

Instructors include International Directors, PID's, graduates of Lions Certified Instructor Program, Lions University Masters & Doctorate recipients, and experienced Past District Governors.

What subjects are covered?

The subjects include material necessary for Lions leaders. The curriculum is approved and provided by Lions Clubs International.

What are the instruction days?

How many students?

There is a limit of 40 students for the RLLI. There is no limit on the number of Lions a district may register. We will have a standby list to fill a vacancy if needed.

Attendance at the RLLI does not guarantee that you will be selected for positions of Leadership in your district, but it does PREPARE you to take on positions of increasing responsibility by giving you the building blocks that are required to be a successful Lion leader.



DISTRICT 14-C LCI CONVENTION BUS TRIP MONTREAL, CANADA June 22, 2022 through June 29, 2022 BUS TRIP INFORMATION



Based on your responses to our survey earlier this year, District 14-C is offering a bus trip to Montreal, Canada, for the 2022 Lions Clubs International Convention. The trip will begin on Wednesday, June 22, 2022 and end on Wednesday, June 29, 2022. Here is our itinerary:

Wednesday, June 22

- Depart Wednesday, June 22nd multiple pick-up locations
- Drive to Alexandria Bay, NY, with several stops along the way to stretch, eat, and use the restroom (lunch is not included in the package)
- Check into our Alexandria Bay hotel (Riveredge Resort)
- · Dinner together at a local restaurant

Thursday, June 23

- Breakfast at the hotel
- · Shuttle boat to Heart Island and tour Bolt Castle
- · Return to Alexandria Bay, board bus, and drive to Montreal Thursday afternoon
- Check into our Montreal hotel (Hotel Delta by Marriott) and pick up convention materials Thursday afternoon/evening

Friday, June 24, through Tuesday, June 28

- Enjoy all of the activities the LCI Convention has to offer
- Guided bus tour of Montreal (date and time to be determined depending on the convention schedule)

Wednesday, June 29

Board our bus and drive home, making restroom, stretch, and lunch stops along the way (lunch is not
included in the package)

The cost of the trip, PER PERSON, varies depending on the number of people sharing a hotel room:

- 1 person \$1,190
- 2 people \$993 per person
- 3 people \$941 per person
- 4 people \$882 per person

THESE PRICES INCLUDE all transportation costs to and from Montreal, lodging in Alexandria Bay, dinner and breakfast in Alexandria Bay, shuttle boat to Heart Island, tour of Bolt Castle, room deposit for your Montreal hotel room, LCI Convention registration, guided bus tour of Montreal, driver's lodging in Montreal, parking fees for the bus, and driver gratuities. THESE PRICES DO NOT INCLUDE lodging in Montreal (other than your room deposit) or any meals other than dinner and breakfast in Alexandria Bay. You may subtract \$225 from the prices listed above for individuals who will not register for the LCI Convention. PLEASE NOTE - At least one registered convention attendee must occupy each room we reserve in our Montreal Hotel.

A deposit must be paid for each person registering for this trip. The deposit, PER PERSON, varies depending on the number of people sharing a room, as shown below. The deposit covers the following costs: deposit for Wolf's Bus Lines, Montreal hotel room deposit, and LCI Convention registration:

- 1 person \$475
- 2 people \$375 per person (\$150 if not registering for LCI convention)
- . 3 people \$342 per person (\$117 if not registering for LCI Convention)
- 4 people \$325 per person (\$100 if not registering for LCI Convention)

Half of the remaining balance must be paid by April 1, 2022, and the remaining balance must be paid by May 1, 2022.

The nightly rate at Hotel Delta by Marriott is \$167. With taxes, the rate is just under \$200 per night. The room deposit included in your trip deposit will be credited to your hotel account. Each party will need to present a credit card at check-in, which will be used to pay for the remaining balance on your account upon check-out.

All participants on this trip will need a VALID PASSPORT to cross the border. THE PASSPORT MUST HAVE AN EXPIRATION DATE AFTER SEPTEMBER 29, 2022. Under current guidelines, anybody crossing the border into Canada MUST BE FULLY VACCINATED, SHOW THEIR VACCINATION CARD, and PROVIDE PROOF OF A NEGATIVE COVID-19 TEST within 72 hours of entry. We will continue to monitor these rules and provide updates.

We MUST HAVE at least 30 people register for the trip by JANUARY 20, 2022, to cover the deposit for Wolfs Bus Lines, which will hold our bus and our hotel rooms in Alexandria Bay. We MUST HAVE at least 40 people register by FEBRUARY 28, 2022, to confirm the trip. If we do not have 40 registered by that date, those who have registered will decide if they are willing to pay an additional fee for the trip.

If we can get 40 people to sign up for the trip by JANUARY 7, 2022, those who are registering for the LCI Convention will get a \$50 discount in their registration fee. If we have 50 or more people sign up by February 28, 2022, everyone will receive a \$50 discount on the price of the trip.

Nobody will be registered for the LCI Convention until we have at least 40 people signed up for the trip or until a group of less than 40 decides to move forward with the trip for an additional fee.

