

Have You Filed Your Federal Tax Form (990-N) for 2016?

Most Minnesota Lions Clubs qualify to file Federal tax form 990N (less than \$50,000 per year in gross receipts). This has to be filed online, and for most clubs it must be filed before November 15 of this year (there are a few Lions Clubs that have a calendar year as their fiscal year and your club must file each year by May 15).

To file, the easiest way to do it is to go to the following website: <u>https://www.irs.gov/charities-non-profits/annual-electronic-filing-requirement-for-small-exempt-organizations-form-990-n-e-postcard</u>

Once you are at the site, you need to have the following: NEW this year you have to register on the IRS website.

Completing the e-Postcard requires the eight items listed below:

1. Employer identification number (EIN), also known as a Taxpayer Identification Number (TIM). Your secretary should have this, or you can get it for your club on the LCI website, www.mylci.org. then pull up your club, it will have the number listed. This is a nine digit number.

2. Tax year Use July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016.

- 3. Legal name and mailing address
- 4. Any other names the organization uses
- 5. Name and address of a principal officer
- 6. Web site address if the organization has one
- 7. Confirmation that the organization's annual gross receipts are \$50,000 or less

8. If applicable, a statement that the organization has terminated or is terminating (going out of business)

You MUST complete this every year. If you miss for 3 year, your club loses its tax exempt status and you must pay a \$400 rein statement fee to get re-registered (or more, if you have more than \$10,000 in donations made by the club, per year). Avoid the pain, make sure that this is done at the latest by November 15 of each year, but do it early in case there is some glitch that needs to be dealt with.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ANNUAL CORPORATE FILING WITH THE MINNESOTA SECRETARY OF STATE

This needs to be done by all of the Minnesota clubs and districts by December 31 of each year. The instructions for the annual filing for Minnesota Secretary of State for corporate status are as follows:

- On the internet, enter www.sos.state.mn.us
- Then find Business and Liens
- Then find Business filings online
- Then find Business forms and fees
- Then find Minnesota Non Profit Corporation Forms
- Then go to Annual Renewal (MN Nonprofit Corporations).pdf






Fosston Lengby Lions

AMY KAINZ & MOBILITY ASSIST DOG REBEL

It's hard to believe that Amy and Rebel have been "officially" together for only a few weeks. They've visited malls, restaurants, gone to movies and even the county fair where Rebel was "a rock star." There's a growing bond between them. They seem very comfortable and Rebel is getting used to Amy's soft-spoken but firm commands. Rebel affords Amy "extra security and a sense of peace to my family."

Family approval is an important part of what Amy imparts to us in her interview. For her, contemplating the acquisition of a Mobility Assist dog was not her decision



alone. Her family would be hugely impacted by a new family member and she wanted to make sure that all were onboard. She is quick to point out that her kids were really her helping hands, picking things up and opening doors for her. She realized an assistance animal ideally could do the same, especially when the kids were back in school.

Some of Rebel's natural smarts have begun to become specific to Amy's needs. Rebel gets Amy out of bed in the morning and she credits him for being "the reason I get up." He is super great about picking things up for her and is developing his skills in taking Amy's socks off (per her request.)

The journey from expressing interest in an assistance dog to actual acquisition, certification and graduation is a long one, but Amy urges anyone who is considering it to have patience. "The right dog will be there when you're ready and when **they're** ready." Amy is eternally grateful to all of the folks at Can Do Canines and people like you who support the mission! She says "it's a life changing addition."


Greetings Fellow Lions, Lioness and Leos of 5M-11!
