## **Important Updates from District and State:**

### **District News:**

If you have membership changes/drops or transfers to report, make sure they are recorded in MyLCI on or before June 30 – LCI bill dues based on your LCI numbers at that date – no refunds will be issued for anyone listed but no longer on your roster.

The Elverson Morgantown Lions Club is returning its Charter and will close at the end of June, with the loss (at this point) of 21 Lions members.

There will need to be a new Guiding Lion appointed to assist Alvernia Lions Campus Club rebuild following recent graduations and students not being on Campus.

We held a successful Guiding Lion Workshop in March and all attendees are now either newly or re-certified Guiding Lions to help our District move forward.

Training for 2020 – 2021 Club Presidents, Secretaries, Club Administrators and Treasurers – usually held at District Convention is being planning.

Zone Chair Training is also in planning and LCI released an updated program just this past week updated to support the District Global Action Team and the introduction of the North American Membership Initiative.

Last and most urgent - we need to find a candidate to serve as our Second Vice District Governor for the year 2020 – 2021.

### **State News:**

The Council agreed to extend the August Council Meeting to include a Friday Night Banquet incorporating Honors Banquet Ceremonies and the Memorial Service, both usually held at the May Convention.

It was agreed to hold a Special Convention at the second Council Meeting in November 2020 in order to hold a vote on the two Ballot Questions passed at the February 2020 Council meeting. The main reason they are not just being held over to the 2021 State Convention is that one of them is related to the redistribution of our State Dues and necessary so that the 2021 – 2022 Budget can be calculated.

Beacon Lodge informed the Council that they will be moving their Governor Appreciation Day to Sunday August 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2020, though also sadly confirmed that the camp will be closed to guests for the summer of 2020.

All appointments scheduled for the 2020 – 2021 State Committee Chairs were made and approved with the exception of a Statewide Diabetes Coordinator – so if anyone is interested in serving our State in that capacity please let me know – I can provide the relevant Policy detailing the requirements.

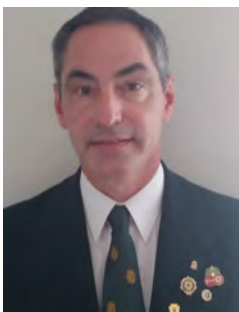

## Lions Clubs International Foundation

I hope you are all well.

I received the following LCIF Campaign 100 updates from PIP Joe Preston, who is our Campaign 100 chairman for Constitutional Area 1 (including the United States).

**Most importantly, because of the pandemic, the Board of Directors is extending our Campaign 100 for another year, until June 30, 2022. This will give us more time to raise the \$300M goal to be able to fund grants for our new global causes over and above vision. We are currently at \$152.7M**

**raised globally.**

PIP Preston reports that in the last 2 months, LCIF has approved 69 grants for \$3,550,050 for the full realm of service projects, including our first grants for hunger and childhood cancer. This is in addition to the 218 COVID-19 emergency grants for \$3.5M. Therefore, our foundation has approved over \$7M for grants in the last two months.

Our investments have taken a huge hit, but have outperformed the market by 2%, so we are well invested even for volatile markets.

**We still have just over \$31M left in the Sightfirst Fund. LCIF is spending about \$10M per year for sight grants, so there is about three years of funds left. PIP Joe Preston commented that it is amazing how much mileage we have received from the Sightfirst II Campaign which was about 15 years ago. Again, wise investing helped stretch out grant making ability at least 5 years longer than was projected.**

I report this to say that our Lions Clubs International Foundation is very worthy of our financial support. I have not yet received a report for May, but by the end of April, twenty-two of our forty clubs and their individual members had donated \$15,059.16 to LCIF. This is \$865.46 behind where we were at the end of April 2019. During the 2018-2019 year twenty-eight of our District 14P Lions Clubs donated a total of \$22,197.65, and during the 2017 -2018 year we donated \$43,598.50.

If feasible, I encourage the Lions Clubs and members who have not yet donated this Lions year to do so by the end of June. Donations can be made online at [lionsclubs.org/donate](https://lionsclubs.org/donate).

In any case, thank you for your donations to LCIF this year and for your continued service as Lions during these rough times.

