#### A STATEWIDE PROJECT - THE JARED BOX

Mark your calendars now – May 16-29, 2024, our State Convention. It will be held right here in Harrisburg at the Red Lion Hotel.

Each year a Service Project is included during the Convention. This years' Service Project will be packing Jared Boxes.

You ask: What is a Jared Box? A Jared Box is a plastic shoe-sized storage box filled with small gifts, toys, games, crayons, coloring books, and fun activities. Each box contains items selected for a specific age (from infant through teens) and gender. The boxes are given to children in the hospital to provide a special, fun diversion.

#### About The Jared Box Project

The project was started in 2001 by the children of Our Lady of Victory School in State College, Pennsylvania, to honor their classmate, Jared, who battled cancer with courage and faith. Jared was diagnosed with an incurable brainstem tumor in 1999. He carried a backpack full of toys and games to all appointments and questioned why the other children didn't bring toys to their exam rooms. Jared shared his toys and invited the other children to join him in a game of UNO. At just 5 years old, he demonstrated faith, wisdom, and compassion for others.

After Jared passed away, his classmates decided to honor him by creating Jared Boxes. The school children made 81 Jared Boxes for the children at Geisinger Janet Weis Children's Hospital In Danville, Pennsylvania. Soon after that, other community groups started making Jared Boxes. They picked up where Jared left off and shared toys with the children in the hospital. This wave of kindness quickly took off and spread across the country.

Since 2001, more than 1,000,000 Jared Boxes have been delivered to over 500 hospitals across the United States. Boxes filled with the "gift of play" are given to young patients in emergency rooms, hospital rooms, surgical centers, and clinics. 121 hospitals in Pennsylvania are participating – Jared Boxes made at the Convention will be going to Pennsylvania hospitals. Lions Clubs throughout our Multiple District will be asked to make a donation to provide the items to complete our Jared Boxes.

Lamaze@, Bright Starts@, and Sassy@ brand toys are great. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for infants. Be aware of choking hazards.

#### - Toddler (1 to 3) -

Softcover books, cardboard books, stacking blocks, farm animal sets, small toys that clip on strollers, bath toys, stuffed animals, balls, busy boxes, musical toys, colorful pillowcases, fun socks, chunky crayons, coloring books, flashcards, plastic cars, puppets, soft dolls. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for children under 3. Be aware of choking hazards.

#### Preschool (3 to 5)

Crayons, coloring books, grab-n-go activity kits, reading books, stickers, sticker workbooks, activity books, matchbox cars, NERF or rubber balls, stuffed animals, flashcards, fun socks, small action figures, small dolls, travel size games, Silly Putty, simple puzzles, card games (Go Fish, Old Maid, Memory), colorful pillowcases, dress up items, farm animal sets, dinosaurs. Other toys that are labeled as suggested for Preschoolers.

#### Elementary (5 to 8) -

**Hello Fellow Lions** 

I'd like to bring your attention to several points I'd like to share as District Service Coordinator:

- My main hope is that clubs will maintain a good mix of direct, hands-on service as part of your work. Let's promote membership opportunities to non-Lions during service projects.
- An issue arose regarding club bylaws. I will suggest that all clubs make an effort to add creation
  or update of bylaws to your agenda. Lions Club International website has created a template for
  clubs to use. I know we may not think of bylaws often. But especially if things may go awry, it a
  good tool to have. I saw this play out in my own nonprofit work experience.
- Secondly, the Lions "Standard Structure" chart includes a position of "Service Chairman". If this
  position is vacant in your club, I am recommending the club look to fill this position. There is a
  lot written about what responsibilities the service chair should have. In order that we don't get
  overwhelmed, in my view, the most important help to the club would be: establish service goals,
  incorporate opportunities for local youth and Leos to engage in all aspects of service activities,
  serve as club resource on <u>current community needs</u>, increase member satisfaction by
  <u>encouraging participation and engagement in service projects.</u> I also feel this position would be
  a great help to the Club President.
- A recent Lions International message suggested there is still time to plan something around Earth Day, April 22. Go to the "environment webpage" on LCI for service ideas.

Thanks for your service and I know there will be great spring service projects coming up!

1944 - First long distance haul from

Baltimore to Reading. 1947 - 2nd ambulance, a Buick


Roadmaster, was dedicated on Sunday, Oct 13th.

1951 - Purchase a new ambulance, 1950 Buick

1957 - Purchased a Cadillac ambulance. 1963 - Put 4th new ambulance into service.

1970 - Ambulance #6 arrives, a "69 Caddy, costing \$25,000.

1975 - Approved the purchase of Ambulance #8 at a cost of \$21,270. 1978 - 9th ambulance was ordered for future delivery, a Ford for \$28,900. 1987 - Another new ambulance arrives at a cost of \$42,000.

The Leo club enjoyed spending time with the families and even got to help some of the kids with math strategies!















