In this Lions year more than 300 Pennsylvania Lions will be taking classes related to becoming a more informed and educated Lion either online or by traveling to a classroom setting.

Fortunately, the number is increasing every year. In this article, your MD-14 Global Leadership Team is giving you something invaluable: the opportunity to continue your Lions' education and further your Lions' knowledge from the comfort of your own home and it's absolutely **FREE!**

The Lions Learning Center (LLC) has over 50 courses available online for Lions on a wide variety of subjects important to whatever your role is within a club or district. Please let me reassure you, even if it's been a few years since you last participated in taking any course, the LLC is geared to Lions of all education levels. Most courses take about one hour to complete with a simple quiz at the end of the course. To access the LLC, enter your Lions Portal, click on Learn and then the Lions Learning Center yellow **GO** button. The content library will display all the courses available.

Another amazing source of free training is "Lions University," with nearly 60 free online courses located at "lionsuniversity.org". It is simple to register and gain entry to the site. The Lions University is separated into three programs –

- Bachelor's program courses allow Lions to develop the skills necessary to lead a vital Lions Club. Courses are directed to the skills needed to be a great club leader.
- Master's program courses focus on giving support to clubs through district leaders. This program is aimed at District Level leaders.
- Doctorate degree program focuses on skills needed to be a training facilitator for adult volunteers.

These classes are also about one hour in length and are free to view and learn from the website with no obligation. Graduation from Lions University requires attendance at a USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum, but it is not required to take the courses.

The final resource I wish to let you know about is YouTube.com. Simply enter "Lions Clubs Training" in the search box for an abundance of training videos. There is a wealth of information and training from various Lions-related sites. I am not even going to attempt to list the variety of Lions classes you can view on this website. Any Lion subject you could possibly need is either here or on one of the other sites listed.

I have heard too often, "I didn't fulfill my Lions responsibility *because* no Lions leader showed me how to do my job." District leaders need to encourage their team to review and learn from these wonderful classes. They are fabulous sources of help to even the most experienced Lion. Please contact me if you have questions or require help with any of these resources.

As of this report, MD-14 is down over \$103,000 from this time last year. Thank you to those Lions and clubs that have donated so far this Lions year! The need is so great today; just recently a tornado devastated a town in Texas. Our Lions motto is "We Serve" and there are people out there who desperately need help from us Lions! LCIF has been busy awarding grants for these disasters and our help is crucial to continue with these grants.

District 14-P has already reached 100% of its goal, with 14-D second at 79% and 14-K third at 69%.

GREATER CANONSBURG LION, AWARD WINNING ARTIST



If you have attended the **District 14-M** regional convention over the past three years you have most likely seen or met **Lion Diane Krek** at her BLT Art booth. Lion Diane and her husband, Lion Melvin, are members of the **Greater Canonsburg Lions Club**. Diane has a genetic retinal disease called Retinitis Pigmentosa (RP) along with hearing loss. The two combined are referred to as Usher-2A. There is currently no treatment or cure for her affliction although worldwide clinical trials are ongoing, looking for a cure.

Diane was diagnosed with RP in 1990 at the age of 33. With the assistance of specialized software, large screen monitors and magnification tools supplied by Blind and Vision Services of Pittsburgh, she was able to continue her employment. In 2012 her vision loss progressed to the point that she could no longer work. Faced with going on disability, she wanted to become an advocate for vision loss and help where she could by making people aware of the help that is available for the blind and visually impaired.

Being an artist her entire life, she decided to go back to painting. In 2015 Lion Diane started her business, BLT Art, (Bear, Lighthouse and Train art). These are things that she and her husband enjoy and by incorporating all three items in a painting, she hoped to build vision awareness. Diane paints acrylic on canvas. The originals are high resolution scanned and prints are made from the scans. The prints are then matted and sold. For every sale, Lion Diane donates 20% to blind and vision research organizations.

In 2022, Lions Diane and Melvin met Lion Beth Slade from Leader Dogs for The Blind. After that meeting and learning about the program, Diane wanted to dedicate 2022 to fundraise for Leader Dogs. With the support of the Greater Canonsburg Lions Club, she and Melvin started a "Dog Tag" promotion throughout the summer and fall. They asked friends of theirs who own a local winery to help by selling the dog tags for one month. Between the dog tag sales, BLT Arts donation and miscellaneous other cash donations, Lion Diane was able to present \$1,000 to Leader Dogs!

