This is a good way to get more publicity and keep members more informed of their club activities.

GLT Coordinator Joanne Swanson is organizing the Zone Chair training for early September. All zone chairs need to attend this training as it will give you a good start on your year as a Zone Chair. I will be encouraging clubs to participate in the CEP process. CEP will give your clubs more insight and help for improving your club and club goals. The Moorhead Lions will be hosting the 2015 Midwinter Convention at the Shooting Star Casino in Moorhead on Jan 30th-Feb1. We are still looking for ideas for speakers for the Mid-Winter Convention.

Since registration and camper pick-up are the Sundays and Saturdays, we ask that you schedule a day during the week. The time at camp will include a tour of the camp facility, lunch with the campers and an opportunity to meet the medical staff, counselors and campers. We ask that you not show up without first contacting us as we need to know who is on-site for the safety of the campers and staff.

Participants are treated to free coffee and donuts before the walk, hot dogs and drinks after the walk, and are eligible for fabulous incentive prizes for pledges raised. There will also a special door prize. We have clowns for the kids, a fly-ball dog team performance, and fun contests for the whole family.

100% of the pledge money raised goes directly towards the training of Dog Guides. The cost of approximately \$20,000.00 is needed to train one dog to assist a physically impaired person. All other walk expenses are covered by the host clubs

To do this, the Foundation operates Dog Guides Canada, a pre-eminent national training school and charity that assists individuals with disabilities through specialized Dog Guide programs. These Dog Guides are provided at no cost to eligible Canadians from coast to coast despite costing \$25,000

Dog Guides are provided at no cost to qualified applicants. Thanks to national sponsors, 100% of the funds raised from the Walk go directly to the six Dog Guide training programs. Dog Guides Canada has already provided their specially trained Dog Guides to more than 2,000 men, women and children from ages 4 to 88, all without any government funding. With your help more people can experience the mobility, safety and independence a devoted Dog Guide brings.

Charlie and I will be participating in the Winnipeg Purina® Walk for Dog Guides on September 21, 2014 to help raise funds for the training and placement of Dog Guides for Canadians with visual, hearing and medical or physical disabilities. Lion Ernest Swanson Ernest Swanson, age 96, died on Thursday, July 3, 2014 at Pioneer Memorial Care Center in Erskine, MN, following a brief struggle with cancer. A funeral service was held July 8, 2014 at Faith Lutheran Church in Goodridge, MN with Reverend Bob Dahlen officiating. Burial will follow at the Goodridge Cemetery.

Ernest Leroy Swanson was born October 23, 1917 in Highlanding Township, MN on the Swanson family farm near Goodridge, MN. He was the son of John Nels and Anna (Lind) Swanson. He was baptized and confirmed at Goodridge First Lutheran Church, by Reverend Tungseth in 1930. He graduated from rural school District 38, Goodridge, MN, in 1931 and graduated from Goodridge High School in 1935. On November 29, 1939, Ernest was united in marriage to Lois Faye Jones. He took over the family farm in 1941, bought it in 1945 (second generation) and sold to third generation son, Alan in 1980. He was appointed Postmaster by President John F. Kennedy, at Goodridge in April of 1961. He retired in 1983, still residing on the family farm. He managed the Goodridge Retirement Homes from its organization in 1968 until 2003.

Ernie served on the Goodridge school board, giving each of his five children their high school diplomas. He served on the Board of Directors of Group Health Inc, later Mid-America Mutual, Ins., for some 30 years. He was President of the company for 3 years and Chairman of the Board for 16 years. He was a member of the National Association of Postmasters, serving as State President in 1965, a member of the Lions and organized the Goodridge Club in 1961, where he was President, Secretary and District Governor. In 1954, Ernie joined the Masons and was Master of the Thief River Falls Lodge in 1961, Grand High Priest of Minnesota Royal Arch Mason in 1985 and received his 60 year award in 2014.

He liked to travel, having visited all 50 states in the United States and traveled several foreign countries. Ernest enjoyed woodworking, bowling, cribbage, pinochle, farming, gardening, church, Masons, Lions and politics. Most of all he enjoyed his family.

Webinars are live, virtual trainings generally one hour long that are conducted online with a group of participants and instructors. Participants use the Internet to connect the group members with the instructors. Most webinars have one or two instructors and a moderator/host. Participants view a PowerPoint presentation and polling questions on their computer. They listen to the instructors either via their computer speakers or headset. The participants may use the phone for audio/speaking or a computer headset with a microphone to interact in discussions and respond to questions asked by the instructors, similar to training conducted in a classroom.

There are all kinds of webinars, but they are only available for short periods of time; usually repeated 2 or three times on different days and at different times to give you some options. You cannot participate without a registration and the registrations are limited; therefore it is a good idea to register early. Usually when all of the sessions are aired, participants are able to obtain recordings of the webinar to review.

Go For The Goal-Aug 6,13,15 Transform your club by going for the GOAL: Growth, Orientation, Activity, and Leadership. Especially good for club officers and Board members.

The <u>LCIF Standard grant</u> minimum and maximum request amounts have been updated. The new Standard grant minimum request amount for matching funds is US\$10,000 and the new maximum request amount for matching funds is US\$100,000. The Lions of 5M5 hosted Opening Eyes, a partnership program with Special Olympics, at the Summer Games in Stillwater with Lions from around the state coming to serve the athletes and provide them with an opportunity to see the world in a new light. LCIF provided a grant of \$19,550 to assist with this project. Some glasses were able to be cut onsite thanks to Donald Rosene, a sales consultant with Santinelli and the machine they had available. On Friday, June 27th, 400 pair of glasses were given, a record number in one day. With our team of Lions, sponsors, SOMN staff, optometrists, ophthalmologists, opticians, students, friends, kids and spouses, we shattered last year's record! 530 athletes were screened with 55 referred for care and 611 pairs of prescription glasses were provided. Thank you to everyone who helped make this possible.





27th Annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest



Sponsor a Lions International Peace Poster Contest and join clubs worldwide in sharing children's visions of peace with your community.

How the Contest Works

Only a Lions club can sponsor the contest in a local school or organized youth group. The contest is open to students 11-13 on November 15, 2014. Participating students are asked to create posters visually depicting the contest theme, "Peace, Love and Understanding."

One winner for each contest sponsored by a club is chosen to advance to the district governor for judging. On the district level, one winner is selected to go on to the multiple district competition and from there one winner is forwarded to International Headquarters for the final judging. Entries are judged at all levels on originality, artistic merit and portrayal of theme.

During the final judging, 23 merit award winners and one grand prize winner are chosen to represent the many entries submitted from around the world.

Awards

Artists of posters advancing to the final international judging are recognized as follows:

- International Grand Prize Winner receives a trip to an award ceremony where he/she will receive a cash award of US\$5,000 (or local equivalent) and an engraved plaque. Two family members (one being the winner's parent or legal guardian) and the sponsoring Lions club president or a club member (as designated by the club president) will accompany the winner to the award ceremony.
- 23 Merit Award Winners each receive a cash award of US\$500 (or local equivalent) and a certificate of achievement.
