A Seasonal Success: Whitemouth Lions donate food, funds collected through CP Holiday Train

On Dec. 5, members of the Whitemouth Lions Club completed the CP Holiday Train tour with their final destinations as they delivered nonperishable food items and cash donations collected at the Dec. 4 event to the local food banks.

While Whitemouth Lions club president Shannon Malkoske and others arrived at the Lac du Bonnet Food Bank at 11 a.m. with truck box filled with food, fellow Lions Calvin Kirby and Co. arrived at the Beausejour Food Bank with similar good in tow.

As Lions carried boxes and bags of canned and dry staples inside, volunteers weighed and tallied a total of 573 pounds of food donations in Lac du Bonnet and around 660 pounds of food in Beausejour.

Malkoske reported that cash donations from individuals, businesses, organizations and corporations totaled \$6,770.50 which was split equally with presentations of \$3,385.25 to both the Lac du Bonnet and

Malkoske reported that CP donated \$4,000 again this year, and that company representatives were verv impressed with the crowd of 3,000 people that approximately gathered in Whitemouth the night before to enjoy the Christmas spectacle. The Whitemouth Lions Club donated \$1,500 to the event adding to the \$100 from the RM of Whitemouth and \$150 from the Ladies of the Lake, a group of cottagers from Nutimik and Barrier Bays.

Other donations included \$100 from the Kacel Resourses in Lac du Bonnet, \$100 from the Pinawa Lions and \$100 from



the First Stop Grocers in Whitemouth.

"We want to thank everyone who came out to the event, and for the generous cash and food donations that were made. There were more people this year than we have ever seen," said Malkoske, who praised the RCMP and emergency service personnel who monitored numbers and maintained safety at the event.



Proposed Amendment to District 5M11 Bylaw

Alternative procedure to Fill a Vacancy in the Office of First or Second Vice District Governor-District 5M-11 Bylaws, Article 111, Section 6, shall be amended by addition of the following paragraph:

ALTERNATIVE PROCEDURE: in the event of a vacancy arising in the office of first or second vice district governor at a time when it is not convenient to convene a meeting of the members of the existing cabinet, and a candidate or candidates announces his or her candidacy to the district governor, the district governor shall submit the candidates' qualification to the district nominating committee. If the candidate(s) are qualified, the district governor will appoint an election committee consisting of the district secretary and one or more members of the governor's cabinet. The election committee shall submit the name(s) to all members of the district cabinet by US or Canadian mail or e-mail, as provided in Article X, Section 4 of these by-laws, in a format that complies with Article 111, Section 4: Ballot. Votes by cabinet members are to be cast within two weeks of sending of the ballot, by US or Canadian mail or e-mail to the members of the elections committee. The elections committee, at the close of the designated voting period, shall compile the votes cast and report the results to the district governor. A candidate receiving the majority of the votes cast, or a majority of "Yes" votes if there is only one candidate, shall be declared elected. The district governor shall convey the results to the international office within seven days, together with the elections committee report, and such other documentation as shall be required by the international office.

Rationale: During the past three years, a qualified candidate for second vice district governor was not elected during the Midwinter Convention, leaving the office vacant. Due to the geographic expanse of District 5M11, calling of a special meeting is not practical or cost effective. The proposed Alternative Procedure has been used effectively to fill two recent vacancies, and the procedure should be formalized as a part of the 5M11 Bylaws.






Rose Parade Float 2016



Lac du Bonnet Lions transfer Leslie Park

On Dec. 1, the Lac du Bonnet Lions officially transferred Leslie Park over to the town after completing their commitment to raise funds required to convert the public space to one with wheelchair access for all to enjoy.

"This has been close to a four year project for the Lions," said Rolly Simard, explaning the Molinski family of Lac du Bonnet spearheaded the project when they approached the Lions about the need for such a green space in town. After a successful fund raiser organized by the family, the Lions agreed to come on board and help the dream come true.

"The planning involved taking a strategic approach and we had many things to decide including the location of the site, finding a partner with charitable status and submitting applications for various funds and grants, "said Simard.

The Lions received some very good news in June 2014 when the Lions International Foundation informed them they would match equally, every dollar they could raise with the next six month period. The agreement was that funds.

Through the generous support of the community, and hours of work from the Lions, the group was successful in raising \$37,500 by Dec. 31, 2014. When the matching funds arrived from Lions International Foundation, the cheque was made out in American currency. What that translated to with the exchange rate, was an additional \$7,555 that could be applied to the project.

The Lions turned over the funds to the Town of Lac du Bonnet, who will use the money to purchase supplies to finish off the final touches in the park. The town will also take full responsibility for future upkeep and maintenance of the green space.

