In this case, Lions Clubs International considers the Immediate Past President as the coordinator and sends information to them. According to the LCIF website, September is childhood cancer month. Globally, more than 300,000 children are diagnosed with childhood cancer each year. This averages out to one every 2 minutes.

Globally, about 37% of these children with cancer survive. However, this survival rate varies widely by region. The World Health Organization has set a goal of a 60% survival rate by the year 2030.

LCIF is actively working on strengthening medical and social services in order to help increase the life expectancy of children with cancer and also to enhance the quality of life for patients and families.

Topton Lions Club President, Kathleen Fritch, is our District 14P childhood cancer coordinator this year.

According to the LCIF "wheel of global causes", a donation of \$100 could help purchase equipment to aid 8 childhood cancer patients. Please consider making a donation of any amount to LCIF.

Important Takeaways from "Paws to Refresh" PA State Council of Lions Newsletter

CBL amendments to be voted upon at special election in November

The special election scheduled to be held November 7 as part of the second 2020-2021 Council of Governors' meeting at the DoubleTree by Hilton Pittsburgh-Meadow Lands in Washington, Pa., are proceeding as planned.

The special election will be held to vote on two proposed amendments to the MD-14 Constitution & By Laws originally scheduled as part of the 2020 state convention in Erie.

The wording of the ballot questions, as well as Special Election Delegate forms, will be emailed to current members of the Council of Governors as well as their district newsletter editors for inclusion in districts' September, October and November newsletters.

Delegate forms for Past District Governors will also be emailed to PDGs for whom the State Office has a valid email address.

The proposed amendments to the CBL pertain to the selection of the State Council Chairperson and the redistribution of state per capita dues.

Copies of the ballot questions and Delegate forms are included in this issue of *Paws*.





ID Edwards' term expanded by one year

In the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic and the cancellation of the 2020 LCI Convention in Singapore,



the Executive Board of Lions Clubs International froze all officer positions for one year. That translates to MD-14 having a "seat at the table"

for one more year as Harris Township (District 14-G) Lion Larry L. Edwards will serve an additional year as an International Director.

ID Edwards was elected to a twoyear term at the 2019 LCI Convention in Milan and was scheduled to leave office at the conclusion of the 2021 convention in Montreal. He will now serve through the completion of the 2022 convention in New Delhi, India.

Liquor not permitted in basket raffles

REMINDER: A popular staple in basket raffles is a "no-no." After researching the matter with the Executive Director of the PA House of Representatives' Liquor



Committee and the PA Liquor Control Board, MD-14 legal counsel Lion Ashley Grimm reported that "liquor is not permitted to be in

a basket for purposes of a raffle. This also includes silent auctions.

"This equates to selling liquor without a license," Lion Grimm said. "A wine and spirits gift card is permitted to be included in a raffle basket, though."

Lion Grimm's research supported the opinion expressed by Lawrence County Treasurer Richard Rapone in a recent *New Castle News* story that had prompted MD-14 State Council Chair Bill Morgan to contact Lion Grimm.

As part of the *News* story, Capt. Jamie Jones of the LCB Enforcement Bureau said including any type of alcoholic beverage – be it a six pack of beer, a bottle of wine, a bottle of whiskey or the like – is a violation of the Pennsylvania Liquor Code, Title 47, and is an unclassified misdemeanor offense. The fine upon conviction is \$500, levied to the organization sponsoring the fundraiser and not the donor of the basket.

In the *News* story, Rapone pointed out, under the state's small games of chance law, it is illegal to host basket raffles at fundraising dinners used to benefit someone who is sick.

FAQ's: Frequently Asked Questions

Per capita dues

Lions Clubs International:

New Members pay a charter fee of \$35 or must submit the proper certification form waiver. International dues total \$43 annually and will be billed on a semi-annual basis. International dues for newly chartered clubs will be prorated for the months remaining in the semi-annual period ending either June 30 or December 31.

Family Members: The first family member (head of household) pays full international dues (\$43), and up to four additional family members pay only half the international dues (\$21.50). All family members pay the one-time charter fee of \$35. The Family Membership Program is open to family members who are (1) eligible for Lions membership, (2) currently in or joining the same club, and (3) living in the same household and related by birth, marriage or other legal relationship. Common household family members include parents, children, spouses, aunts and uncles, cousins, grandparents, in-laws and legal dependents.

Students between the age of majority and through age 30 pay no charter fee and half international dues. Students over age 30 and joining a Campus Lions club pay a \$10 charter fee and full international dues. New campus clubs, and clubs with a majority of students, must prepay one year international dues at the student member rate.

