Please forward your list of Delegates and Alternates for the upcoming District 14-P convention to be held at Trinity Church, 250 Sweinhart Road, Boyertown, PA 19512 on Saturday, April 25, 2020.

As per the Constitution, each chartered Lions club in good standing with the District shall be entitled to one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for every ten (10) member or major fraction thereof (major fraction is 5 or more). Should your club have a PDG as a member, they will receive their PDG Delegate Card directly from the Certification Committee. *Please note all delegates and alternates must be a member of Lions for one year and a day in order to quality.*

Example: Your club has 20 members; you are entitled to two (2) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 44 members; you are entitled to four (4) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 37 members and a PDG; you are entitled to four (4) Club Delegates/Alternates and one (1) PDG Delegate.

The list of delegates and alternates need to be emailed (or typed copy via USPS) no later than March 31, 2020 so the committee can process the credential in time for the convention. Credential will be available for pick up the day of the convention at certification table. Thank you for assistance and cooperation.

As of today, I have visited 38 of our current 40 Lions Clubs: all 3 of our Lioness Clubs and three of our Leo Clubs.

I am in awe of the service all of you are continuing to provide in your communities as well as happy to hear of how many New Projects are being tried for the first time by our District Clubs – there seems to be more visitations being made as well as more partnerships in the making. Our group of young Leos also continue to amaze me by the service they provide independently of their sponsoring Lions Club – these young Leo/Lions truly are our future.

We still struggle with Service Reporting but the number of participating Clubs is on the increase and I remain hopeful of

achieving the Goal of 85% of our Clubs reporting at least one Service project this year – I know that First Vice District Governor Art has offered his services to Clubs for one on one training and I have also met with a couple of Club Secretaries recently to do the same. I am also heartened to see some of our Clubs appointing a Club Administrator to assist the Secretary with using the new technology and I continue to promote the idea, especially if a Club Secretary is not interested in "that side of things".

The Certified Guiding Lion Workshop, originally scheduled for November 2019 is now being held on **Saturday, March 7**th **2020** at the **Good Life Financial Building on Lancaster Pike in Shillington** – currently I have 4 Lions who are re-Certifying and 3 Lions who will be Certifying for the first time.......if we are to grow as a District we still need Guiding Lions who are willing to accept and have the potential to be assigned for a two year term to assist clubs that are either newly chartered, established or determined as priority designation.

I am delighted to announce District 14-P Leo of the Year Leo Margaret Degler, President of the Avon Grove Charter School Leo Club, has been further honored as the 2019 – 2020 Multiple District 14 Leo of the Year. She will be presented with her District Award at our Convention in April and I am still waiting for details of where and when she will receive her Multiple District Award.

Minutes of the District 14P Convention

April 13, 2019

The convention meeting was called to order by Convention Chairperson 1st VDG Marilyn Wagner at 8:48 AM at Trinity Church of Boyertown.

PDG Carl Gundrum, Jr. set the protocol for the day.

1st VDG Marilyn introduced the current cabinet members.

The meeting recessed until 2:15 PM.

1st VDG Marilyn Wagner called the Caucus meeting back to order at 2:00 PM.

PDG Phil Shober noted that the rules and procedures were printed in our programs and they are being followed.

Minutes:

The 2018 District Convention meeting minutes were emailed/mailed. IPDG Steve Wagner made a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes, with a second by PDG Phil Shober. The motion was carried.

Registrations:

PDG Richard Taylor reported that we 136 registered attendees and there were 127 present.

Preliminary Credentials Report:

L/L Sue Prutzman reported that at this time we have 14 PDGs, 58 Lions Club delegates and seven alternates certified to vote.

Resolutions:

PDG Phil Shober report that here were no resolutions at this time.

Elections:

PDG Car Gundrum, Jr. said that voting would be in room 200 from 3:00 PM to 3:30 PM. He asked that we mark ballots and leave quickly to keep the process moving.

Nomination:

The nominating committee has reviewed the qualifications and received endorsements of the candidates from their home clubs. These candidates are deemed to be qualified for the offices.

The candidate for 2019-2020 District Governor is Lion Marilyn Wagner from the Spring Township Lions Club (currently 1st VDG).

The candidate for 2019-2020 1st Vice District Governor is Lion Art Pecht from the Honey Brook Lions Club.

The candidate for 2019-2020 2nd Vice District Governor is Lion Gary Hilbert from the Boyertown Lions Club.

DG David reconvened the Caucus at 3:30 PM.

Final Credential Report:

L/L Sue Prutzman said that we had 14 PDGs, 58 Lions Club delegates, and seven alternates eligible to vote at the close o certification.

Voting Results:

PDG Carl Gundrum, Jr. reported that 62 votes were cast with results as follows:

Gary Hilbert for 2nd VDG – 61 yes and one no

Art Pecht 1st VDG – 62 yes and zero no

Marilyn Wagner for District Governor – 61 yes and one no

The candidates gave their acceptance remarks.

The benediction was given by District Chaplain, Rev. Lion Doris Haley.

The Convention was closed at 3:49 PM.