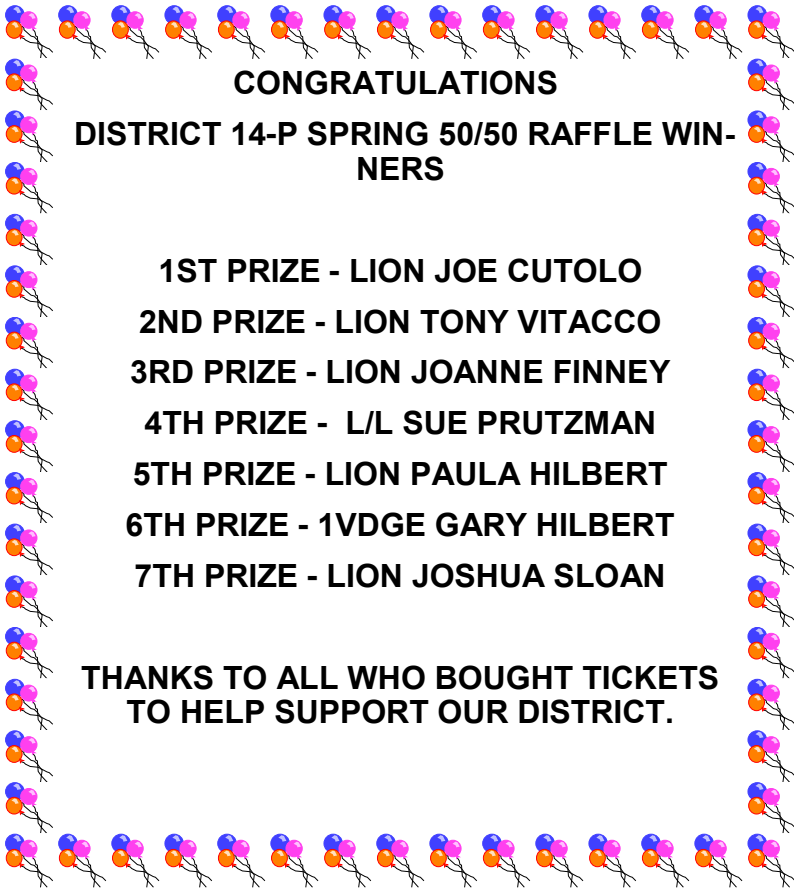

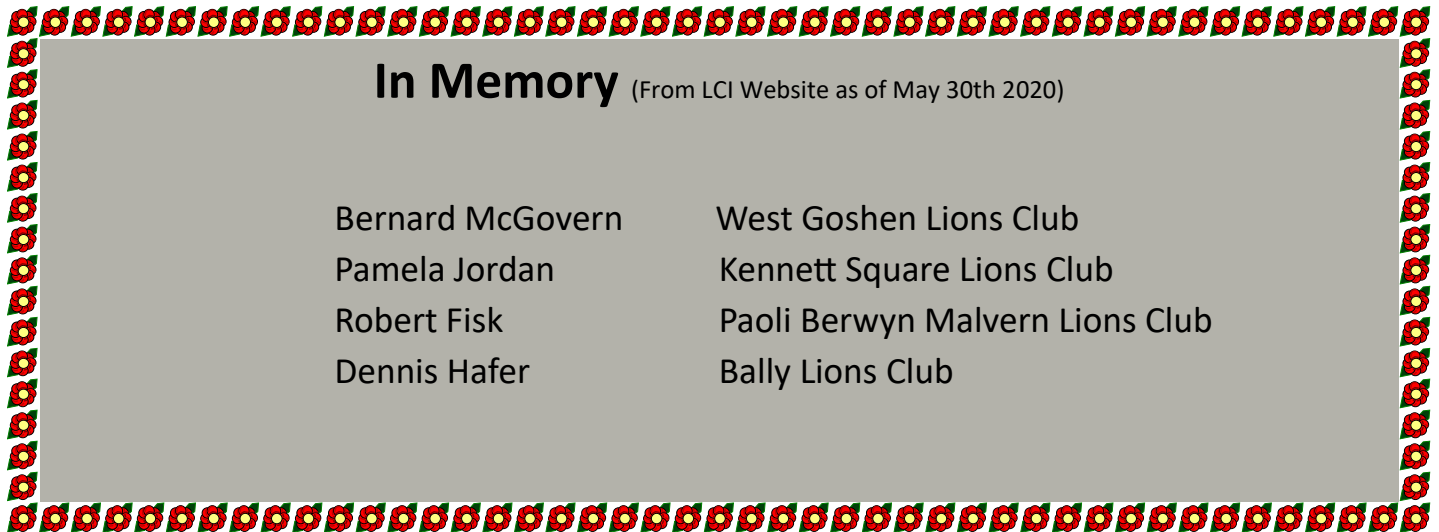
