Please forward your list of Delegates and Alternates for the upcoming District 14-P convention to be held on Saturday, April 15, 2023. The convention location will be at Hilton Garden Inn Exton/West Chester, 720 Eagleview Blvd E, Exton, PA 19341.

As per the Constitution, each chartered Lions club in good standing with the District shall be entitled to one (1) Delegate and one (1) Alternate for every ten (10) member or major fraction thereof (major fraction is 5 or more). Should your club have a PDG as a member, they will receive their PDG Delegate Card directly from the Certification Committee. ***Please note all delegates and alternates must be a member of Lions for one year and a day in order to qualify.***

Example: Your club has 20 members; you are entitled to two (2) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 44 members; you are entitled to four (4) Delegates/Alternates. Your club has 37 members and a PDG; you are entitled to four (4) Club Delegates/Alternates and one (1) PDG Delegate.

The list of delegates and alternates along with their membership number needs to be emailed (or typed copy via USPS) no later than March 31, 2023, so the committee can process the credential in time for the convention. **Credential will be available for pick up the day of the convention at certification table. Lions Clubs International Foundation

The following was my report at our February 18th meeting of our District 14P Cabinet. I will resubmit it here for all to read.

So far this Lions year, sixteen of our District 14p Lions Clubs have contributed a total of \$17,375 to LCIF. This is about 72% of our \$24,123 goal for the year. With a good year end support from the rest of our district clubs, we can meet our goal.

Our Foundation continues to supply grants to Lions Clubs and districts around the world.

We continue to support refugees fleeing the Ukrainian war.

In January, the e-mail news from LCIF Chairperson Douglas Alexander highlighted grants for hunger relief, saying that about one billion people worldwide experience food insecurity.

A Facebook post on worldwide Childhood Cancer Day, February 15th, highlighted our efforts to reduce childhood cancer and the 90% fatality rate in sub-Saharan Africa. In 2019 we partnered with Global HOPE (Hematology Oncology Pediatric Excellence), a program of Texas Children's Hospital and Baylor College of Medicine to improve the survival rate from childhood cancer.

Finally, immediately following the recent massive earthquake, LCIF awarded a \$200,000 major catastrophe grant to Lions in Turkey.

Thank you for your continued support of LCIF.

This is the time of the year that we ask for your support of the "Beacon Lodge 500 Club". This is an opportunity for each Lion and Leo to contribute to help with repairs and maintenance of the Beacon Lodge Camp.

News & Updates

March 2023

In three months, it will mark 12 years since the start of the 14P KidSight Program. Due to the generosity of the Coventry Lions Club, a \$15,000 dollar donation we were able to purchase two Spot Vision Cameras and printers that first year. In 2018 a donation of \$10,000 dollar by the Central Berks Lions Club enabled KidSight to purchase a trailer complete with the necessary equipment to screen at Lions Club and community functions. Currently there are seven (7) Spot Vision Cameras in use, five (5) by KidSight and one (1) each by The Avon Grove Lions and Lionville Lions.

We started out slow in 2011 only screening approximately 700 children but the numbers improved when we joined forces with the Vision Resource Center of Berks County. By the Lions year of 2019/2020 KidSight Team had screened over 32,000 preschool children in Berks and Chester County, that's an average of over 4000 screenings in the first ten (10) years. And then the COVID pandemic hit us. Fourteen (14) KidSight Trailer reservations were cancelled, and our screening numbers saw a 50% plus drop due to mask mandates and distant restrictions. With six months left in the current year 1730 children have been screened and only four (4) reservations for the KidSight Trailer. **KidSight needs to get back to the pre pandemic numbers, this can only be done with the help from the clubs and lions of our district.** The clubs need to identify and communicate with community functions where the Clubs and KidSight can participate.

The KidSight is currently looking for Lions interested becoming a member our board of trustees due to the loss of five (5) former team members have relocated or had change in their personal situations. We also looking for Lions interested in training and participating and screenings. The KidSight Screening Trailer will be at the District Convention this year, please stop by and talk with us or contact me at peshober@ptd.net or Terry Stouffer at terrystouffer@aol.com.
