First Vice District Governor Elect Gary Hilbert.

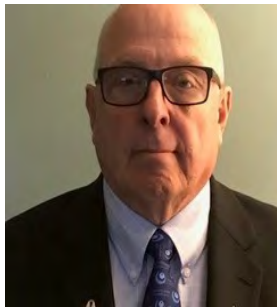

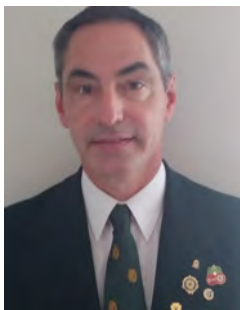

Lions Clubs International Foundation

I hope you are all well.

As of April 27th, our foundation has awarded 137 grants totaling \$2,784,655 for coronavirus relief. These grants are awarded through LCIF's disaster relief fund and are made possible by our support. Grants have been made here in the United States and throughout the world.

I looked on mylci this morning, and our district is credited with donations of \$13,059.16 and pledges of \$2,035.50 so far this year. This is significantly below the \$21,225.53 we donated last year and the \$43,598.50 we donated two years ago. I hope we can pick this up in the last two months of our Lions year.

On a positive note, the reports indicate that \$4,534.16 has come through individual donations. On my club visits, I have been relaying the request of our international leaders for each Lion member to contribute \$100 per year for three years to the LCIF campaign. I thank you for these individual contributions.

I received an e-mail this morning saying that the Illinois governor has extended their stay at home order to the end of May. Therefore, the national offices will remain closed for this period. The staff is working remotely from home, but processing of donations of checks mailed to the office (Lions Clubs International Foundation, Dept 4547, Carol Stream IL 60122) may be delayed. They are requesting that donations be made through the website www.lcif.org. There is a donate button at the top right of the homepage.

Processing of orders for awards and club supplies may also be delayed. Therefore, if your club is ordering a Melvin Jones award or other items for spring, please order early.

Again, thank you for your donations to LCIF so far this year, and I hope we can get back to at least last year's numbers by the end of June.

I hope also that we can get back to club meetings and that I can again visit with our Lions Clubs. Until then, stay well and as active as we can be.

"How do we Meet and Communicate during this Pandemic"

- Connect with every member; either by phone, e-mail, letter or a video conference to inform them that Lions are alive and well and that we want their participation. Remember older members who may not have the technology or ability to use some of this technology.
- At the club level, develop a list of members who can contact everyone. Then, divide that list among several club members and ask them to make weekly contacts to check on their group. Consider the same at the District level with the Zone Chairs continuing connections to the clubs.
- Hold a Zone Meeting via video to see how clubs are doing and how they are
- Establish technology experts in the District and Clubs to help train others remotely on the use of the technology.
- Consider a Technology Leader at the District level to help coordinate all of this and train the trainers.

Dear Lion,

The Board of Directors has voted to cancel the 2020 Lions International Convention due to concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19). This means that the next International Convention will be held in 2021 in Montreal, Canada.

After evaluating a variety of different options including moving the convention to a different venue or postponing the convention to a later date, the Board of Directors voted to cancel the 2020 convention. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind.

Canceling the International Convention for 2020 impacts international officer continuity and candidate elections. After review of the International Constitution and By-Laws, this impact is outlined below:

- **Executive officers and international directors will continue in their respective positions until the 2021 convention in Montreal. All candidate elections for these positions shall comply with the provisions of the International Constitution and By-Laws for election at the convention in Montreal.**
- An international director from the areas of Africa and Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific is permitted only in even-numbered years. As a result, no director from Africa or Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific would be eligible for election until the 2022 convention.
- Barring any district election complaints, district governors, first vice district governors and second vice district governors elected during a convention of their respective districts will be accepted by Lions International. The International Board of Directors intends to authorize commencement of the DG terms beginning July 1, 2020.

We are disappointed that we will not be able to move forward with this international event, but we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions we will continue to find new ways to put our kindness in action while safely serving our communities.

Dear Lions Leaders,

As global concerns surrounding the Covid-19 virus (“Coronavirus”) expand and world governments take steps to minimize the spread of illness, many districts and multiple districts are inquiring about the obligations and the challenges in holding constitutionally-mandated conventions. LCI understands those concerns, and supports the efforts of districts and multiple districts to ensure the safety of our Lions convention attendees and the community at large.