Trip insurance is available through Wolf's Bus Lines. Insurance must be purchased within 14 days of registering for the trip in order to cover cancellation due to a pre-existing health condition. This insurance will cover cancellation due to COVID-19. Participants are advised to include the cost of their hotel room in Montreal in the amount of insurance coverage they purchase. This trip is open to Lions from other districts. We will be traveling along Interstate 81 from Harrisburg, PA, to Collins Landing, NY. If interested, we invite Lions who live close to Interstate 81 to contact us about the possibility of joining us on our trip to Montreal.

The following actions were taken by the 2021-2022 Council of Governors during its second meeting October 30, 2021 at the Valley Forge Casino Resort in King of Prussia, PA.

- Approved official minutes of the first 2021-2022 State Council meeting;
- Approved creation of a State
 Office Advisory Committee policy;
- Approved adding "If the State
 Convention cannot be held due to
 governmental restrictions or other
 external events beyond the control
 of the Multiple District, alternative
 procedures for elections/voting may
 be authorized by the Council of Governors" to Policy 406, The State Convention Rules and Procedures;
- Approved the revision and updating of state policies regarding the State Council Administrator and Assistant State Administrator;



- Approved changing the title of Policy 107 to "State Office Administrative Assistant:"
- Approved the 2020-2021 audit report;
- Approved the revision of Policy 204, Rules of Audit, to increase permitted travel expenses from \$0.41/ mile to \$0.50/mile, increase the per diem expense rate from \$16.00/day to \$24.00/day and increase the lodging expense from \$50.00/day to \$75.00/ day effective July 1, 2022 and to

annually review these rates to assure they match those paid by Lions Clubs International;

- Approved appointment of IPDG Tom Jones (14-C) to the Beacon Lodge board of directors;
- Approved the Beacon Lodge officers for the fiscal year October 1, 2021 through September 30, 2022;
- Gave preliminary approval to the MD-14 Forum Committee and State Office to submit a bid to host the 2026 USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Erie;
- Requested a written report reviewing the MD-14 Investment account:
- Directed the Finance Committee to review the current bank accounts to see if they can be combined and streamlined and also to see if we can get a better return on our money.



PTCP — LIONS PIN TRADING CLUB OF PENNSYVANIA

We are a group of Lions who have fun collecting pins and providing service.





Brief history of PTCP. On July 10, 1983, five interested Lions (Jerry DeTurk, Reg Gemmill, Tim McCaulley, Amos Shatzer and Larry Shaull) met to discuss the possibility of forming an organized group to promote further pin trading interest in Pennsylvania.

With the assistance of Bill Smith, president of the Virginia Pin Traders and First Vice President of the Lions International Pin Trading Club, a provisional constitution and by laws were formulated. On July 12, 1983 letters were sent to Lions announcing the formation of the 'P.T.C. P. By the end of September 1983 Lions sent applications for membership.

The first pin, which was issued in 1984, was the "Three Roses" (see above) which honored the cities of York, Hanover and Lancaster. The first prestige pin was "The Bear" (see above) in 1989. In 1992, the two-day pin swap was instituted and the first "auction" was held.

We are in the last five months of our capital campaign with a goal of raising 300 million dollars in order to fund grants in all of our global causes. At last check, we still need to raise 50 million dollars, or 10 million dollars a month to reach that goal.

Our District 14p has benefited with a \$10,000 disaster relief grant to help with flooding by hurricane Ida.

As our District 14p LCIF Coordinator, I received an email outlining the following strategy to finish strong in this capital campaign:

The LCIF International Committee met in December to discuss strategy for the remainder of the campaign. Leadership has determined the following goals for Area B (Pennsylvania, Ohio, West Virginia, and Virginia) for the remainder of the year.

- Secure 13 additional Model Clubs. In order to do this, I suggest that you reach out to clubs that have already been giving and may be close to achieving Model Club status but have not quite reached that level. If each District can secure one Model Club, we will exceed this goal.
- Host two LCE Events. We currently have six in planning and hope that all will come together. ID Edwards plans to host one in Pennsylvania, likely in March.
- Solicit Major or Lead Gifts. This too could result from having a successful LCE event. Also, if you know of strong supporters who could increase their gift to this level, that would be all it will take.
- Increase Individual Participation by one percentage point. This must continue to be part of the ask at all LCIF/ Campaign presentations and events. Every little bit helps and we recognize both small and larger gifts from individual Lions who support the campaign.
- Increase Club Participation by one percentage point. As with individual giving, this must continue to be part of the ask at all LCIF/Campaign presentations and events. Every little bit helps and we appreciate both small and larger gifts from Lions Clubs who support the campaign.

Please help us in any way you can with the above strategy to meet our goal, especially through the last two bullet points of increasing both club and individual Lion members donations by 1%.

If you know of anyone who could donate at a higher level, please let me know.

Remember, if your club would commit by June 30th this year to become a model club (donation amounting to an average of \$500 per member throughout the campaign), you would have an additional three years until June 30, 2025 to pay the balance. We have a couple of smaller membership clubs that are close to model club status. I could let you know how much your club would need to contribute.

Details of the event being planned by ID Larry Edwards will come later.

Thank you for your help to date, and please help us finish strong by June 30th.
