Lions are Outstanding Seniors

When it comes to volunteer service, it could be said Polk County's Outstanding Senior Citi-zens do the Lions share – and much more. Jeannine Windels and Gerald "Jerry" Amiot, both of Crookston, are long-time Lions Club members and officers.

Polk County Committee on Aging Chairman David Bertils introduced the Outstanding Seniors at the Polk County Fair. **Jeannine Windels**, 76, was nominated by Allen Chesley, a member of the Committee on Aging.

"Jeannine finds great enjoyment in activities that recognize others for their achievements: Choosing scholarship recipients through the NW Minnesota Women's Fund and the Golden Link Lil Snyder Scholarship; honoring fellow Lions with Melvin Jones and Helen Keller awards and hosting receptions to honor 'Experienced Americans' from the area. She also enjoys encouraging young people through the UMC Campus Lions and the Crookston Leo Club," Chesley wrote.

"Jeannine exemplifies the Lions motto 'We Serve' in all aspects of her life," he added.

After retiring as president of the Crookston Area Chamber of Commerce in 2006, Windels continued to serve the area on the board of the Crookston Development Authority, the Minnesota Cold Weather Resource Center board and Riverland Association.

Windels has served on the Glenmore Foundation board (to provide financial support for Riverview Recovery Center, a program for the chemically dependent) since 2014, the Crookston Planning Commission since 2013, the NW Minnesota Women's Fund advisory committee since 2015 and the Trinity Women of the ELCA board since 2006. She has been Northwest Minnesota Synodical Wo-men's Organization conference coordinator since 2015.

A 25-year member of the Crookston Lions Club, Windels has been club secretary since 2006. She has chaired many projects. Recent examples include the 2012 district convention, the club's 75th anniversary celebration and the awards selection committee. Windels is the club's eyeglass recycling chairman, collecting, sorting and packing donated glasses, which she transports to a recycling pickup location in St. Cloud.

She served as Lions District 5M-11 governor from 2009 to 2010, visiting each of the 68 clubs in northwest Minnesota and Manitoba. Windels was instrumental in chartering the University of Minnesota Crookston Lions Club in 2010 and continues to serve as a mentor to the club.

In 2013, she was appointed to the Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation board of directors. In addition to attending board and committee meetings, Windels speaks to Lions clubs and community groups about the Vision Foundation and the Minnesota Lions Eye Bank, encouraging eye and tissue donations.

After age 65, Windels has received numerous awards including the NW Minnesota Foundation Ruth Edevold Award for Excellence in Leadership in 2004, Crookston Chamber Chairman's Award for Distinguished Service in 2006, Melvin Jones Fellowship in 2008, Hellen Keller Sight Award in 2010 and Lions International President's Leadership Award in 2012.

In 2014, Windels was inducted into the Lions Multiple District 5M Hall of fame for Minnesota, Manitoba and Northwest Ontario.

In an endorsement, Betty Arvidson, former finance director for the City of Crookston, wrote, "Jeannine has participated and held many leadership positions. But this does not define Jeannine. What inspires me the most is not how many committees she has been on or the positions that she has held but the reasons why. Jeannine is a true servant. She gracefully gives of her time and talent for the good of mankind. She is not looking for recognition and truly gives from the heart."

Windels and her husband, Harvey, live in Crookston. He worked for the University of Minnesota Crookston for many years.

28 — Anniversaries/State of the District **Gerald "Jerry" Amiot**, 74, was nominated by Allen Pederson of Crookston. (He was a county and state Outstanding Senior and serves on the Committee on Aging.)

"As the Polk County administrator for many years, he did outstanding work and since his retirement, he has participated in several areas promoting community affairs such as the Polk County Museum, Polk County Historical Society, the Lions Club and especially the Crookston Ox Cart Days festival," Pedersen wrote.

"He has shown leadership and volunteerism. Jerry is a very honorable and worthwhile candidate," Pedersen added.

Amiot is a longtime member of the Crookston Lions Club. He held offices of vice president and president. He was Lions District 5M-11 zone four chairman for two years.

Amiot has been president of the Polk Historical Society since 2011. This includes a variety of duties from conducting meetings and overseeing committees. He spends hours as a volunteer at the Polk County Museum. Amiot was instrumental in saving the former Carnegie Library and its on -going restoration.

He is treasurer/assistant festival coordinator and organizer for AFRAN (Association of the French of the North). He is instrumental in arranging for musicians, dancers and presenters at the annual Chautauqua and French-Canadian/Metis Festival at Old Crossing and Treaty Park.

Amiot has served on the Crookston Civic Music League board since 2011. The organization secures music and entrainment for five concerts per season.

In 2011, he was appointed to the Northwest Regional Development Commission, which provides disaster relief planning, economic development and various other benefits to the region.

For 10 years, Amiot was a member and volunteer with the Crookston Community Theater. He served as an ethics committee member for the 14th District Minnesota Bar Association for two years.

