ST. HILAIRE, MN LIONS CLUB



Lion Kari Nelson, resident of St. Hilaire, MN and member of the St. Hilaire Lions Club, has been involved with Lions for over two decades. Like many people, she helped out with events because of family and friends before becoming an official member. Kari is a co-creator of the club's Smash and Bash Demo Derby and was instrumental in its running year after year. The Derby was a local event looked forward to by many and she helped the revenue more than double from four thousand dollars the first year to over nine thousand toward the end. After the derby was no longer viable due to the difficulty for participants to find cars, Lion Kari helped the club transition the event to the St. Hilaire Lions Redneck Round-A-Bout Island Baja Race. Kari marshals a crew of people to help run gate admission, registration, judging/record keeping, and security. This annual event is her favorite and the one of which she is most proud.

Lion Kari served as treasurer as soon as she joined and kept that position until a few years ago when she transitioned to her current role as member-at-large on the Board of Directors. She can be found helping out with just about every fundraiser and community event planned by the club. Kari chairs the annual Halloween Party committee and serves on many other planning committees throughout the year. She has been named Lion of the Year and just this past year received the Dream Catcher Award, an award particularly special to her because of her personal relationship with the Lions' focus on diabetes. Kari has sponsored many new Lions into the club through her efforts at getting more people involved with community events.



When asked what she wished more people knew about Lions, Kari responded, "It's all about community. All the money raised goes back into the community and even at the International level it is about helping the local clubs reach out into their community and making a difference. Not enough people know about all the things that the Lions do." If you don't see her at a Lions event, you can probably find Lion Kari on the pontoon at the lake in the summer or at bingo in St. Hilaire in the winter.

LIONS SPONSORSHIP COULD YIELD A FREE HOSPITALITY BOOKLET

ROBERT “BOB” BLOCK INTERNATIONAL DIRECTOR

Robert “Bob” Block, from MD 1, Illinois, USA was elected to serve as international director of Lions Clubs International at the association’s 102nd International Convention, held in Milan, Italy, July 5 through July 9, 2019.

Director Block has more than 48 years of experience as an architectural and design engineer and project manager.

He was encouraged to join by his father and became a Lion in 1974 with the Calumet City Lions Club where he followed in his father’s footsteps and became club president in 1980. He has held a number of other offices within the association including multiple district convention chairperson and member of the Centennial Action Committee. He served as Host Committee chairperson for the 2017 Centennial International Convention in Chicago.

Director Block also served as volunteer coordinator for the 50th anniversary Special Olympics Unified Cup in 2018 and was a moderator at the 2017 and 2018 USA/Canada Forums.

In recognition of his service, Director Block has received several International President’s Awards. Director Block is also a Progressive Melvin Jones Fellow.

In addition to his Lions activities, Director Block has been chairman of the Dyer Summerfest for more than 14 years as well as an active member of the Knights of Columbus. He was elected to the town council twice where he served as council president for two years.

Director Block and his wife, Brenda, also a Lion and Melvin Jones Fellow, have been married for 43 years and have three children and six grandchildren.



5M11 VIRTUAL CONVENTION GUEST SPEAKERS



Brooklyn Driver is a middle Tennessee native. Born in the year 2000 she celebrates her 20 years through thankfulness for Lions Club International.

When Brooklyn was only two years old, she was diagnosed with Myopia, which is nearsighted, and Retinitis Pigmentosa which is simply damaged retinas. Though her diagnosis was devastating, it came as no surprise to her family. Around 70% of Brooklyn’s Maternal family suffered from a variety of degenerative eye diseases and many having little to no vision at all.

Brooklyn was first screened by the local chapter of Lions Club at 18 months old through the program Project Kidsight. Brooklyn was referred to Lions Eye Center at Vanderbilt Eye Institute in Nashville, Tennessee where her lifelong journey would begin.

For ten years Brooklyn visited Lions Eye Center, sometimes up to 12 times a year. Her daily life included wearing eye patches, dilating, and hours of eye therapy. Throughout the years many of her doctors told her family that she would not be able to drive, play sports, or even function in a normal school or society.

At the age of 15, Brooklyn hit her first milestone when she earned her driving permit. “All the years of tears, fighting with my parents to wear my eyepatch, and the emotional wreck I had become had suddenly paid off.” - Brooklyn said. “It would have never been an option without the work that the Lions had done for me.”

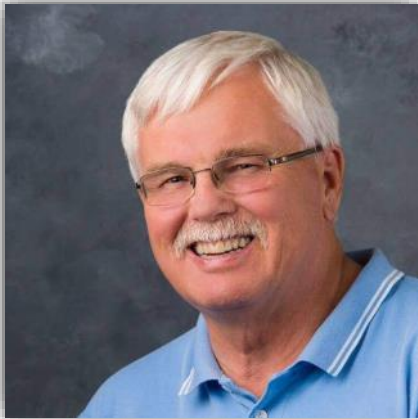
Brooklyn went on to play tennis and shoot trap, graduate high school, and is now a junior at Tennessee Technological University where she is majoring in Communication Studies with a focus in Public Relations. She is engaged to her significant other for almost five years and plans to get married in November of 2021.

Brooklyn said, “Thank you to the Lions and the selfless work you put in every day. Without your persistence and caring, I would never be where I am today. I owe all of my accomplishments to my amazing family as well as Lions all over the world.”

Local knitters are unsung heroes

Whether they are the technicians at Winnipeg Clinic or the dinner staff when we come home, essential workers have been everybody's heroes during this COVID-19 pandemic because they serve us while risking personal safety.

