

MD5M Council of Governors Recap



MD5M Council of Governors Meeting, Saturday, October 15, 2016 By Cheri Appel, MD5M PR chair

The Council of Governors held their quarterly multiple meeting with all 12 District Governors present.

Past Council Chair Dave Dominick- Multiple GMT Chair presented recognitions for the first quarter of 2016-2017. Best Retention- District 5M10 -16; Most New Members- District 5M7 +66; 2 New Clubs Chartered-

5M3 and 5M5; District with positive memberships- 5M5 +24, 5M9 +20, 5M3 +17, 5M7 +13, 5M10 +9.

PCC Bert Nelson- LCIF Multiple Chair recognized 3 Districts with LCIF medals for contributions (bronze) 5M2, 5M6, and 5M7. Two districts placed in the top 5 in constitutional area #1- 5M6 and 5M8.

IPCC Kathy Jensen announced LEO of the Year to 5M2 Leo Mariah Grissom from the Northfield Lions.

Council Chair Todd Neumann presented International President Jitsuhiro Yamada Certificate of Appreciation to IPCC Kathy Jensen. Eight Districts received Centennial Legacy Banner patches: 5M1, 5M2, 5M5, 5M6, 5M7, 5M8, 5M9, and 5M11. It was announced that MD5M received an award at the USA/Canada Leadership Forum for having the highest number of attendees. CC Todd reminded us that anyone who has any proposal at the Council of Governors needs to have representation at the meeting.

PDG Steve Collins – MD5M Legal Chair stated in writing that he has a new email address for any club with legal questions, md5mlegal@gmail.com

A reminder from CC Todd that every district needs to have their Hall of Fame nominations in 30 days before your Mid Winter Conventions. Al Jensen nomination needs to be in to CC Todd before March 1. Peace Poster winners need to be to CC Todd by December 1

The Council of Governors is looking for bids for future Multiple Conventions. Bids need to be 2 years out so that the hope of an International President to attending would happen.

Ten out of 12 Districts were present to meet International President Bob Corlew when he visited Minnesota in October. IPID Mike Molenda reported that PID Haynes Townsend is running as a candidate for 3rd International Vice President and was endorsed by MD5M Council of Governors.

The Council of Governors endorsed an application for KidSight LCIF Grant Application submitted by IPDG Jay Norby.

MD5M Lions Hearing Foundation- PDG Linda Albrecht Norby thanked everyone who worked the State Fair booth. \$100 for 100 years campaign has kicked off with banks distributed throughout the Multiple. You have until June 15, 2017 to collect change.

The <u>Diabetes Foundation</u> calendars are closer to completion. PCC Judy Loken reported the last day to turn in money is October 31. GLT- PCC Earl Orvik- Northern Pride Lions Leadership Forum is in Mahnomen in November with the Regional Lions Leadership

Institute March 30-April 2, 2017. Only 72 spots are open for participation.

GMT- PCC Dave Dominick- in the Multiple last quarter we took in 459 new members and dropped 509 with a loss of 50.

<u>LCIF-</u> PCC Bert Nelson challenged every DG to have 100% participation in their district. For every district achieving this goal, PCC Bert will donate \$100 to LCIF.

<u>Lions Eye Bank of Canada & NW Ontario, Lions Foundation of Manitoba & NW Ontario and Lions Hearing Committee</u>- PDG Cheryl McKitrick- the Ben Ward Award has been withdrawn and a new award called the Decibel Award is now being used. The Board is developing a five year plan. A hearing aid loaner program is being developed in Manitoba.

MN Lions Vision Foundation- Lion Lyle Goff- \$100,000 was donated to Lions KidSight and MN Lions Eye surgery open and doctors are now doing cataract surgeries. We are looking to develop a Lions Eye Institute at the U of M. The building will cost between \$40-50 million dollars with naming rights for Lions to be about \$17.5 million giving us a 15 year time frame to acquire funding.