Graduating Leos: All graduating Leos receive a charter fee waiver. Graduating Leos, through the age of 30 who have been a Leo for at least a year and a day, pay half international dues.

Young adults, through the age of 30, receive a charter fee waiver and pay half international dues when joining a Leo Lions club.

Transfer members pay a US\$20 charter fee and must have left their former club in good standing and transfer to the new club within 12 months.

As of June 30, 2018, LCI will not issue international dues credits for membership drops after the release of the semi-annual billings on July 1 and January 1.

State per capita dues are collected to provide revenue to defray the administrative expenses of the Multiple District and each sub-District and a Multiple District Convention Fund, annual per capita dues of \$16.00 per member per year are collected. These dues are collected in two semi-annual payments based upon a club's membership total as shown by LCI as of July 1 and January 1 of each fiscal year.

As is the case with LCI for international dues, state per capita dues are not pro-rated for members added or dropped from club membership rolls after July 1 and before December 30 and/or after January 1 and before June 30.


- Put your project into MyLion as a Future Activity. This is so Lions everywhere can see what you are doing.

- Please let MD 14 Childhood Cancer Chairperson, PDG Keldeen Stambaugh, know what your plans are as well.


I do not know if you have heard yet but the in person "Thon" at Penn State University has been cancelled this school year because of the pandemic. "Thon" is the major fundraiser for Four Diamonds. Last year "Thon" raised nearly 12 million dollars for Four Diamonds during the weekend. While they are doing a virtual event, no one knows whether it will be as successful as a normal event. We must step up our efforts to try to offset shortfalls as best as we can. One thing every Lion can do is make a recurring monthly donation to Four Diamonds. A \$5 monthly donation from every Pennsylvania Lion would bring in \$1,058,160 to our campaign #PALionsFTK. That would be 1 million more that we donated last year.



To the Lions of District 14-P

Greetings from PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp! I would like to start off with a sincere <u>Thank</u> <u>You</u> for the support Beacon Lodge has received from the 14-P Clubs and individual Lions. When the call goes out, we know that 14-P will answer.

One such call was for funding to replace our outdated phone system and telephone cable infrastructure. Beacon Lodge has 43 buildings, most of which are spread out across 20 acres. Parts of the safety protocols here require quick access to a telephone in the case of an emergency. That means most of our buildings must have a telephone available.

When we began gathering information on what modern phone systems feature, we found that most include the ability to act as the backbone for a robust WIFI system as well. Including WIFI in our offerings to Campers had previously seemed like an unattainable dream, but now we had a way to make it happen. The only obstacle now was that only DSL internet service was available in our area...

Seeking other internet service providers resulted in discussions with Comcast, who could make a build-out available that would dramatically improve the speed and reliability of our internet connection. Negotiations resulted in Comcast agreeing to cover 25% of the cost as well.

Everything was arranged, funding was secured, and the project began with a two month long construction of our on-site system. Fiber optic cables, VOIP telephones, and many WIFI antennas brought Beacon Lodge's telephony infrastructure into the 21st century.

The build-out, which included over 4 miles of distribution cable to reach the closest access point, took much longer. Various reasons were given for the long wait, and Beacon Lodge owes a debt of gratitude to the office of PA State Representative Rich Irvin of the 81st District for intervening and helping to push this project across the finish line.

I am happy to announce that the final installation of our new internet connection was completed on August 13, 2020. Speed tests confirmed that what was a 1.9 mbps trickle (sometimes took 30+ seconds to load an email) was replaced by a 350 mbps pipeline!

The benefits will be numerous, both for our campers and for the business end of our operations: Beacon Lodge has missed out on several off season rentals because we could not offer WIFI. Some of our diabetic campers have insulin pumps that can connect to WIFI and provide real-time information to their doctors, enabling them to get better calibrated care. One of my favorite benefits is that campers with a smart phone (which is most of them) can face time with their parents, families, caregivers, and friends. What a great way to provide peace of mind, or to share their experiences here with their support networks at home.



On August 12th, IPP and current secretary Len Crowther of the Honey Brook Lions Club presented a check in the amount of \$500.00 to Ken Ross, the **Board Chairman of The Honey Brook Food** Pantry. This organization is serving over 450 local families and about 1,700 individuals, and they set up twice a month to distribute food. Ken reports that due to the current Covid situation, they had a 48% increase during the first 6 weeks of the "closed economy" and that there has been an 82% increase in newly registered families. During the past quarter alone they served 127 new people. Like most clubs, our fundraising activities were somewhat curtailed the last Lions year, but we were still able to make significant contributions to many local organizations as well as several Lions organizations because of the dedicated, hard work of our Lion members.



POINTS:

Points are based on the following scoring system:


