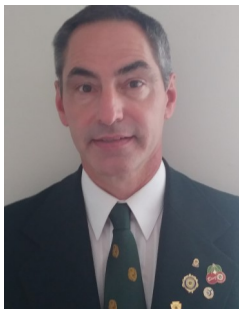

So far this Lions year, I have visited 13 of our District 14P Lions Clubs to make a presentation on LCIF. I am willing to visit your Lions Club in order to talk about what LCIF has accomplished since its founding in 1968.

I receive the report for the last month in the beginning of the following month. So the last report that I have at the time of this writing is for September. Through September 30th, nine of our forty Lions Clubs (22.5%) have donated to LCIF. We have donated \$2977.50 so far this year. That is an increase from \$1755.50 that we donated to September 30th of last year. This is, however, well behind our monthly goals needed to raise our total goal of \$56,281 for this Lions year. Thank you for the increase over last year, and I hope we can pick it up as the year progresses.

In an e-mail newsletter that I received in the middle of October, IPIP Gudrun Yngvadottir reported that LCIF awarded 98 grants totaling \$6,153,390 during September. These grants were used by Lions Clubs for projects including restoring sight through cornea transplants, creating a food bank, furnishing a guest house for families of childhood cancer patients, providing clean water and sanitation systems, and more.

November is diabetes awareness month with worldwide diabetes awareness day being on November 14th. In my visits with our Lions Clubs, I report that 400 million people today are living with diabetes. Unfortunately this is projected to rise to 650 million people by the year 2040. LCIF is working hard to increase diabetes research projects to cut this projection down. A gift of \$100 to LCIF would fund 18 diabetes screenings.

Donations to LCIF can be made online at lionsclubs.org/donate or can be mailed to Lions Clubs International Foundation, Department 4547, Carol Stream IL 60122-4547. Remember to include your member number in order to get Melvin Jones Fellowship credit. I also have pledge forms available.

May you all have a blessed Thanksgiving holiday in thankfulness for all that we have received. As Lions, may we increase our efforts to serve those in need both locally and around our world.

The Annual Meeting of the Bing Miller Foundation will be held on Sunday November 17, 2019, and the following 2 items will be presented for approval for addition to the constitution and for a change to an Article in the By-Laws section.

ARTICLE 111--SECTION 4-APPOINTED MEMBERSHIP:

Now reads that appointed membership consists of current DG, 1VDG,2VDG, and the current president of the PBM Lions Club. There is also omission of the word office in a sentence.

PROPOSED CHANGE TO READ:

Appointed membership shall consist of the current District Governor. The Active Board of Directors of the Bing Miller Foundation may appoint up to 3 additional members to the Board by invitation. These invitations shall be extended to the 1VDG,2VDG, and the current President of the PBM Lions Club. Such appointed members shall be entitled to all rights and privileges bestowed upon Active Board Members, except the right to hold office. Appointed Board Members shall count toward the 30 Director limits. The Appointed Membership status shall terminate upon the completion of their respective office term.

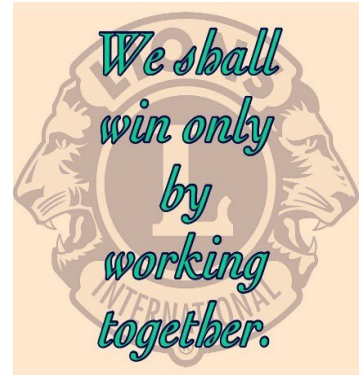