Notes from the State Council of Governors Meeting – February 6 thru 8 2020.

The Multiple District of Pennsylvania endorsed PID Douglas Alexander as First Vice President of Lions International and as candidate for 2020 – 2021 International President – this action came about because of the recent tragic loss of First Vice President Judge Haynes Townsend.

The Council and Vice District Governors were given a presentation by the Kalahari Resort and Convention to support our bid for the 2024 USA Canada Forum being held there. Council then approved that our Multiple continue to work with the resort in an effort to present a serious bid for the Forum.

The task force working on a new PA Lions Website presented a final version to Council. It is complete and ready to go live. The switch will be made once the webmaster is familiar with the new controls – but I feel it will be much sooner than the original date of July 1, 2020.

There will be two (2) Ballots questions put before the State Convention Delegates – details of which will be published in the Lion Eyes in the April edition and distributed to our Club Presidents and Secretaries under separate cover.

New forms are available for Past District Governors to register as voting Delegates.

The Council of Governors approved the addition of two new State Coordinators

Childhood Cancer Chair and

KidSight Chair.

The Council of Governors also appointed IPDG Keldeen Stambaugh of District 14-T as the Childhood Cancer Chair.

The KidSight Chair will be advertised across our Multiple.

The Council of Governors approved a motion to increase to the State Allowances for our First and Second Vice District Governors when attending a Council Meeting. Currently the First Vice District Governor is reimbursed \$100 and the Second Vice District \$50 when attending a Council Meeting. With effect from July 1, 2020 they will increase to \$200 for the First Vice District Governor and \$100 for the Second Vice District Governor.



In the first six months the Lion's year we have screened over 3000 children in Berks and Chester County. At this pace we should surpass last year's screening numbers. According to the last census there are over 100,000 children under the age of nine (9) in Berks and Chester County, so we have a lot more work to do.

We received some bad news from **Welsh Allyn** the current manufacture of the Spot Vision Screener. As of the January 26, 2020 of our vision screener's manufactured by **Pedia Vision** (previous manufacturer) are no longer covered by a warranty, because parts are no longer available. This means when one of them breaks down, we must purchase a new spot camera. The current cost for a new camera is \$6950 plus \$1425 for a five-year warranty. So please keep the donations coming in.

The spring and summer's screening season are just around the corner. We have already received several requests for the Screening Trailer. For **Trailer** requests please contact me at peshober@ptd.net.

A **KidSight** board meeting will be held on March 14, 2020 at St. Thomas church Morgantown Pennsylvania at 9:30 AM. This meeting is open to all **Lions** interested in being part of **KidSight Team**.

WHAT IS THE BING MILLER FOUNDATION?

That is the question I asked PDG Rich Stump about 9years ago. When I was elected 2VDG, I was invited to attend the board meetings of the Bing Miller Foundation. I attended my first meeting at Clair's Restaurant in Morgantown, and my first impression was "this is the best kept secret inDistrict 14P."In all my years as a Lion I never had any contact with the Bing Miller Foundation. All through my years as 2VDG, 1VDG, and my year as District Governor, I attended as many meetings as I could. After my year as District Governor, I was invited to become a permanent member of the board. This has been one of the best invitations I have ever received. The individuals that have been helped by the Lions Clubs and the Bing Miller Foundation is what we as Lions are all about.

Some of the grants that I have been personally involved with and as a board member are:

A young man that was riding his bike cross country to raise money for cancer was struck by a drunken driver in the Midwest. Between the Central Berks Lions Club and the Bing Miller Foundation, his family was given \$3000 plus \$1000 in Sheetz gas cards for medical expenses and to go to therapy.

A young woman who lost almost all of her vision in both eyes when she rinsed her contacts withtap water. This caused a parasite contamination inboth eyes. She had to rely on her brother to take her to Hershey 3 times a week for treatment. The Central Berks Lions Club and the Bing Miller Foundation combined to give her \$3000 plus another \$1000 in Sheetz gas cards. She since has had 2 corneal transplants and has better than 80% vision in both eyes. This case is really true to my heart as I was personally involved from the beginning. From meeting her for the first time and seeing her progress that was made easier because of the involvement of the Lions Club andthe Bing Miller Foundation. She is now back to work and back in her own apartment with her 2 boys.

Josh the young man from Reading that captured many hearts at our District Convention. Josh was helped by the Amity Township Lioness and the Bing Miller Foundation. At the convention Josh was put in contact with my project Moment of Peace Adventures. Josh was taken on a fishing trip to Delaware, that never would have occurred if not for the connection of the Lioness Club and the Bing Miller Foundation.

In December I presented a check for \$3000 from the Bing Miller Foundation to the family of a 7 year old boy suffering from cancer. The Central Berks and the Hamburg Lions were also involved in providing assistance to this family. Hopefully this will help this family with expenses as the young boy must be taken to Hershey for treatment.

I could go and on about what the Bing Miller Foundation has done over the years. As we approach the end of this Lions year, I would like each Lions Club to consider a Bing Miller Fellowship to honor a member of your club. A Fellowship is \$300 and the money stays in District 14P. Fellowship information can be found on the District web site.