In March of 2023, Lion Diane received an opportunity to enter one of her original paintings in an art contest sponsored by American Printing House for the Blind (APH). The painting is a 28" x 34" acrylic on canvas, autumn scene of New Presque Isle Lighthouse in Northern Michigan. She submitted the required documentation and photographs of the original artwork by the deadline of March 31st. When she had heard nothing by April 30th, she thought that she had not won anything. In early May, Lions Diane and Melvin took a trip to Rochester Hills, Michigan to visit the Leader Dogs for the Blind facility. While there, Diane received a phone call from APH advising her that her painting was unanimously selected as the winner of the Visionary Award. She will receive a cash award, certificate of recognition, invitation to the awards banquet in Louisville, Kentucky in October and her original painting will be on display in a gallery in Louisville through February 2024. The original painting will also be available for purchase during that time. This award is a very prestigious recognition from the blind and low vision community.

Along with winning the APH Visionary award, Lions Diane and Melvin were presented with the International President's Certificate of Recognition at the District 14-M regional convention in April 2023 from DG Mark Ellsworth and International Director Allen Snider for their commitment to fundraising and raising awareness to blindness and low vision. Lion Diane's artwork is also on display at The ARC of Washington County Art Gallery, 111 West Pike Street, Canonsburg, PA. She also has a website: www.BLTart.com.

The Greater Canonsburg Lions Club is proud of Lion Diane's accomplishments and to have Diane and Melvin as members.



Pill Bottle Collection Project

During the months of February and March, the **Hanover Lions Club, 14-C** engaged in a club service project collecting empty used prescription bottles. Working with the *Matthew25 Ministries* program out of Ohio, these collected bottles are cleaned, boxed, and sent to the M25M program. M25M then ships the bottles overseas to underdeveloped nations as part of healthcare packages where the bottles can be re-used for safe and clean distribution of medications to the poor in those countries. This is the club's first year for this service project and members collected 354 bottles, with a long-range plan to involve the entire community of Hanover next year.

Hanover Lions Club Partners with Myers Meat Market and New Hope Ministries
To Feed the Hungry

Local families in need have been helped by a three-way partnership involving the **Hanover Lions Club, Myers Meat Market, and New Hope Ministries.** The Lions Club raises funds through various service-oriented projects throughout the year and designates a portion of these funds toward feeding the hungry via the Feed-A-Friend project. 




Re: PA State Sales & Use Tax Exemption Form

Date: July 7, 2021

Pennsylvania State Sales and Use Tax Exemption form awarded to the PA State Council of Lions Clubs for use by clubs during fundraising projects. This form is valid through February 2026 and may be duplicated as needed but **SHOULD NOT BE POSTED ON CLUB OR DISTRICT** websites or social media where it would be accessible by the general public. We do not want to risk losing the exemption as the result of improper use of this form.

Courtesy of Multiple District 14 Legal Counsel Lion Ashley Grimm:

"The PA State Council of Lions Clubs is registered in Pennsylvania as an Institution of Purely Public Charity under The Institutions of Purely Public Charity Act, 10 P.S. § 371.et seq. As such, it, and its subsidiary clubs, quality for an exemption from PA Sales tax. This means clubs are exempt from paying sales tax when they purchase goods or services. It does NOT mean they are exempt from remitting sales and use tax to Pennsylvania during fundraisers."

NO LIQUOR IN RAFFLES!

Liquor not permitted in basket raffles

Please be aware: A popular staple in basket raffles is a "no-no."

After researching the matter with the Executive



Director of the PA House of Representatives' Liquor Committee and the PA Liquor Control Board, MD-14 legal counsel Lion Ashley Grimm reported that "liquor is not permitted to be in a basket for purposes of a raffle. This also includes silent auctions.

"This equates to selling liquor without a license," Lion Grimm said. "A wine and spirits gift card is permitted to be included in a raffle basket, though." Lion Grimm's research supported the opinion expressed by Lawrence County Treasurer Richard Rapone in a recent New Castle News story that had prompted MD-14 State Council Chair Bill Morgan to contact Lion Grimm.

As part of the News story, Capt. Jamie Jones of the LCB Enforcement Bureau said including any type of alcoholic beverage — be it a six pack of beer, a bottle of wine, a bottle of whiskey or the like — is a violation of the Pennsylvania Liquor Code, Title 47, and is an unclassified misdemeanor offense. The fine upon conviction is \$500, levied to the organization sponsoring the fundraiser and not the donor of the basket.

In the News story, Rapone pointed out, under the state's small games of chance law, it is illegal to host basket raffles at fundraising dinners used to benefit someone who is sick.