Amiot has received numerous awards after the age of 65, including Outstanding County Auditor of the Year for 2006, Experienced American Award in 2014 and Chamber of Commerce Chairman's Award for Outstanding Service for 2014.

In an endorsement, Crookston Mayor Gary Willhite wrote, "Jerry and I are long time members of the Lions Club and I must admit that Jerry lives our slogan 'We Serve." He has held every leadership role in our local club and also serves as zone chairman. He is truly committed to the many activities that the club provides and he is always one of the first persons to volunteer."

Willhite added, "Jerry has dedicated many hours to the Polk County Museum. . . The community is a proud home of a Carnegie Library. Although the community has built a new library, Jerry has worked to preserve this historic treasurer. The facility is a museum piece and used for many community events, well maintained and a work in progress."

Outstanding Senior Citizens

Each year the Polk County Committee on Aging accepts nominations for the Outstanding Senior. The nominees must be at least 70, and judging is based on their volunteer activities after age 65.

Polk County's Outstanding Senior Citizens will be invited to the Minnesota State Fair Seniors Day, Thursday, Sept. 1, at 10:30 a.m. at the Leinie Lodge Bandshell.

Out of a pool of nominees from each county in the state, two winners will be chosen for their outstanding commitment to community service since reaching the age of 65.

This event is sponsored by the Minnesota State Fair, the State Fair Foundation and the Federation of County Fairs.

Have You Filed Your Federal Tax Form (990-N) for 2016?

Most Minnesota Lions Clubs qualify to file Federal tax form 990N (less than \$50,000 per year in gross receipts). This has to be filed online, and for most clubs it must be filed before November 15 of this year (there are a few Lions Clubs that have a calendar year as their fiscal year and your club must file each year by May 15).

To file, the easiest way to do it is to go to the following website: https://www.irs.gov/charities-non-profits/annual-electronic-filing-requirement-for-small-exempt-organizations-form-990-n-e-postcard

Once you are at the site, you need to have the following: NEW this year you have to register on the IRS website.

Completing the e-Postcard requires the eight items listed below:

- 1. Employer identification number (EIN), also known as a Taxpayer Identification Number (TIM). Your secretary should have this, or you can get it for your club on the LCI website, www.mylci.org. then pull up your club, it will have the number listed. This is a nine digit number.
- 2. Tax year Use July 1, 2015 to June 30, 2016.
- 3. Legal name and mailing address
- 4. Any other names the organization uses
- 5. Name and address of a principal officer
- 6. Web site address if the organization has one
- 7. Confirmation that the organization's annual gross receipts are \$50,000 or less
- 8. If applicable, a statement that the organization has terminated or is terminating (going out of business)

You MUST complete this every year. If you miss for 3 year, your club loses its tax exempt status and you must pay a \$400 rein statement fee to get re-registered (or more, if you have more than \$10,000 in donations made by the club, per year). Avoid the pain, make sure that this is done at the latest by November 15 of each year, but do it early in case there is some glitch that needs to be dealt with.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR ANNUAL CORPORATE FILING WITH THE MINNESOTA SECRETARY OF STATE

This needs to be done by all of the Minnesota clubs and districts by December 31 of each year.

The instructions for the annual filing for Minnesota Secretary of State for corporate status are as follows:

- 1. On the internet, enter https://online.sos.state.mn.us/abr/corp_annual_filing.asp
- 2. Enter entity File # that you received with the notice from the Secretary of State's office, and the entity type (NP Non-Profit corporation) using the select button.
- 3. If entered correctly, click "continue"
- 4. Fill in the required information (President's name and address)
- 5. Click Submit Registration; click OK

And you are good for another year!

MD5M First Council of Governors Meeting

The MD5M Council of Governors met in St. Cloud MN on Saturday, July 23, 2016 at the Kelly Inn. The Council consists of all 12 District Governors along with the Council Chair Lion Todd Neumann. The Council meets 4 times a year to review MD5M Lions business. This was the first meeting of the Council since they took office at Fukuora Japan on June 27th. One District Governor from 5M8 Lion Judy Hoofnagle was unable to attend the Lions Club International Convention so a small ceremony was held for Lion Judy to install her as District Governor for 5M8.



International Director Bruce Beck (2016-2018) reported that 37,000 Lions attended

the International Convention. ID Bruce will serve on the Constitution/Bylaws Committee for Lions Clubs International. The new officers for LCI are: International President Robert "Bob" E. Corlew from Milton Tennessee; First Vice President Naresh Aggarwal from Delhi India; Second Vice President Gudrun Bjort Yngvadottir from Gardabaer Iceland; Third Vice President Jung-Yul from Busan City Republic of Korea.

The meeting started with the passing of the gavel from Past Council Chair Kathy Jensen to Council Chair Todd Neumann. It was announced that PDG Bill & PDG Donna Mae Landwehr from 5M8 have established 9 new lions clubs in our Multiple this past year. This year they have started 2 new clubs in the Multiple. CC Todd informed us that IP Bob Corlew's is asking us to foster peace throughout the world so CC Todd is asking each District to host a Community Peace Project.

