Please forward your list of Delegates and Alternates for the upcoming District 14-P convention to be held on Saturday, April 15, 2023. The convention location will be at Hilton Garden Inn Exton/West Chester, 720 Eagleview Blvd E, Exton, PA 19341.

As per the Constitution, each chartered Lions club in good standing with the District shall be entitled to one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for every ten (10) member or major fraction thereof (major fraction is 5 or more). Should your club have a PDG as a member, they will receive their PDG Delegate Card directly from the Certification Committee. Please note all delegates and alternates must be a member of Lions for one year and a day in order to quality.

Example: Your club has 20 members; you are entitled to two (2) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 44 members; you are entitled to four (4) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 37 members and a PDG; you are entitled to four (4) Club Delegates/Alternates and one (1) PDG Delegate.

The list of delegates and alternates along with their membership number needs to be emailed (or typed copy via USPS) no later than March 31, 2023, so the committee can process the credential in time for the convention. Credential will be available for pick up the day of the convention at certification table. Thank you for assistance and cooperation.

Thank you, again, to Lion Toby for taking the lead in setting up this event. Also, thank you to all the Lions who help make this event a huge success.

On a final note, we are still looking for someone to take over the Eyeglass Recycling Program for our District. Please consider donating your time and energy to this wonderful and rewarding program.

Half of our Lions year 2022 to 2023 is complete and here are our results so far. As of January 23rd, fifteen of our District 14p Lions Clubs have donated a total of \$11,975 to LCIF. Our goal for this year is a little over \$24,000. So, a little less than half of our district Lions Clubs have donated close to half of our yearly goal.

The LCIF website listed grants that were awarded in the July to August period of this Lions year. There were 64 grants awarded worldwide for a total of \$3,932,485. Here is a list of grants awarded in the United States during this time period:

I do not have any further information on the above list of projects, but you can see that it is a variety of projects accomplished by both Lions Clubs and a Leo Club with the assistance of our foundation.

Finally, February 15th is International Childhood Cancer Day and February is Childhood Cancer month. Our statewide Lions Clubs have been supporting the Four Diamonds Fund and Hershey Medical Center to help with costs for families with childhood cancer patients. LCIF awards many grants to support our Lions Clubs with projects in this area.




TOGETHER WE CAN STEM LEOS