For districts and multiple districts in areas that are unaffected, and who are able to safely conduct normal business, we recommend that conventions be conducted as planned, but that you continue to monitor the situation in your respective districts.

For those Lions Districts (single, sub- and multiple) that are located in countries where government restrictions are limiting the ability of the district to conduct elections, or where public gatherings are being discouraged in order to protect the safety of citizens and minimize the potential spread of illness, please be advised that alternative methods for conducting the requisite elections, and conducting voting on any resolutions that are not able to be postponed, will be permissible if district conventions cannot be held in person.

Many of the provisions of your district’s constitution and by-laws must still be applied to conducting elections, including the following:

- a. Issue an Official Call detailing the time, date and location of the convention
 - i. If not being held in person, the official call must indicate
 1. the manner in which voting will be conducted,
 2. when outstanding dues must be paid in order to be entitled to delegates,
 3. when elections will end and ballots must be received (or postmarked if by mail) in order to be considered valid
 - ii. District must be able to provide evidence sufficiently demonstrating that all Lions Clubs in the district received the necessary information
- b. Nominating Committee must be named

- i. Candidates must submit their intention to contest for a respective office, and the nominating committee shall validate candidates as provided in the district's constitution and by-laws

- c. Credentials Committee must be established
 - i. Committee must verify club delegate credentials and ensure that only those clubs entitled to delegates are permitted to vote
 - ii. Committee must ensure that those clubs eligible for delegates receive formal ballots for voting purposes

- d. Elections Committee
 - i. Committee is responsible for establishing the ballot format and other election materials, vote tabulation and resolving all questions concerning the validity of individual ballots
 - ii. Vote tabulation must be conducted in the presence of the full elections committee, including each candidate-appointed observer

We strongly recommend that all districts seek to comply strictly with the International Constitution and By-Laws and mandatory provisions of the Standard District Constitution and By-Laws in order to minimize the likelihood of an election complaint being filed.

However, please note that all actions taken in good faith by a respective district in an effort to ensure a free and fair election will be taken into consideration in the event a formal election complaint is filed.

Maggie Degler was selected as the Pennsylvania State Lions and the Lions District 14P Leo of the year for her outstanding leadership and commitment to community service.

At the start of her 8th grade year, September 2015, Margaret (Maggie) Degler's enthusiasm for community service led her to become a Founding Member and President of the first-ever Avon Grove Charter School Leo Club. Since that time, she has held a leadership position annually: President for three years (2015-2016; 2016-2017 & 2019-2020), Secretary (2017-2018) and Vice President (2018-2019).

When she entered high school, she continued to advocate for an AGCS Leo Club at the high school level and has helped coordinate the team meetings before school, during lunch, and after school to ensure the high school group could thrive. She's even hosted weekend planning sessions at the local Starbucks to provide an opportunity for all to attend.

As a founding member of the Leo Club, she has been an integral part of the success of our club. She has been involved in almost every activity the Leo Club organized, and she frequently came up with her own ideas to add into the mix during times she was unable to be there.

Within the school and local community, the following are some examples of activities Maggie has coordinated: Purchase and distribution of pretzel grams, led a donation drive (coins collected by classroom) for Canine Partners for Life resulting in \$1000 donation, brought Canine Partners for Life to AGCS for three informational assemblies for grades 3-12 (nearly 900 students) to share the importance of service dogs in the lives of others, led the collection of 679 nonperishable items for "The Bridge" in West Grove, led the collection of more than 700 books for the Avon Grove Lions Club Book Barn, led a T-shirt design contest and sales with all proceeds of \$900 donated to Southern Chester County Family Promise of West Grove. Students organized a Random Acts of Kindness initiative that spread through the school, brightening staff members' days. Students also organized an egg hunt and activity day for the AGCS 170 kindergarten students. Maggie also organized Bingo Breakfasts for the resident of Luther House in Jennersville.

In addition to the activities mentioned above, Maggie was instrumental in coordinating two longer-term fundraiser projects that proved to be an outstanding success. First was the school lip-sync battle. The other was the diaper drive for victims of the Harvey hurricane disaster in Houston, TX in the fall of 2017. Under Maggie's leadership, the school and community collected more than 20,000 pounds of diapers and supplies for victims. This outstanding effort made the local news and was a major achievement for Maggie and her club members.
