Oakmont Lion Helps Patients in Africa Improve Their Vision with Donated Used Eyeglasses

Over 10,000 patients have been served in Zimbabwe, Malawi, Honduras and Mexico by Oakmont PA Lion and resident Don Ziegler over the last 3 years. He was trained by Mission Vision, an organization in Cranberry PA, to conduct Eyeglasses Clinics. Mission Vision also cleans, measures, labels and sorts the used donated eyeglasses provided free to patients.

Approximately 95% of the patients served in the rural villages in Africa have never had anyone help them with their vision, therefore they are so very grateful to finally receive a pair of eyeglasses that improves their vision. Patients ages have ranged from 2-1/2 to 110 years old (yes 110).

Don just returned from his most recent mission trip to the remote village of Mashambanhaka in Zimbabwe, Africa on July 19. There he and his team of local volunteers served 2,070 patients.... the largest number of patients served on a single trip.

A background in Process Improvement has enabled him to develop an efficient process to better serve the patients in a high quality and timely manner. The focus is on doing what is best for the patient! He has developed a 10-step process to provide the highest level of patient care, and the most accurate and beneficial pair of eyeglasses for the patient. The process is continuously improved and fine-tuned to provide the best possible outcome for the patient.

Local partners, in addition to the Oakmont Chapter of the Lions Club, include Mission Vision, The Nyadire Connection (TNC), Southminster Presbyterian Church, and the Brothers Brother Foundation.

Used eyeglasses (prescription, readers, sunglasses) can be donated in boxes placed by the Lions Club and Mission Vision at numerous locations. Your used eyeglasses could provide improved vision to one of our brothers and sisters in need!

MyLion Reporting

There have been some glitches on the MyLion Reporting System. The major glitch occurred at the end of July when the system was overwhelmed with the number of clubs trying to report their service activities. We have been assured that it will not be repeated at the end of August. There are still other issues that are being reported and corrected. If you are having a specific issue related to reporting send your contact information and include your member number to <u>mylionsupport@lionsclubs.org</u> and be specific as to what your problem is. They will reply to let you know they have received your ticket. Afterwards be patient and they will eventually let you know when the problem is resolved. Also, for hints and tips become a member of the MyLion Forum Face Book group.

Meetings can now be reported. Previously you could only create a meeting but as of a couple of weeks ago they enabled the reporting of meetings and training sessions. An issue about reporting of fundraising money arose. Clubs tried to report where they sent the funds as part of the report for the fundraiser. Fundraising and distribution of funds are *two* separate items. The distribution of funds is the service activity and a fundraiser is how those funds were obtained by the club. Report the fundraiser under the Fundraiser tab and include the total amount of funds raised minus the expenses. When the funds from the fundraiser are distributed. Create a service activity for each check written. A Lion from India said in the Face Book Forum that his club holds 1 annual fundraiser and then distributes the funds to 19 different service projects. He was surprised that he would need to create an activity for each one.

Keep up the good work. Remember, *"Where there is a need, There is a Lion"* to answer that need
