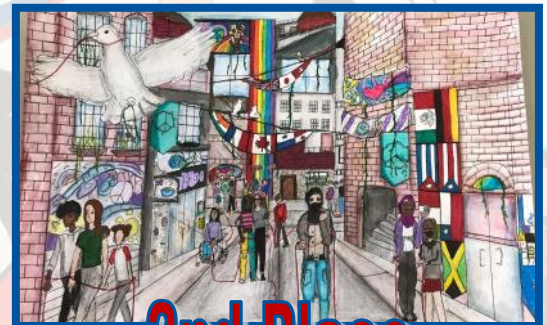

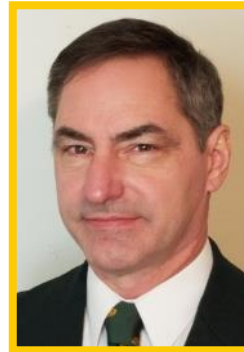

MONTREAL, CANADA
June 22, 2022 through June 29, 2022
BUS TRIP INFORMATION**



Based on your responses to our survey earlier this year, District 14-C is offering a bus trip to Montreal, Canada, for the 2022 Lions Clubs International Convention. The trip will begin on Wednesday, June 22, 2022 and end on Wednesday, June 29, 2022. Here is our itinerary:

Wednesday, June 22

- Depart Wednesday, June 22nd - multiple pick-up locations
- Drive to Alexandria Bay, NY, with several stops along the way to stretch, eat, and use the restroom (lunch is not included in the package)
- Check into our Alexandria Bay hotel (Riveredge Resort)
- Dinner together at a local restaurant

Thursday, June 23

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Shuttle boat to Heart Island and tour Bolt Castle
- Return to Alexandria Bay, board bus, and drive to Montreal Thursday afternoon
- Check into our Montreal hotel (Hotel Delta by Marriott) and pick up convention materials Thursday afternoon/evening

Friday, June 24, through Tuesday, June 28

- Enjoy all of the activities the LCI Convention has to offer
- Guided bus tour of Montreal (date and time to be determined depending on the convention schedule)

Wednesday, June 29

- Board our bus and drive home, making restroom, stretch, and lunch stops along the way (lunch is not included in the package)

The cost of the trip, PER PERSON, varies depending on the number of people sharing a hotel room:

- 1 person - \$1,190
- 2 people - \$993 per person
- 3 people - \$941 per person
- 4 people - \$882 per person

THESE PRICES INCLUDE all transportation costs to and from Montreal, lodging in Alexandria Bay, dinner and breakfast in Alexandria Bay, shuttle boat to Heart Island, tour of Bolt Castle, room deposit for your Montreal hotel room, LCI Convention registration, guided bus tour of Montreal, driver's lodging in Montreal, parking fees for the bus, and driver gratuities. THESE PRICES DO NOT INCLUDE lodging in Montreal (other than your room deposit) or any meals other than dinner and breakfast in Alexandria Bay. You may subtract \$225 from the prices listed above for individuals who will not register for the LCI Convention. PLEASE NOTE - At least one registered convention attendee must occupy each room we reserve in our Montreal Hotel.

Townsend, who was serving as Lions Clubs International's First Vice President at the time of his passing in December 2019.

Lion Donna is a retired music educator, having taught 30 years in the Dalton Public School System. She has also served as the Music Assistant, Children's Choir Coordinator and Youth Choir Accompanist at Dalton First United Methodist Church and recently retired as the Receptionist/Billing Assistant at RossWoods Adult Day Services.

In addition to serving alongside her late husband during his Lions career that included a two-year term as International Director,

Help is needed for those that are homeless and have lost everything due to the tornado destruction in 5 states

On December 10, 2021 a violent, long-tracked tornado moved across Western Kentucky, producing severe to catastrophic damage in numerous towns, including Mayfield, Benton, Dawson Springs, and Bremen in what may be one of the most devastating tornadoes we've ever seen -- just two weeks before Christmas. Already, 79 are confirmed dead, including 70 in Kentucky as this tornado strike cut a 250-mile path of devastation across south central U.S.

The PA Lions Disaster Relief Team has been in contact with Lion DG Gary Logan from Hopkinsville, KY who is the District Governor in district 43-K to see if there is anything we PA Lions could help with. As of this time there are items that they are in dire need of and we are putting out a plea to all 17 districts for help in getting the items listed below to be shipped to KY. Drop off points for the supplies is yet to be determined.

Kerosene heaters
Gas cans ---Red and Yellow
Generators and carbon dioxide filters
Electric cords -50 and 100 ft. lengths
Shovels
Rakes
Heavy brooms
Large tarps with tie downs
Chain saws
Cloths for female and male children and adults
Food
Buckets
Heavy duty construction trash bags
Flash lights and batteries
Work gloves

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year.

We are entering the last six months of our LCIF capital campaign, trying to raise \$300,000,000 in order that our current Lions and also future generations of Lions can continue to help meet the needs of our world through grants in our expanded global causes of vision, diabetes awareness, environment, hunger relief, and childhood cancer.

IPIP Jung-Yul Choi, now chairperson for LCIF, sent a YouTube video asking for our support in whatever amount during these final months of the campaign. He reminded us that 100% of our donations go to the programs and grants. He also posted a video showing the destruction from the tornados in Kentucky and asking for support for disaster relief through LCIF. You can find that video by going to YouTube and searching for *NPR Kentucky”.

Our current President, Douglas Alexander, and Constitutional Area 1 (United states and Caribbean Islands) campaign co-chairman, PIP Joe Preston also sent year end requests for our support in the coming six months.

From these communications it appears that we have raised \$239,874,208 so far. We have a way to go in the last six months. PIP Joe Preston reported that CA1 has donated 37.6 million dollars throughout the campaign. The campaign 100 dashboard shows that our District 14p has donated \$113,250.56 throughout the campaign. This is about 55% of our total goal which was over \$200,000. We most likely will not make our goal, but I would like to see us get as close as possible.

Suggestions from our campaign leaders include the following:

Have a Facebook fundraiser, in-person, or other virtual fundraisers for LCIF.

Consider becoming a model club which supports LCIF with a total donation averaging \$500 per member. Clubs that commit to becoming a model club by June of 2022 have an additional three years until June of 2025 to pay it off.

Consider giving a personal donation to LCIF. So far this year our Lions Club members of District 14p have individually donated \$2080 to LCIF.

One thing that you may not know is that non-Lions can receive a Melvin Jones Fellowship. If you have a supporter of your club that you want to recognize, you can donate the \$1000 to LCIF and present a Melvin Jones Fellowship recognition. This is for individuals, not corporations or businesses.

Thank you for your support these past three years and let's finish strong.