We now have 21,523 Lions in MD5M as of June 30, 2016 stated MD5M Global Membership Chair PDG David Dominick. Awards were given to Districts for: Member Retention- 5M3; Women Net Gain-5M5; Most Women- 5M10 40%; Out of Transition- 5M10 & 5M3; Highest Plus in Membership- 5M10; Most New Members- 5M9 with 286; New Club Award- 2 new clubs 5M4 & 5M9; 1 new club- 5M11, 5M1, 5M5, 5M8, 5M10; Best Year in Membership- 5M10.

The District Governors voted to continue with assisting the Oral Health Initiative. They received information from 5M3 PDG Dan Snobl and Cris Gilb, Director for Health & Human Services in 6 counties in SW MN. Pediatricians/General Practitioners have started working with this organization in doing baby checks for dental problems and referring the child to Dentists for cavies care. The biggest problem is many DDS refuse to treat young children especially those on medical assistance. In Southwest Minnesota there are 26 DDS with only 3 who will take medical assistance patients. Children should visit the dentist for the first time by the age of 1. A mouthful of decay can cause death. We need to prevent cavities.

Vision Honduras was presented by PDG Orville Trettin Letter who asked for support to send volunteers to Honduras in January. It costs a volunteer \$600 trip expense along with \$750 living expense while working in Honduras. This will be their 9th trip with over 10,000 pairs of eye glasses and sunglasses being given away. They are in need of volunteers and donations. Since this is not an MD5M project, it was approved for District Lions to help out.

Sending a Marching Band to the International Convention Parade in Chicago was discussed by PDG Keith Johnson. He has 2 bands who maybe going. Financial costs were discussed. We have money in our Parade fund to send both bands for the 100th Anniversary Celebration. It was voted in favor to send both bands, using 1 band for another country who will pay to have a band march with them. A short discussion was then held on the 2018 International Convention Parade in Las Vegas Neva

The Centennial Committee is receiving money from LCI with matching funds from the MD5M Multiple. This money will be used at the Mall of America on Saturday, June 3 in the afternoon for a Lions Celebration for Lions 100th Anniversary. Everyone is asked to attend this event.

A visit from the International Youth Exchange delegation invited the Council of Governors and guests to their International Supper. A dish is made by each student from their home country and shared with everyone in attendance. Twenty eight youth from 16 different countries were visiting Minnesota and participating in Camp Spicer.

Lions Minnesota Hearing Foundation reported that \$118,000 was raised so far for the D-Feat Hearing Loss with \$132,000 total pledged. A new fundraiser is coming out to each club to update the busy University of Minnesota facility with state of art equipment. "\$100 for 100 years" is a campaign where each Lions club will receive a box to donate to this event.

We will not be receiving MD5M Directory disks this year. A PDF version of the directory will be available via email so a hard copy of Districts, Clubs and Presidents/Secretaries will be available but there will be no directory available to access all Lions members in MD5M. Please do not share the information in these directories for they are not to be used for solicitation.

The Minnesota Lions Vision Foundation is hosting their annual Minnesota State Fair booth. New equipment for the first eye surgery suite is being installed at the U of M with hope for 4 or more in the near future. There will be a name change coming in the near

future because our area now extends beyond Minnesota. There are 1,165 Helen Keller Awards available. If your club is one of the clubs with an award available (check with your District Chair on this) please consider awarding this to someone in your club or community.

The GMT's theme for the year is "Invite for Impact" which involves 3 steps: Chartering, Retaining, Recruiting. "Grow more to serve more".

LCIF- MD5M is number 2 in donations to LCIF in the United States, California being in first place. Club participation in MD5M was at 87%. For every district that has 100% participation in donating to LCIF in 2016-2017 Multiple Chair Lion Bert Nelson will donate \$100.00.

KidSight approached MLVF with a request for \$100,000 in their effort to purchase eye screeners of pre-school children in all districts of MD5M. MLVF agreed to help them once they present MLVF a written grant request, get a tax ID, have a bank account and become 501(c)3 qualified.

Leader Dogs for the Blind made their goal of \$14.5 million to build kennels. A bus trip in the spring from MD5M is being planned to travel to Rochester Michigan to tour the new facility. Eighty six people were trained in white cane use which is the first step in being considered in receiving a dog.

MN Lions Diabetes Foundation is planning a tour of their Research building on April 8, 2017. A new website will coming that will list upcoming events.

The upcoming Multiple Convention for April 21-23, 2017 in Bemidji already has 155 Lions pre-registered. Cost is \$110.00 until March 1.

The Winnipeg Host Committee announced a calendar fund raiser for their convention in 2018. Each district is asked to sell 166 calendars (3 calendars per club) to help with expenses. This calendar will be an 18 month calendar.

Special Olympics completed their "Opening Eyes" in June. They screened 459 athletes, gave out 460 pairs of sports glasses using monies from an LCIF grant


