined to be heading to Chicago in the next couple of weeks to participate in the District Governor Elect/First Vice District Governor School.......another change introduced this year by LCI – instead of final training being held at International Convention, all of the 2019 – 2020 Governors are being brought to the Home of Lions – Chicago. I am just hoping that the weather will be a little kinder that it is being this week!! We shall see.

Dear Club Secretary:

Please forward your list of Delegates and Alternates for the upcoming District 14-P convention to be held at Trinity Church, 250 Sweinhart Road, Boyertown, PA 19512 on Saturday, April 13, 2019.

As per the Constitution, each chartered Lions club in good standing with the District shall be entitled to one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for every ten (10) member or major fraction thereof (major fraction is 5 or more). Should your club have a PDG as a member, they will receive their PDG Delegate Card directly from the Certification Committee. *Please note all delegates and alternates must be a member of Lions for one year and a day in order to quality.*

<u>Example</u>: Your club has 20 members; you are entitled to two (2) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 44 members; you are entitled to four (4) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 37 members and a PDG; you are entitled to four (4) Club Delegates/Alternates and one (1) PDG Delegate.

The list of delegates and alternates need to be emailed (or typed copy via USPS) no later than March 31, 2019 so the committee can process the credential in time for the convention. Credential will be available for pick up the day of the convention at certification table. Thank you for assistance and cooperation.
