First Timers at Convention

The term "First Timer" shall apply to any Lion, Lioness, or Leo member attending his or her first 5M-11 Mid Winter Convention. The purpose is to help newer members learn about Lions Club International and also encourage them to meet other Lions, Lioness, and Leos.

The First Timers Program will consist of a booklet with two parts. The first part of the program booklet involves written answers to questions about our Lions organization. The second part requires obtaining signatures of various past and present International, Multiple, and District Officers as outlined in the booklet. In addition, participants will be asked to get signatures from current Lions, Lioness, and Leo Club Presidents and Secretaries of all 5M-11 Clubs in attendance at the Mid-Winter Convention.

The booklet will be distributed at the registration table to those who have identified themselves at "First Times". An orientation meeting for all "First timers" will be held on Friday, January 30th. Participants will have until 5p.m. Saturday to complete their booklets and turn them in for judging. The First Timers Program and judging will be under the direction of the 1st Vice District Governor.

Prizes for the first and second place winners will be awarded at the Sunday Brunch. The first place winner will receive a Hospitality Book and two nights lodging for the 2016 Mid-Winter Convention. The second place winner will receive a Hospitality book for the 2016 Mid-Winter Convention. The prizes are non-transferrable.

Cabinet Member Responsibilities

 - Keeping the district informed what your zone is up to
 - ◊ Helping clubs in your zone if they need it
- Program Chairs
 - Attend meeting for your program be it district or multiple district

- Submit written reports to meetings you attend and the Newsletter
- Offer to come to club or zone meetings to talk about your program
- Keep the district aware of what is happening with your program
- All Cabinet members
 - ◊ Submitting reports to the Newsletter
 - Staying in contact with each other and possibly Multiple District
 - Helping distribute the Newsletter to zone and club members
- Attending Officer Training
- All training that can be offered still needs to have personal involvement.
- If you can't do it, ask for help.

Proposed Amendment to District 5M11 Bylaw

Alternative procedure to Fill a Vacancy in the Office of First or Second Vice District Governor-District 5M-11 Bylaws, Article 111, Section 6, shall be amended by addition of the following paragraph:

ALTERNATIVE PROCEDURE: in the event of a vacancy arising in the office of first or second vice district governor at a time when it is not convenient to convene a meeting of the members of the existing cabinet, and a candidate or candidates announces his or her candidacy to the district governor, the district governor shall submit the candidates' qualification to the district nominating committee. If the candidate(s) are qualified, the district governor will appoint an election committee consisting of the district secretary and one or more members of the governor's cabinet. The election committee shall submit the name(s) to all members of the district cabinet by US or Canadian mail or e-mail, as provided in Article X, Section 4 of these by-laws, in a format that complies with Article 111, Section 4: Ballot. Votes by cabinet members are to be cast within two weeks of sending of the ballot, by US or Canadian mail or e-mail to the members of the results to the district governor. A candidate receiving the majority of the votes cast, or a majority of "Yes" votes if there is only one candidate, shall be declared elected. The district governor shall convey the results to the international office within seven days, together with the elections committee report, and such other documentation as shall be required by the international office.

Rationale: During the past three years, a qualified candidate for second vice district governor was not elected during the Midwinter Convention, leaving the office vacant. Due to the geographic expanse of District 5M11, calling of a special meeting is not practical or cost effective. The proposed Alternative Procedure has been used effectively to fill two recent vacancies, and the procedure should be formalized as a part of the 5M11 Bylaws.

Qualifications for Office

Section 2: **DISTRICT GOVERNOR ELECTION PROCEDURES**. Any qualified member of a club in the district seeking the office of district governor shall file his/her intention to so run in writing with the Nominating Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the start of the convention, and furnish evidence of his/ her compliance with the qualifications for said office set out in the International Constitution and By-Laws. The Nominating Committee shall place in nomination at the district convention the name(s) of all candidate(s) so qualified. If none are so received and/or so qualified, then, but then only, nominations for the office may be made from the floor. A candidate shall be allowed one nominating speech of no more than five (5) minutes duration, and one seconding speech of no more than three (3) minutes duration.

Section 3: **FIRST AND SECOND VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR ELECTION PROCEDURES**. Any member of a club in the district seeking the office of first or second vice district governor shall file his/her intention to so run in writing with the Nominating Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the start of the convention, and furnish evidence of his/her compliance with the qualifications for said office set out in the International Constitution and By-Laws. The Nominating Committee shall place in nomination at the district convention the names of all candidates so qualified. If none are so received and/or so qualified, then, but then only, nominations for the office may be made from the floor. Each candidate shall be allowed one nominating speech of no more than five (5) minutes duration, and one seconding speech of no more than three (3) minutes duration.

*From the Constitution and By-laws of Lions Club International

A candidate for the office of district governor shall:

- 1. Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or sub-district.
- 3. Currently be serving as the first vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected.

A candidate for the office of first vice district governor shall:

- 1. Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or subdistrict.
- 3. Currently be serving as the second vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected.

A candidate for the office of second vice district governor shall:

- 1. Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or subdistrict.
- 3. Have served or will have served at the time he/she takes office as second vice district governor:
- a. As president of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof, and a member of the board of directors of a
- Lions club for no less than two (2) additional years; and
- b. As zone chairperson or region chairperson or cabinet secretary and/or treasurer for a full term or major portion thereof.
- c. With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.



MD5M Hall of Fame Award

Purpose

(October 2003)

To honor those Lion and Lioness members of character and substance who have demonstrated the highest level of commitment and dedication to the efforts of their club, district or multiple district and the motto of our association, "We Serve."

