

A Lion leader, whether it be a Club President or District Governor, is honest about the strengths and weaknesses of the organization which he serves. Also, leaders generally are people of vision, who are always looking for a better way to fulfill the purpose for which we exist.

Leadership is a tricky business when dealing with volunteers, as you try to build a club or district into the service organization that you envision. A leader must overcome the apathy which has seized some of our members. He must persistently encourage everyone to reach deep within their being to find ways to provide greater service to the community. Further, if we are to be realistic, a leader must lead in transforming a group of volunteers, with varying degrees of commitment and a multitude of ideas, into a team of community servants.

How is this done?

Leaders are visionaries. Leaders can see what the impact that can be made in a community, when we have more hands to serve, when we have more dedication to our purpose and when we have properly allocated resources.

- A leader must first help his club to see the possibility. Painting a picture of what success will look like with words, a leader explains where the road to success leads. Further, if necessary, the leader uses visual pictures to show the outcome of the proposed change.
- 2) Having lead the members in visualizing the goal and process to reach the objective, a leader allows his members to experience the feeling of emotions when the goal is reached. Additionally, a leader allows the club to work through some negative emotions which have paralyzed them to this point. Fear of the unknown, fear of failure, fear of rejection, and sometimes fear of success must be dealt with by each member of the group.
- When our members have seen the benefit of the projected outcome and dealt with any emotional barriers, they are ready to experience the change.

Having been trained in the process, Lions will approach any responsibility with a sense of pride.

4) After tasting success, having smelled the aroma of winning, club members take ownership and pride in the proposed change or action. Soon the learned behavior becomes a habit. Then the Lions Club members are ready to share the idea or concept with others.

A leader who uses this four step process leading toward change, will find that his/her followers gladly follow him/her.


Zones 7 and 9 Meeting Recap

Also briefly discussed was the "Peace Poster" and "Project Pride" as we discussed ways to become involved in the community with those two worthwhile projects. We will continue to discuss these two issues and see if we can't accomplish more involvement.


