# From the Desk of the Governor



**This will be my last *Lion Eyes* article as your District Governor. It has been a pleasure working with our District 14P Lions Clubs this past year.**

I want to thank everyone for your support during this year. I will especially mention our District 14P executive officers including VDG Marilyn Wagner, Treasurer PDG Richard Taylor, and Secretary Gwen Burgis. Thanks also to our District 14P Global Action Team members including PDG Carl Gundrum Jr. as GLT, IPDG Steve Wagner as GMT, and Lion Madison Kaley as GST. Thanks to all who served as zone chairpersons during this Lions year and also to all Lions who served in any position on the District Governor's Cabinet. Finally, thanks to all of our Lions Clubs officers who faithfully worked with us this past year to serve our communities and to move our Lions Clubs District 14P forward.

We had a number of vacancies on the District Cabinet this year and that made it hard to realize some of the goals that I set for my year as District Governor. I encourage all of our Lions to think about your passions and to consider how you could help Lions on the district level. I encourage all Lions to support DGE Marilyn Wagner and our District 14P officers for the coming 2019-2020 Lions year.

**DGE Marilyn has asked me to take over the role of district coordinator for our Lions Clubs International Foundation in the coming year. You probably know that LCIF has started a three year capital campaign called "campaign 100". The goal is to raise 300 million dollars for LCIF in three years so that we have the funds to serve 200 million people worldwide by the 2020 to 2021 Lions year. We are already 1/3 through this campaign.**

I need to report to you that we are significantly behind in giving to LCIF compared to last year. During the 2017 to 2018 Lions year 31 of our 40 District 14P Lions Clubs donated to LCIF. This is 77.5% of our district clubs and we donated \$43,398.50 to LCIF. So far this year, 27 out of our 40 clubs have donated to LCIF, which is 67.5%, but we have donated only \$19,006.50 to date. As of the April 15<sup>th</sup> report, we had donated only \$15,924.06 compared to \$37,070.50 donated through April 15, 2018. Please consider donating to LCIF and Campaign 100 during this last month of our 2018-2019 year so that we can bring these figures closer to what we have done in the past.

We are planning a year end Spring Rally for Sunday June 16<sup>th</sup> at Trinity E.C. Church in Boyertown where we had the District Convention. So far registrations are extremely sparse. I have June 5<sup>th</sup> as the deadline on the registration form, but we need to know if it is possible to hold this event. Please let Treasurer PDG Richard Taylor know if you are planning on attending.

Congratulations to PDG Richard Taylor who received the International President's Award from our President Gudrun Yngvadottir at the State Convention in May. Congratulations also to PDG Ken Snyder and Lion Patrice Crammer who both received the International Leadership Award from President Yngvadottir. Blandon Lioness President Donna Burns was named Lioness of the Year in District 14P.

The proposed constitutional amendment which would have changed the way our PA Council Chairperson is selected in the future was defeated by a wide margin during the State Convention.

Finally, as I write this, our statewide disaster relief coordinator and our Lions are working together with Lowes Hardware to restore the homes destroyed by the tornado in Morgantown just last night.

**Be proud of our Lions Clubs and District 14P. Let's finish this year strong by bringing in new members, supporting LCIF, and serving our community.**

**Thank you for all you have done in the past year and for what you will continue to do in the future.**

### Georgie and Georgette



**Most of us have known a child with cancer, here are a couple of brave children that have been in my life, Georgie and Georgette.**

Georgie was my little neighbor in Glenmoore. The first indication that he had any physical problems occurred when he fainted during a local baseball practice. He was nine years old. After all the tests and studies were done, they found that Georgie had an inoperable brain tumor. Brain tumors are so bad – the brain has a huge vascular system and the brain is the master of other systems in your body. Tumors are relentless in their ability to spread rapidly. Within one year, we lost Georgie...He was so brave and I, for one, never forgot him.

The second child with cancer that I had contact with years ago, was my fourteen year old cousin Georgette. Her first complaint: she was grocery shopping with her mother and when they walked by the cold meat section, Georgette complained of a “cold feeling” in one of her legs. After many studies, it was determined that she had bone cancer and would have to have the leg amputated. And she did, in a N.Y.C. medical center. After much therapy, Gigi went back to school, college, marriage, children and now has grandchildren. She is a tiny woman, about 5’2”, but she goes everywhere and does everything, like moose hunting, fishing and she even hiked up Macho Pichu in South America! She is now over seventy years old, the cancer never returned.

**You never forget children that you meet that have dealt with cancer – or their strong supporting families. Please look in your communities and see if there is anything that 14-P Lions can do for children with cancer in your hometown. Sometimes it might be what you would consider insignificant, but to these families it might give them extra strength. Lions serve...and they care.**