Award

There will be a maximum of one (1) recipient of the MD5M Hall of Fame Award per district, inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame each year. The award may be presented posthumously

Exception: During the 2003-04, 2004-05 and 2005-06 Lion years, each district will be allowed two (2) Hall of Fame recipients, at least one (1) of which must be honored posthumously. Following the 2005-06 Lion year, beginning in the 2006-07 Lion year, the number of Hall of Fame recipients per district will return to one (1) per district.

The MD5M Hall of Fame award recipients are to be inducted into the Hall of Fame at the annual MD5M Multiple District Convention during the Saturday noon luncheon. The first honorees will be inducted May 21-23, 2004 at the MD5M Multiple Convention.

MD5M Hall of Fame recipients will receive a MD5M Hall of Fame award plaque and a Hall of Fame lapel pin in recognition of their induction in the MD5M Hall of Fame. In addition, a complete listing of all MD5M Hall of Fame recipients will appear in the annual MD5M directory and a perpetual plaque, with the names of all inductees and the year of their induction inscribed thereon, will be kept in a prominent place in the MD5M office, when available.

The presentation of the MD5M Hall of Fame inductees will be the responsibility of the current International Director from MD5M, if there is one and he/she is in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention. If not, then the most recent Past International Director having served from MD5M in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

Criteria

A candidate may be a Lion or Lioness, must have been a member in good standing for at least 15 years, be at least two (2) years removed from the Council of Governors if a PDG, should have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavors, and he/she should be of good moral character and have a good reputation in his/her community. A nominee must be a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club in MD5M, or must have been a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club in MD5M, or must have been a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club in MD5M.

Process

A candidate may be sponsored by any Lion, Lioness, Lions Club, Lioness Club, Zone, or District.

There will be a nomination fee of \$150.00 per each candidate nominated. The nomination fee will be returned to those sponsors whose candidates are not elected for induction into the MD5M Hall of Fame. The nomination fee for those selected for induction will be sent to MD5M and will be used to offset the cost of the award process, plaques and pin.

Nominations, including the nomination fee, must be received by the District Governor at least 30 days prior to the District's Mid-Winter Convention.

Each individual District will annually hold an election at their Mid-Winter Convention to determine the candidate(s), if any, to be inducted into the Hall of Fame for that Lion Year. Each sponsor will have an opportunity to give a brief presentation on the merits and biographical information of their nominee prior to the election. Those elected to be inducted into the MD5M

Hall of Fame will not be announced until their induction at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

All nominations will use the standard form, no others will be accepted. The nomination fee must be received at the time the application is received, otherwise the nomination will not be considered.

All successful candidates will be inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame at the next MD5M Multiple District Convention. The sponsor(s) and the respective District Governor will ensure that the honoree or a suitable representative be in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention when the honorees are inducted.

A note from your PID...

TIMES, THEY ARE A CHANGIN'

Bob Dylan may not have said it first, but nonetheless it's true today, or at least after this year's International Convention. Five International Constitution and By-law Amendments were enacted:

• The position of International Third Vice President was re-instated effective with the 2016-17 Lions year which means both a 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} Vice President of LCI will be elected at the Fukuoka Convention.

• The number of International Directors from the United States and its affiliates (which by Board action now includes the islands of the Caribbean Sea), Constitutional

Area I, will be reduce from 14 to 11 over the next 3 years. Rather than electing 7 directors for 2 year terms each year, Constitutional Area I will now elect 6 in 2016-17; 6 in 2017-18 and 5 in 2018-19.

- The name of the "Leadership" Committee was changed to "Leadership Development" Committee to more accurately reflect its purpose.
- Effective July 1, 2016 requiring dues to be paid no later than the 15 days prior to a District or Multiple District convention for a delegate or the club of a candidate to be in "Good Standing" for the purpose of voting or running for office.
- No longer will a single affected district be able to block a Multiple district re-districting proposal; rather a re-districting proposal only requires passage by a majority of the delegates to a MD Convention,

BUT THERE'S MORE (But these election changes all become mandatory next year; so consider using them this year).

Because of persistent election problems occurring elsewhere, these provisions are a part of the Standard District Constitution and By-laws effective next year.

- Inclusion of a dispute Resolution procedure.
- An automatic update of District Constitution and By-laws is required when mandatory District CBL provisions are passed at an International Convention.
- District Governors are to appoint in writing a minimum of 60 days prior to a convention, a Nominating committee consisting of a minimum of 3 and a maximum of 5 members from different clubs, none of whom are on the Cabinet or hold an International Office, either by appointment or election. That committee shall review the qualifications of proposed candidates no later than 30 days before the convention.
- Use of DG and VDG Qualification Checklists is mandatory for the Nominating committee.
- Inclusion of the mandatory procedures for filling vacancies in the office of DG, 1st or 2nd VDG.
- A Convention call may be made by printed or electronic means and shall be given to all clubs no less than 60, rather than 30, days before the convention.
- The Cabinet may change the convention site no less than 30 days prior to the convention.
- The Convention Report must be sent to LCI within 15, rather than 60, days of the close of the convention.
- The Credentials Committee shall be chaired by the DG, with members including the cabinet secretary/treasurer and 2 other non-officers, both of whom are members of different clubs in good standing.
- The ballot forms proscribed by LCI must be used for both contested and uncontested elections are mandatory. When there are more than 2 candidates, a ballot and procedure for preferential voting are available.

Lions Club International will be 100 years old in 2017, so many special events are being planned. We anticipate over 600 Lions to attend.


