Please forward your list of Delegates and Alternates for the upcoming District 14-P convention to be held at Trinity Church, 250 Sweinhart Road, Boyertown, PA 19512 on Saturday, April 10, 2021.

As per the Constitution, each chartered Lions club in good standing with the District shall be entitled to one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for every ten (10) member or major fraction thereof (major fraction is 5 or more). Should your club have a PDG as a member, they will receive their PDG Delegate Card directly from the Certification Committee. *Please note all delegates and alternates must be a member of Lions for one year and a day in order to quality.*

Example: Your club has 20 members; you are entitled to two (2) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 44 members; you are entitled to four (4) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 37 members and a PDG; you are entitled to four (4) Club Delegates/Alternates and one (1) PDG Delegate.

The list of delegates and alternates need to be emailed (or typed copy via USPS) no later than March 31, 2021 so the committee can process the credential in time for the convention. Credential will be available for pick up the day of the convention at certification table. Thank you for assistance and cooperation.

I know some of the Leo Clubs are not meeting so if you are please think about participating in a Leo Presentation.



Where Are They Now?

A Monthly Update of Past District Governors

PDG 2004-2005

I am a senior Lion now, but when I joined, women had just begun to be allowed to join Lions International. The opportunity to join came by when I least expected it. A neighbor was visiting from the church when they were asking for donations, and he asked if I had ever considered becoming a Lion. That was over thirty years ago and what a life changing experience it has been. I was widowed at the time with older children and working full time at the VA in Coatesville after having been transferred from the VA in Lyons NJ. They were preparing to build a new nursing home when the WWII veterans were aging and needing medical assistance. My background is in nursing, administration and gerontology. My original nursing background, Muhlenberg Hospital School of Nursing in Plainfield NJ, then a BSN from Seton Hall University in NJ and an MS from St. Joseph's University in Philadelphia.

The goals of Lionism are those that help the needs of people in the community, as well as around the world. One of the first projects our local Glenmoore Club had was providing an electric wheelchair for a resident, and one of our Lions was able to get a matching grant to help us. As you know, the Glenmoore Lions club merged with the Eagle Lions Club, I was the last president at Glenmoore and PDG Charlie Lobb was the last president of Eagle Lions Club. I gradually moved up in the district to Zone Chairperson, Region Chairperson, VDG and District Governor in 2004.

It was a challenging time to be rising in Lionism – not all clubs liked the idea of women Lions. Also, I was single and driving many places at night that I had never heard of, or seen. And directions... "when you get to the gas station, turn right". I was looking for a Wawa station and it was a tiny Mom & Pop place. Then, going on to being a District Governor as a single person and dealing with all PA district governors. As luck would have it, in 2004 there were five of us single PA DG's at the international convention and we stuck together; I was the lone female but never felt alone, the funny memories I have from that group. (Ask me about the hot tub incident) Back at home and in the district, I devoted time towards diabetes and trying to make others aware of the incidence and preventive measures to be taken. Your genes have a lot to do with the incidence, but if you try to eat healthier you can lessen the progress. I too have diabetes, type II, and three of my sons received that gene – one of them dying from a heart attack, a complication of diabetes.

Here are two interesting facts about me: 1.)My grandfather was a Lion – When I was District Governor, I wrote to his old club and they sent me a copy of their original charter which he had signed. (One of my Lion's treasures). 2.) I am a DUCWV (daughter of a Union Civil War Veteran – actually a great granddaughter). I am now a life member of Lions International as well as the

American Legion Auxiliary. I went back to the VA as a volunteer after working there forty years ago, now they have built a state-of-the art Hospice Unit where I was able to help and visit with a few of the WWII veterans who are still with us. Due to the pandemic, volunteers have been halted for a while, but I still volunteer as a "Compassionate Friend" who is assigned veterans who are homebound just to talk with, brighten their day and note if they need any help from the VA. Without volunteers, like Lions, what would those in need do?

2021 Virtual Camp at PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp

We are happy to announce that Beacon Lodge Camp will be offering Virtual Camp during the 2021 camping season!

We will not let the pandemic stop us from getting together and having fun with our Beacon Lodge family!

Virtual camp will run from July 10 through July 14, for two hours each day, and will replace in-person Camp for the following sessions:

Adults - Transitional Care, Assisted Living, and Hearing Impaired.

Children- Camp ALIVE, Assisted Living, Blind/VI, and ENERGY

The daily schedule will be as follows:

7:45 AM to 9:45 AM - Adult Transitional Care and Assisted Living

10:00 AM to Noon - All Children's sessions

1:00 PM to 3:00 PM - Deaf/Hearing Impaired

For Virtual Camp attendees, the Camp fee will be waived for this year!

What will be required: \$100 Registration Fee, Online Registration Form, Recent photo of camper (so we can recognize their smiling faces), signed Photo/Video Release Form, and a valid email address.

Virtual Camp is online, so an internet-connected device and high-speed internet service (able to stream video) will be needed. Also, if the camper may require assistance, please make sure someone is available to help.

Upon receipt of the above-listed payment and documents, a confirmation email will be sent to the email address provided. Prior to virtual camp, an access link for the first day's session will be emailed to all attendees. Each day a new access link will be emailed for the following day's activities.

We will not require the Medical Form for Virtual Camp, but we do recommend that any camper who has a seizure disorder consult a doctor before enrolling.

What to Expect

Each day of virtual camp will begin with the National Anthem, flag raising, and the Pledge of Allegiance.

Each day will also have a theme – color of the day, word of the day, hat day, pet day, etc...

Each day may include – Singing and dancing, Storytime, Exercise, Campfire Talks, good hygiene practices, round table discussions for thoughts and comments from campers, and more. There will also be cameo appearances from Itowe, the Camp mascot! We will have arts and crafts as well, but don't worry – you don't have to go shopping! Each registered camper will receive a package in the mail with all the needed supplies, mailed to the address on the registration form.

We are excited about Virtual Camp and are looking forward to reconnecting with all of our beloved campers - old friends, and new!




