while losing 1 bringing us to 1960 this month which is -1.


For the year, we have added 124 members and dropped 93 for a +31.

Lions' donation means more eBooks for students

Students at West St. Paul have a lot more eBooks to read in 2014, thanks to the generosity of the West St. Paul Lions Club.

The Lions Club recent donated \$858 to the school to buy a collection of eBooks, and one iPad that can be used to read the books.

Seven Oaks School Division library tech Alice Klumper said the donation is important because the world continues to become more and more digital, and more kids are reading books in electronic formats.

"There is definitely a buzz around eBooks, and I think they are using."

them more so at home than at school," said Klumper. "It's all about accessibility, and this way you can access the school's library whether you are at school, or at home in bed."

eBooks purchased by the school are put onto a cloud server and anyone in the division can access them, and Klumper said she continues to be amazed by the way young students are grasping today's technology.

"I just showed some of them the shelf and they have already figured out that you can choose books by age or reading level. They already know how to do a bunch of stuff, and I didn't show them any of that.

"These days kids are born digital."

With the donation the school was able to purchase 16 new eBooks.

"This is huge for us an that might not sound like a huge amount, but it is huge because of that accessibility," said Klumper.

With the purchase of the new iPad the school now has eight of the devices in total.

West St. Paul school vice principal David Ingram said he appreciates the donations from the West St. Paul Lions Club.

"We do have a great relationship with the," said Ingram. "They have had their monthly meetings here in the past and we are very much a community school, and we all work together. It was a very pleasant surprise."

Funding Request Guidelines

Cost Share with Lions Eye Bank & Lions Foundation

With the increased demand for funding assistance throughout all communities, we believe it is important to share pertinent guidelines to assist all clubs with their decision making.

As a registered charitable organization we are required to establish and follow policies and procedures to maintain our legal charitable status with the Government and Revenue Canada.

The Lions Eye Bank and Lions Foundation act upon the direction of the Club. We believe the Club has done due diligence regarding the status of an applicant and its worthiness. In the event the Club declines the request, we are unable to honor the request on our own.

We strive to ease the burden experienced by clubs assisting families in need and we accomplish that by cost sharing.

The procedure for working with the Lions Eye Bank and Lions Foundation is to submit the completed application along with the club's contribution. Our guidelines indicate a Revenue Canada Statement of Assessment is necessary. This is certainly true in larger centres, however, we understand that in smaller communities, that requirement is not necessarily applicable. That is why we depend on the club for their input and assessment of the situation. In turn, we create a file and then administer the paying of expenses based on submitted receipts. The individual and the club receive a record of each transaction for their records.

It is not a wise choice to advance the family funds and then request assistance from the Lions Eye Bank and Lions Foundation because that does not allow for the clear paper trail that is so necessary.

We need to follow this format because we are audited and as a charity we must be able to prove how those funds have been utilized.

Should the contributing funds not be totally spent, it is the club's choice to request the funds be held in trust for the next applicant and or left in general revenue. As always, we act on the request of the club. There is always extenuating circumstance and it is in those cases that the request for a refund will be directed to the Executive Committee for clarification.

Should the request for assistance require substantial funds, very often the club will solicit community help. We are only able to match funds donated by the initiating club (reasonably we could not afford to match all funding).

We have the ability to issue tax receipts, however, those donations must be sent to either the Lions Eye Bank or Lions Foundation. Our additional obligation is to administer those funds, issue tax receipts and all necessary correspondence.

Always feel free to contact us at anytime. We look forward to working together.

cause.


