

Qualifications for Office

Section 2: **DISTRICT GOVERNOR ELECTION PROCEDURES**. Any qualified member of a club in the district seeking the office of district governor shall file his/her intention to so run in writing with the Nominating Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the start of the convention, and furnish evidence of his/her compliance with the qualifications for said office set out in the International Constitution and By-Laws. The Nominating Committee shall place in nomination at the district convention the name(s) of all candidate(s) so qualified. If none are so received and/or so qualified, then, but then only, nominations for the office may be made from the floor. A candidate shall be allowed one nominating speech of no more than five (5) minutes duration, and one seconding speech of no more than three (3) minutes duration.

Section 3: FIRST AND SECOND VICE DISTRICT GOVERNOR ELECTION PROCEDURES. Any member of a club in the district seeking the office of first or second vice district governor shall file his/her intention to so run in writing with the Nominating Committee at least thirty (30) days prior to the start of the convention, and furnish evidence of his/her compliance with the qualifications for said office set out in the International Constitution and By-Laws. The Nominating Committee shall place in nomination at the district convention the names of all candidates so qualified. If none are so received and/or so qualified, then, but then only, nominations for the office may be made from the floor. Each candidate shall be allowed one nominating speech of no more than five (5) minutes duration, and one seconding speech of no more than three (3) minutes duration.

*From the Constitution and By-laws of Lions Club International

A candidate for the office of district governor shall:

- 1. Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or sub-district.
- 3. Currently be serving as the first vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected.

A candidate for the office of first vice district governor shall:

- 1. Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or subdistrict.
- 3. Currently be serving as the second vice district governor within the district from which he/she is to be elected.

A candidate for the office of second vice district governor shall:

- 1. Be an active member in good standing of a chartered Lions club in good standing in his/her single or sub-district.
- 2. Secure the endorsement of his/her club or a majority of the clubs in his/her single or subdistrict.
- 3. Have served or will have served at the time he/she takes office as second vice district governor:
- a. As president of a Lions club for a full term or major portion thereof, and a member of the board of directors of a Lions club for no less than two (2) additional years; and
- b. As zone chairperson or region chairperson or cabinet secretary and/or treasurer for a full term or major portion thereof.
- c. With none of the above being accomplished concurrently.

Winger Lions Little Free Library

Winger Lions Club has taken on an exciting new Service Project.

Little Free Libraries are springing up all over America. Most have been quite successful. The theory is for these libraries to be self sustaining, but it doesn't always work quite that way. The theory is simple: Take a Book – Leave a Book.

The Winger Lions did some fairly extensive research to find out what worked and what didn't work in other areas. The two biggest problems seemed to be vandalism and weather. Most of these Little Free Libraries are set up outdoors, and consist of a box with a door on the front, filled with 20 or 25 books, depending on the size of the box. Moisture is a book's worst enemy, and the Lions were concerned about how one of these boxes would stand a Minnesota winter. The vandalism issue is of concern too, especially in a small town where there is little, if any traffic on the streets late at night.

Service and maintenance were also discussed at some length. If we're going to associate the name of the Winger Lions with a project of this nature, it would be imperative to keep the stock neat and up to date. Lions members will be responsible for upkeep and restocking.

We chose to proceed with the project, but with a couple variations from the norm. We chose to locate the libraries inside a business within the community, and to use a bookshelf arrangement rather than a box. This potentially solves all three of the most obvious problems, and gives some other advantages besides. Weather and vandalism would not be a concern, and the shelf arrangement would allow us to put in a larger stock of books, and greater variety.

It was decided to locate these libraries in small towns in our area that do not have a public library, thus providing some good quality reading material to those who don't have ready access to a public library. Here's the way it works: We set up a small table, like a computer table, and place a three bookshelf unit on the table. This gets the books up to eye level, so elderly people don't have to stoop down to

the floor to look for a book. No check out or return of books is required. The concept of Take a Book — Leave a Book will make the library somewhat self sustaining, but we want to emphasize that people are welcome to take a book without leaving a book, and if they don't get up town real often, they may take more than one book at a time. We have a very large store of books (Thousands) with which to replenish our stock, so we won't run short.

We looked for businesses that were frequented by a majority of the citizens of the community, and were open every day. We had no problem finding businesses that were more than willing to host a library site. Plans for the Winger Lions is to start with libraries in Bejou, Winger and Erskine, and then possibly spread out to other area communities that may be interested.

We set up our first Little Free Library at the Cenex Convenience Store and Café in Bejou. We filled the shelves with a good variety of quality books (No piles of rummage sale junk). The shelf unit we used holds about 75 books.

Any Club wishing to pursue such a project is welcome to contact Winger Lions for help with starting stock and ideas. The signage is on 11 x 17 stock and is laminated – Lion Dick Roue will make these for other clubs if they need them.

CancerCare Indiadive

Mike Janssen, chair, has had meetings with The Lions Foundation of Man. & NW Ontario as well as with Cancer groups in Manitoba. 50% of whatever the Initiative generates in funds will be given to the foundation's M.A.P. to be used to aid recipients dealing with cancer. The other 50% will go to other cancer entities to assist in their program costs and equipment purchases etc.

We are currently looking at holding a raffle on a \$500 quilt, a \$200 afghan, and a Lions Logo side table. The plan is to draw the winners at the Mid Winter Convention. As well we will be selling LIONS Mints to assist in the fundraising. A celebrity head shave is also in the works and who knows may even show up at the Mid Winter Convention and who know who could find themselves bald.



We will also be an advisement body to the clubs on all matters dealing with cancer questions. If we don't have the answer we will get it "from reliable sources". We will not answer medical treatment questions or requests but will put individuals in contact with the appropriate professionals. We have already advised one of our clubs dealing with issues arising from a cancer aid request and helped them resolve the concerns they had surrounding this request.
