AUDIOLOGY BOOTH PROJECT *APPROVED!*

Below is a message that was forwarded from David Dominick, the Chair of our Minnesota Lions Hearing Foundation, which includes an email from Dr. Jennifer Ward to all the Foundation Trustees to include in their District Newsletters.

"Hello Lions!

In January 2019, I came to the Lions Hearing Foundation asking for financial support to add an audiology booth in the Lions Children's Hearing & ENT Clinic. My memory of what happened, after I completed my presentation, is that it seemed like only seconds passed before there was a motion to approve my request. My emotions were many... it was a surreal moment; and I still get a little tearful when I think about that day.

About three months later, it was determined that the original bid for the booth project was significantly low and the generous donation from the Lions would not be enough. This was devastating news. Reducing equipment and office furniture would mean there would be a booth, but nothing inside it. Without additional financial support; the booth project would be no longer be viable. A second request was made to the Lions Hearing Foundation and again, I was humbled by the generosity of the Lions. Full funding of the booth project was approved. The excitement of growth was back in the air.

Fast forward to today, September 2019. Eight months has passed since that initial request. That seems like an eternity when you need another booth, however, I am finally able to say that construction will begin in the very near future! The gift you gave the Lions Children's Hearing & ENT Clinic for this booth project is truly a gift for children with hearing loss.

The greatest feeling in the world is when you love what you do and then you find a group of people that believe in, and encourage you, to do what you love. We know that you support many amazing projects and we are so grateful that this booth project resonated with you. We look forward to the end of construction and will welcome you to visit the clinic to see the booth that you made possible!

FERTILE LIONS





Dodge (pictured on the plaque). Leader Dogs for the Blind provides dogs and training for people who are blind or visually impaired.