<u>Project New Hope-</u> PDG Dick Labraaten- Camp was just held at Ironwood Springs by Rochester. We are hoping to have 10 camps held in 2017.

<u>Public Relations-</u> Lion Cheri Appel- We are still in need of Public Relations Chairs in a couple Districts so please try to get those filled.

<u>2017 MD5M Convention</u>, Bemidji- Lion Wayne Tieman- Friday will be Celebration, Saturday will be Service and Sunday will be Generosity. Watch your newsletters for details.

First Timers at Convention

The term "First Timer" shall apply to any Lion, Lioness, or Leo member attending his or her first 5M-11 Mid Winter Convention. The purpose is to help newer members learn about Lions Club International and also encourage them to meet other Lions, Lioness, and Leos.

The First Timers Program will consist of a booklet with two parts. The first part of the program booklet involves written answers to questions about our Lions organization. The second part requires obtaining signatures of various past and present International, Multiple, and District Officers as outlined in the booklet. In addition, participants will be asked to get signatures from current Lions, Lioness, and Leo Club Presidents and Secretaries of all 5M-11 Clubs in attendance at the Mid-Winter Convention.

The booklet will be distributed at the registration table to those who have identified themselves at "First Times". An orientation meeting for all "First timers" will be held on Friday, February 3rd. Participants will have until 5p.m. Saturday to complete their booklets and turn them in for judging. The First Timers Program and judging will be under the direction of the 1st Vice District Governor.

Prizes for the first and second place winners will be awarded at the Sunday Brunch. The first place winner will receive a Hospitality Book and two nights lodging for the 2018 Mid-Winter Convention. The second place winner will receive a Hospitality book for the 2018 Mid-Winter Convention. The prizes are non-transferrable.

Cabinet Member Responsibilities

Sitting on the District 5M11 Cabinet includes the following responsibilities:

- Attending the 4 cabinet meetings per year (ITS ONLY FOUR PEOPLE!) (Everyone)
- Submitting a report for each of the cabinet meetings (Everyone)
- Finding out what your position entails and asking questions (Everyone)

Zone Chairs

- ♦ Setting up and running 2 to 3 meetings a year
- Staying in contact with all of your clubs
- Submitting reports or updates to the all necessary people and the Newsletter
- ♦ Keeping the district informed what your zone is up to
- ♦ Helping clubs in your zone if they need it

Program Chairs

Attend meeting for your program be it district
 or multiple district

- Submit written reports to meetings you attend and the Newsletter
- Offer to come to club or zone meetings to talk about your program
- Keep the district aware of what is happening with your program

All Cabinet members

- ♦ Submitting reports to the Newsletter
- Staying in contact with each other and possibly Multiple District
- Helping distribute the Newsletter to zone and club members
- ♦ Attending Officer Training
- All training that can be offered still needs to have personal involvement.
- If you can't do it, ask for help.

Qualifications for Office

Section 2: **DISTRICT GOVERNOR ELECTION PROCEDURES**. Any qualified member of a club in the district seeking the office of district governor shall file his/her intention to so run in writing with the Nominating Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the start of the convention, and furnish evidence of his/her compliance with the qualifications for said office set out in the International Constitution and By-Laws. The Nominating Committee shall place in nomination at the district convention the name(s) of all candidate(s) so qualified. If none are so received and/or so qualified, then, but then only, nominations for the office may be made from the floor. A candidate shall be allowed one nominating speech of no more than five (5) minutes duration, and one seconding speech of no more than three (3) minutes duration.

Section 3: **FIRST AND SECOND VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR ELECTION PROCEDURES**. Any member of a club in the district seeking the office of first or second vice district governor shall file his/her intention to so run in writing with the Nominating Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the start of the convention, and furnish evidence of his/her compliance with the qualifications for said office set out in the International Constitution and By-Laws. The Nominating Committee shall place in nomination at the district convention the names of all candidates so qualified. If none are so received and/or so qualified, then, but then only, nominations for the office may be made from the floor. Each candidate shall be allowed one nominating speech of no more than five (5) minutes duration, and one seconding speech of no more than three (3) minutes duration.