"The town will contract the necessary landscaping including edging and grass restoration, installation of asphalt, improvement to the drainage system and completing the main ramp access," said Simard. Can Do Canine Update

Thanks to the support of Lions Clubs across 5M, Can Do Canines continues to train specially trained for people with disabilities and provide them to those in need, free of charge.

One recipient of a Can Do Canines assistance dog is 11 year-old Isaiah Kramer. Isaiah has been diagnosed with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy, a degenerative muscle disease that affects every muscle in the body—legs, arms, lungs, heart, and more. Isaiah continues to physically decline, so he now depends on his wheelchair all the time.

Mobility Assist Dog Leo helps Isaiah by picking items that he drops, pulling off his socks and pushing buttons to open handicap doors in public. Below is a letter from Isaiah about how Leo has transformed his life.

I am writing to thank you and everyone at Can Do Canines for giving Leo to me. Having Leo has changed everything.

Before I met Leo, I was unhappy all of the time because I couldn't do much and I always had to ask for help. My family would be busy and I had to bug them all the time just to pick something up off of the floor for me.

I was nervous and excited to meet Leo for the first time. Leo got used to me right away, but it was also a little scary. He was excited to see me every time we came for training.

Having Leo makes me feel more independent. He picks things up for me, helps me clean my room and carries things for me. I don't have to ask for help from my family as much.

Leo loves to follow me around and loves playing with me. We play Frisbee, tug and fetch together. I love how excited he is when he sees me. He runs to me and jumps around and rubs into me with his back.

I feel safe at night because Leo is there. I sleep better with him next to me.

If I am sad, I can go to Leo and he looks really concerned for me. I can see it in his eyes. He always cheers me up because I can talk to him and he doesn't argue with me.

I felt so lonely before. Now Leo will snuggle up next to me, play with me and make me happy anytime. I don't feel as lonely anymore.



Calling All Lions of Minnesota

We have been asked for our help. As you know we now have the Volunteer Protection Act which allows us to help others without fear of a possible lawsuit. This law needs to be taken a little further.

In Ohio a Lions Club was holding a pancake fundraiser in an airport hangar. The owner of the hangar took it upon himself to offer free airplane rides to visually impaired persons, without the approval or endorsement of the club. This was nice, but the plane crashed killing 6 people. A judge has ruled that the club is responsible and must pay. They didn't have those kinds of funds and had to fold. Now LCI is being held responsible.

A bill is being introduced to prevent this from happening. Please contact your House representatives and your US Senators and let them know where we stand. More info on VOPA: We need U.S. Lions to urge their Member of Congress to co-sponsor the Volunteer Organization Protection Act of 2015 ("VOPA"). U.S. Senate Bill 1684 and U.S. House Bill 2290.

Why Support the VOPA?

Nonprofit organizations are involved in a wide range of activities, many of which expose the organization, its officers and volunteers to potential liability. Although their intent is to serve the public interest, these organizations and their volunteers may inadvertently cause harm to others and are thus susceptible to typical tort claims.

Nonprofit organizations play a very important role in the American society and economy, but are now being drawn into lawsuits on a scale previously reserved for private businesses. This phenomenon can endanger the existence of Lions clubs even as public demand for their services grows. In this age of frivolous lawsuits, providing enhanced protection to local service organizations that simply want to help their fellow citizens is a common sense appeal.

Lions Clubs International is proud to have taken the lead on this important measure, but we cannot do it alone. The successful passage of this legislation and the fiscal health of Lions clubs and local nonprofit organizations depend on the strength of Lions across the U.S.!

What is the VOPA?

In 1997, U.S. Congress adopted the Volunteer Protection Act ("Act"), which provides protection from tort claims that might be filed against individual volunteers of nonprofit organizations. However, the Act does not completely protect nonprofit organizations from liability caused by a volunteer.

Recognizing the need to provide enhanced protection to local service club organizations, Lions Clubs International engaged Congressman Steve Chabot of Ohio as well as U.S. Senator Mark Kirk of Illinois to develop a bill to correct this issue. The Volunteer Organization Protection Act of 2015 ("VOPA") was subsequently introduced into Congress this year!

The bill would amend the Act by affording similar liability protections to volunteer organizations as are already provided to individual volunteers, except in cases of willful misconduct, gross negligence, reckless misconduct or flagrant indifference to safety. The bill does not raise the standard of liability for organizations – it merely protects organizations, such as Lions clubs, from being drawn into lawsuits for the wrongful acts of individual volunteers.
