



Most of the clubs are doing this with local community work by helping for example with recycling and refuse pick up, local library help, and community and senior clubs helping where required.



We stopped then for a 5 minute coffee/tea/cookie break before continuing. Lion Bea Barnard then gave us an update on the Canadian and Manitoba stats with regard to service dogs, how many teams have already been established, and how many are waiting for dogs to become available.

The chair then mentioned a number of items – The Club Health Assessment was passed around for all to read and ask questions if there were any. Your Club – Your Way was also mentioned as was the Club Excellence Process, the district newsletter, 'STRENGTHEN THE PRIDE', the Peace Poster and Project Pride, and member Orientation. There were some comments from various groups about what they are doing in these various areas.

#### **Providing** Treatment for River Blindness

River blindness is a parasitic infection that occurs through the bite of a black fly, and may lead to low vision or irreversible blindness, as well as disfiguring skin diseases. River blindness is endemic to Central, East and West Africa, parts of Latin America and the Middle Eastern country of Yemen.

A SightFirst grant of US\$384,298 was recently awarded to Cameroon's National Onchocerciasis Control Program. The grant will be used for continued river blindness treatment activities in the North, Far North and Adamaoua regions. More than 1.5 million Mectizan® treatments will be provided to impacted populations.

#### A Little Bit of Comfort

<mark>Sandy McKie & H</mark>earing Assist Dog Alea

One of Sandy McKie's favorite quotes is from Neale Donald Walsh, who states ... "life begins at the end of your comfort zone." Little did Sandy know that being diagnosed with degenerative adult onset hearing loss in both ears would make her live out of her comfort zone 24/7.

In the beginning, her life didn't change drastically. The hearing aids, amplified phone, and audio assistance devices she bought helped. She told family and friends, but not co-workers, about her condition and life went on.

However, through the years, each check-up revealed increased hearing loss, and everyday life became more difficult. Sandy, who works at a junior high school in Scandia, Minn., found herself relying on co-workers more and more to alert her to the bells, alarms, and announcements she could no longer hear.

"And at home, I wasn't doing much better." Sandy says. "I burned meals, had an oven fire—due to not hearing the timer—and was late for work because I couldn't hear the alarm."

After expressing her frustrations, her audiologist suggested applying for a Hearing Assist \_

Dog with Can Do Canines. Almost a year later, Sandy met Alea, a terrier-mix, adopted from the Animal Humane Society and trained by Can Do Canines. Sandy says that Alea has transformed her life in so many ways by alerting her to sounds both at work and at home.

"At home, Alea is able to alert me to alarms, timers and, because I live in a rural area, deer, crows and other critters," Sandy says "At work, she alerts me to bells, announcements and drills. I am confident that if any emergency situation should arise she will alert me to that as well."

When she's not working, Alea is like any other dog who loves to run outside, play and fetch. Sandy has begun having Alea pick up items such as keys when she drops them, because she can't hear the sound. As a result, Alea has begun to pick up everything for a reward. Sandy is hoping that housekeeping will be next!

Sandy says she is eternally grateful to Can Do Canines for this gift of an assistance dog. She no longer feels sad or anxious about her hearing loss.

"Yes, my life will continue to change as everyone's does," Sandy says. "But with Alea's help, she will push me past my comfort zone with confidence."

## **Revised Suspension Policy**

The Board of Directors amended the suspension policy that affects clubs that have not paid their club balances in a timely manner.

A Club which has an unpaid balance in excess of US\$20 per member or US\$1,000 per club, whichever is less, outstanding past 120 days will be automatically suspended including the charter, rights, privileges, and obligations of the Lions Club. In the event, the Club does not reach an active status by the 28<sup>th</sup> day of the month following suspension; their charter would be automatically cancelled.

Beginning July 1, 2015, clubs will automatically be placed on Financial Suspension if balances beyond **90** days are equal to or exceeding US\$20/ member or \$1,00or greater, and cancellation will occur after the 28<sup>th</sup> day of the month following suspension if full payment is not received. As a result, anticipated high suspension will be reported in October and April. Also, clubs cancelled more than twice will be ineligible for reactivation.

Suspension is the temporary deferment of the charter, rights, privileges and obligations of a Lions club due to an unpaid balance.

Clubs on suspension shall not:

- a) Conduct service activities
- b) Conduct fund raising activities;
- c) Participate in district and multiple district functions or seminars;
- d) Participate in any voting procedures outside of the club
- e) Endorse or nominate a candidate for district, multiple district and international office;
- f) Submit Monthly Membership Report and report forms;
- g) Sponsor a Lions club, or organize a Leo or a Lioness club.

Clubs on Suspension shall:

a)Hold meetings to discuss the future of the club and identify the steps needed to regain an active status.

b) Make Payments to clear the existing outstanding balance, or request a payment plan.

This amended policy has serious consequences for clubs that are in arrears in paying their club balances. To rectify this past due condition, clubs placed on suspension may regain an active status by paying the balance in review and update the membership roster after a Club is released from Suspension.