I can think of yet another kind of self-giving person — the knitters among us. They click away with their needles year after year for the needy, especially for newcomers who can't speak English and have not yet experienced Manitoba winters. Knitting groups regularly hold sales to help schools and charities such as Siloam Mission and René Deleurne Center.

Pat Dodd is one such knitter at Riverside Lions Estates in St. Vital, where the ladies knit scarves, socks, mitts, and toques for the needy. The establishment supplies the yarn and looks after the distribution of the knitted items to their selected charities.

During our interview Pat showed me a special toque she'd knitted. The stitches were flawlessly even, the pattern distinct, and the two-colour wool ends neatly worked in. A friend of hers said he's given his granddaughters Pat's toques because she makes unique ones with a hole in the back to

allow for ponytails.

He supplied the accompanying picture of Pat and remembered that she also made "sweaters, Harry Potter scarves, etc. for our immigrants and others in need."

Pat has also donated knitted items to the retired teachers/support staff luncheons, which she proudly attends, having served as an educational assistant in St. Vital schools for over 20 years. In that time she studied and graduated with Grade 12 students at Dakota Collegiate.

I would be remiss not to mention the giving that has been done by the knitting club at Dakota House.

Founded in 2009 by Vera Butterworth, with Betty Buckingham as secretary/treasurer, they met once a week while others knitted in their suites. Unheralded, they made sweaters, afghans, socks, toques, mitts, scarves, etc., and held sales twice a year. The articles left over were donated to schools, care homes, and Siloam Mission. Over the years they donated \$7,500 from these sales to six different charities, and if you added the articles donated after sales, the total worth would almost double. Remarkable.

As numbers of outside buyers decreased, the club disbanded last fall. But several knitters are still making toques and mitts for schools, and lap robes, shawls and slippers for senior's homes.

Betty had a final remark to offer:

"Many thanks to all the beautiful knitters in the past and those still knitting — they just don't know how to quit."

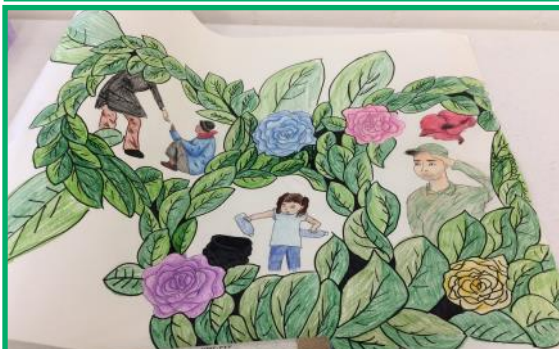

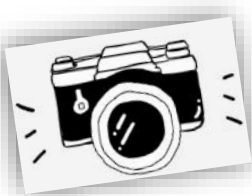


Photo Taking Tips

- ◆ Do not have bright lights on right behind the subject

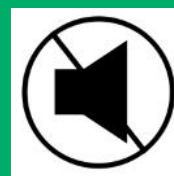

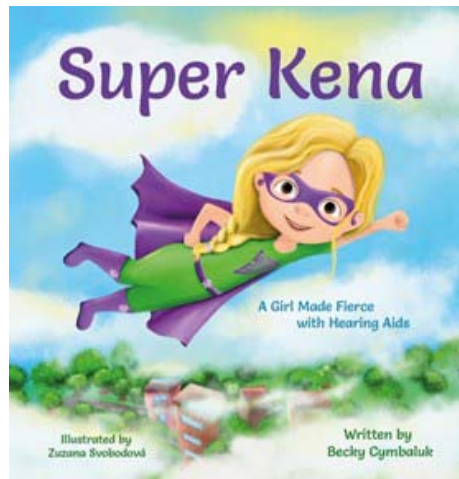

It's meant to empower children like Kena but also other differently-abled children who get teased and only want to fit in. The book touches on children with glasses, diabetes, who stutter, who have peanut allergies, with asthma and who are in wheelchairs. Tinnitus Study



The Hearing Foundation has supported research in this area, which we will be writing about in later newsletter posts. I know there are many Lions and others in our communities that have this problem.

"Thank you for your interest in participating in the Tinnitus Research Study with the Otology research team at the University of Minnesota! This is a research study to examine how tinnitus or 'ringing in the ears' affects brain signals, and how these brain signals can be used to help researchers develop better tools to diagnose people with tinnitus. A research coordinator from our research team will contact you in the near future and provide you with an online eligibility questionnaire, as part of the screening process.

If eligible, there will be a remote consent meeting and a total of three separate appointments: hearing test and neuropsychological questionnaires, magnetoencephalography (MEG) scan appointment, and a magnetic resonance imaging (MRI) scan appointment. The MEG machine works like a very sensitive microphone to detect the magnetic activity of brain cells (neurons). The MRI machine works like a camera to record the structure of your brain anatomy. There is no treatment or intervention in this study. There will be no direct benefit to the participant. Two of the appointments will take place on campus, and the MEG appointment will be in St. Paul at United Hospital. Participation in the study is voluntary. Eligible participants will be compensated for their time, and are paid based on completing the three appointments. Total compensation can be up to \$300.

Please note, to reduce the risk of COVID-19 transmission, participants are discouraged from bringing visitors to study visits. While on campus, research staff and participants will adhere to University policies and practice social distancing of six feet apart, hand hygiene, and will be required to wear masks at all study visits. We may have longer waiting times.

As openings become available, we will email you a link to our secure online eligibility questionnaire that you can complete at your convenience. Upon completion, you will receive a follow-up email regarding your eligibility with next steps."
