From the Desk of the Governor

I want to thank everyone for a very good District 14P Convention this past month. Thanks especially to VDG Marilyn Wagner who chaired the convention committee. Thanks also to all of our Lions who chaired committees such as registration, certification, exhibitors, the basket raffle, elections, etc. We pulled together and conducted a fine convention with a good attendance and an interesting program.

In case you have not yet heard, the following Lions were elected to be our District 14P officers in the 2019 – 2020 year: Lion Marilyn Wagner from the Spring Township Lions Club is now Dis-

trict Governor Elect. Lion Arthur Pecht from the Honey Brook Lions Club is now 1st Vice District Governor Elect. Finally, Lion Gary Hilbert from the Boyertown Lions Club is now 2nd Vice District Governor Elect. This is the first time in several years that we will have a complete list of District 14P officers at the beginning of the year. This is a benefit to our District 14P because each of these officers will be receiving training from the State and International in the coming year. By the time 2nd VDG Elect Gary steps into the District Governor position, he will have had a couple years of training. I hope this trend continues in future years and other Lions will be willing to step up into District officer positions.

The only way we can have a very successful year next year is if Lions in our District clubs step forward to help as committee chairs in the District. If you put Lions 14P into Google, the first thing listed will be our District website. If you go onto the website and then click on the "contact us" tab, you will see a list of our District committees. You will notice that several have been vacant this year. Let us know your passion and we can certainly find a position for you to help serve in the District.

Now that the District Convention is complete, we are planning a Spring Rally for Sunday June 16th at the same church where we had the convention. Unfortunately, this is Father's Day, but it is the only date I had available due to other events that month. Our Acting State Council Chair, DG William Morgan from District N told me that he would attend. We also have a Lion guest coming from Delaware to discuss how Lions can help with drug prevention. We have musical entertainment during lunch and there will be recognition for Lions who helped us have a good Lions year. There should be a reservation form in this issue of Lion Eyes. I hope we have a good attendance at this yearend event.

Thanks to all of you who have donated to my District Governor project. If you wish to donate, you can do so through our District 14P Charities list that our treasurer, PDG Richard Taylor e-mailed to clubs about a week ago. The funds are transferred in December and June to the Four Diamonds Foundation which supports childhood cancer research and also helps families pay medical bills at Hershey Medical Center. Statewide we are trying to raise \$100,000 for Four Diamonds this year. We have only \$35000 so far. The last that I saw, our District was approaching \$5000 in donations.

Thanks also to the Eagle Glenmoore Lions Club which, with the help of the Lions of PA Foundation, donated a Brady Buggy to Saint Christopher Hospital in Philadelphia. This is the second Brady Buggy that Saint Christopher Hospital has and they are very appreciative. Because it has enough room for the IV pole, it gives a chance to get the child away from the cancer unit for a little while.

Finally, I encourage all of our Lions Clubs to finish this year strong. We are currently 33 members down from the beginning of the year, but we had a good April with a gain of 6 members. If all of our clubs add a new member, and we limit drops, we can finish the year with a positive membership number. This would be of great value for our District.

Childhood Cancer

Data

There is enough publicly available disease data at the National Institute of Health to fill up six Libraries of Congress. Unfortunately, much of that information is often written in different ways. It is like different languages, some makes sense to one researcher and often not to another researcher. Translating that data into one consistent form so that all researchers can access and understand it, is one of the jobs of the Childhood Cancer Data Lab. (CCDL)

The first large data lab of its kind dedicated to childhood cancer, ALSF, will soon launch the beta version of "refine.bio". This is a tool which is designed to collect the data into one format in a central location. Then, researchers around the world will be able to efficiently access and analyze this data to identify common patterns. In turn, they hope this collaborative dataset will accelerate the development of new therapies to cure childhood cancers.

Each of you play a pivotal role in leading our organization forward through communication and support. To help you prepare to answer any questions you may receive about the Service Journey, we wanted to offer you the insider's view of this campaign and its related tools and resources.

<u>The Service Journey</u> is an approach to serving well. It can help clubs take on new causes, and serve in new and exciting ways. There are four phases to the Service Journey: Learn, Discover, Act and Celebrate.

The **Learn** phase focuses on the value of increasing our awareness of the world around us—the more we learn, the more we'll be prepared to take action.

The **Discover** phase is where we process the things we're learning and identify new opportunities that align with our passions and strengths.

The Service Toolkit features resources designed to help Lions assess, position and activate their clubs for greater impact. This toolkit is a first step for clubs that may not know where to begin when it comes to expanding their vision of service.

The **Club and Community Needs Assessment** helps clubs apply their unique strengths to the needs of their communities.

The guide to **Developing Local Partnerships** helps clubs connect with like-minded organizations.

The **Fundraising Guide** helps clubs understand and plan online and event fundraisers.

The Why Service Reporting Matters and How to Report Service guides walk clubs through the rationale behind service reporting, and how to do so in MyLion™.

<u>The Service Launchpad</u>, is an interactive tool built for clubs that are interested in taking on a new cause. The launchpad connects clubs with ready-to-go planning resources called <u>Service Project Planners</u>.
