

What we accomplish today, and what we accomplish in the future depends upon building and strengthening our membership. Survey after survey, and study after study have indicated people are volunteering now more than ever. But they have options for volunteering. Leadership Development does not happen by accident. We can strengthen our clubs by developing strong club leaders. Leadership Development starts with meaningful induction and a proper orientation. From there we assign our members to committees, where they are given a chance to grow into leaders. We should encourage that they become club officers and get the necessary training to be successful. As they move up the club leadership ladder they will develop new skills Every club should have a and expertise. leadership development plan that includes goals for new member orientation, mentoring, and participation in zone meetings and leadership training. By continually building the leadership ability of our club members we increase the pool of available leaders, which will reduce our need to recycle club officers. Successful club leaders are a good pool for district leadership positions, and above.