*From the Constitution and By-laws of Lions Club International

A candidate for the office of district governor shall:

- 1. Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or sub-district.
- 3. Currently be serving as the first vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected.

A candidate for the office of first vice district governor shall:

- 1. Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or subdistrict.
- 3. Currently be serving as the second vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected.

A candidate for the office of second vice district governor shall:

- 1. Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or subdistrict.
- 3. Have served or will have served at the time he/she takes office as second vice district governor:
- a. As president of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof, and a member of the board of directors of a Lions club for no less than two (2) additional years; and
- b. As zone chairperson or region chairperson or cabinet secretary and/or treasurer for a full term or major portion thereof.
- c. With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.



MD5M Hall of Fame Award

Purpose (October 2003)

To honor those Lion and Lioness members of character and substance who have demonstrated the highest level of commitment and dedication to the efforts of their club, district or multiple district and the motto of our association, "We Serve."

Award

There will be a maximum of one (1) recipient of the MD5M Hall of Fame Award per district, inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame each year. The award may be presented posthumously

Exception: During the 2003-04, 2004-05 and 2005-06 Lion years, each district will be allowed two (2) Hall of Fame recipients, at least one (1) of which must be honored posthumously. Following the 2005-06 Lion year, beginning in the 2006-07 Lion year, the number of Hall of Fame recipients per district will return to one (1) per district.

The MD5M Hall of Fame award recipients are to be inducted into the Hall of Fame at the annual MD5M Multiple District Convention during the Saturday noon luncheon. The first honorees will be inducted May 21-23, 2004 at the MD5M Multiple Convention.

MD5M Hall of Fame recipients will receive a MD5M Hall of Fame award plaque and a Hall of Fame lapel pin in recognition of their induction in the MD5M Hall of Fame. In addition, a complete listing of all MD5M Hall of Fame recipients will appear in the annual MD5M directory and a perpetual plaque, with the names of all inductees and the year of their induction inscribed thereon, will be kept in a prominent place in the MD5M office, when available.

The presentation of the MD5M Hall of Fame inductees will be the responsibility of the current International Director from MD5M, if there is one and he/she is in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention. If not, then the most recent Past International Director having served from MD5M in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

Criteria

A candidate may be a Lion or Lioness, must have been a member in good standing for at least 15 years, be at least two (2) years removed from the Council of Governors if a PDG, should have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavors, and he/she should be of good moral character and have a good reputation in his/her community. A nominee must be a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club in MD5M, or must have been a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club in MD5M at the time of their death.

Process

A candidate may be sponsored by any Lion, Lioness, Lions Club, Lioness Club, Zone, or District.

There will be a nomination fee of \$150.00 per each candidate nominated. The nomination fee will be returned to those sponsors whose candidates are not elected for induction into the MD5M Hall of Fame. The nomination fee for those selected for induction will be sent to MD5M and will be used to offset the cost of the award process, plaques and pin.

Nominations, including the nomination fee, must be received by the District Governor at least 30 days prior to the District's Mid-Winter Convention.

Each individual District will annually hold an election at their Mid-Winter Convention to determine the candidate(s), if any, to be inducted into the Hall of Fame for that Lion Year. Each sponsor will have an opportunity to give a brief presentation on the merits and biographical information of their nominee prior to the election. Those elected to be inducted into the MD5M

Hall of Fame will not be announced until their induction at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

All nominations will use the standard form, no others will be accepted. The nomination fee must be received at the time the application is received, otherwise the nomination will not be considered.

All successful candidates will be inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame at the next MD5M Multiple District Convention. The sponsor(s) and the respective District Governor will ensure that the honoree or a suitable representative be in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention when the honorees are inducted.

A brief biography of each inductee shall be announced to those in attendance during the induction ceremony at the annual MD5M Multiple District Convention.
