

LCIF and Four Diamonds Foundation

This spring I took over as our District 14P coordinator for the Lions Club International Foundation from our 2019-2020 District Governor Marilyn Wagner. I want to update you on the year end District 14P totals for LCIF and also for our donations to the Four Diamonds Foundation which was my District Governor project.

In a Facebook post from LCIF, it was reported that more than 1 billion dollars in grants have been awarded by LCIF since their start in 1968. This year there were grants of \$6,363,815 awarded in Constitutional Area 1 which is the United States and Caribbean Islands.

At the 101st International Convention in Las Vegas last year, LCIF launched "Campaign 100" in which we are working to raise 300 million dollars in order to

serve 200 million people per year in coming years. During this first year of the three year campaign we have raised over 105 million dollars for the "empowering service" fund of Campaign 100. Worldwide, 52% of Lions Clubs have contributed to Campaign 100. However, they include a statement that "individual participation remains an area of high potential". I heard a statistic that only 6% of individual Lions Club members contribute to LCIF. In order to encourage individual contributions LCIF has started a 100/100 club in which each individual member of a Lions Club is encouraged to contribute \$100 per year, or a little over \$8 per month. There is recognition for Lion Clubs which reach 100% participation.

In Constitutional Area 1, as of May 15th, there was \$11,773,525 received and outstanding pledges of 1,019,537 for a total of \$12,793,062.

Here in our District 14P, 51 donors including 28 of our 40 Lions Clubs have donated to LCIF. This is a participation rate of 70% and is down slightly from the 70.5% or 31 Lions Clubs who donated during the 2017-2018 year. The amount of money donated is significantly lower, \$22,143 as of June 21st, down from \$43,598 last Lions year. However most districts have a similar situation and I realize that the 2017-2018 year saw several hurricanes. A significant amount of money was donated to the disaster relief fund.

Thank you for your donations to LCIF this year. I will be looking to visit your Lions Club this coming year to make a presentation on our Lions Clubs International Foundation and to encourage your support.

I also want to thank you for your contributions to my District Governor project in support of the Four Diamonds Foundation and our State Council of Governors effort to raise \$100,000 for the Four Diamonds Foundation and childhood cancer research. On December 17th, our treasurer PDG Richard Taylor sent a check for \$1755 from our district charities account. On June 26th he sent another check for \$10,960.50 from club donations. In addition to these donations, two Lions Clubs wrote checks directly to the Four Diamonds Foundation for a total of \$1000. This gives a grand total of \$13,715.50 and more money is coming in. Although it will not be the District Governor project, our State Council of Governors plans to continue raising funds for the Four Diamonds Foundation in the coming years. In the future, checks can be made directly to the Four Diamonds Foundation and sent to our treasurer, PDG Richard Taylor to record on his list and forward.

Global Action Team,



As we near the end of this year, I wanted to take this opportunity to personally thank you for your tireless efforts in making this a successful year for the Global Action Team. Because of your leadership, we are gaining members, training more leaders and providing impactful service in local communities around the world.

Awareness of our potential is currently growing among Lions everywhere. And we are reaching districts with the tools and the resources that empower and activate our clubs. Action is the name of the game, and now is the time to build on our first two years of action.

After accepting the role of GAT chairperson, I initiated a thorough review of the GAT in its current framework, and I have proposed several recommendations to the international board of directors. I believe that these recommendations will better position the GAT to support the goals of our districts. And if districts are successful in reaching their goals, this will have a positive effect on our clubs as well. These recommendations were taken up at the most recent meeting of the board in April, and I am happy to report that the 2019-2020 GAT operational plan and recommended changes were approved and will be effective July 1, 2019.

With that being said, this plan has a few significant changes for next fiscal year that I would like to go over with you now.

- 1. It was approved to discontinue the current three-year term and positions for vice chairpersons, CA leaders, vice CA leaders, and area leaders. I appreciate the current leaders in these positions and hope their support will continue.
- 2. Additionally, the board approved the creation of the following new positions: GAT constitutional area leader, GAT regional area leader (OSEAL), and GAT area leaders, all of which will be annual appointments. To emphasize the one-team approach, GST, GMT and GLT positions will no longer exist at the CA and area level. Instead, there will be one GAT leader in this role.

In consultation with the executive officers, GAT constitutional and regional area leaders were identified, and appointments were made in April. These Lion leaders have demonstrated the ability to empower Lions to achieve personal and collective goals. Below are the leaders who have accepted these roles for the 2019-2020 year:


