The Thief River Falls Lions Club hosted a celebration dinner in Thief River Falls on October 1st, marking the 75th anniversary of the club, which was originally chartered in 1938. Lions Club members and their guests gathered at the Eagles Club dining room that

evening to celebrate the club's anniversary. More than 100 were in attendance. Mike Molenda, International Lions Director, was the guest speaker for the anniversary event, and remarks were also provided by Mayor Jim Dagg and Crookston Lions Club President Gerald Amiot. In addition, representatives from a variety of District Lions Clubs were in attendance. The Thief River Falls Lions Club presently has 68 members and meets Wednesdays at noon at the American Legion Club for its weekly meeting, which consists of a meal, a short business meeting, and a program consisting of various speakers from the community providing updates on local programs, organizations and activities. The TRF Lions Club raises funds for a variety of good causes including the maintenance of

Lions Park in Thief River Falls. In the past year the Lions Club constructed a new restroom facility and Lion drinking fountain at the park. The club has hosted a fishing tournament in Thief River Falls each August for the past 8 years, which has become its annual signature fundraising event to support Lions Park. Other service projects including ditch cleaning, meals on wheels, and the annual Lions Halloween Party for local children are regularly facilitated by the club's members. 

Dare to be Excellent

Lions clubs around the world are being energized by participating in the Club Excellence Process (CEP) offered by Lions Clubs International. It works because club members decide what the qualities of an excellent club are, determine how their club reflects those qualities by looking at themselves from within and from without, decide how their club could improve, and plan what they will do to achieve that improvement. Since each club determines its own model of an excellent club, decides what it wants to do to be even better and decides what it will do to achieve that level of improvement it is a completely individualized program.

This is a four-step process where club members first discuss what their club has accomplished in the community, what they determine to be the needs of the community, what the characteristics of an excellent club are, ask what the stumbling blocks that prevent their club from achieving excellence, and discuss how to improve their club's effectiveness.

At that point club members, hopefully all, complete the "How are your Ratings?" survey which lets you see the club through members' eyes – what is going well and what needs some attention.

For an external assessment, CEP uses the "Community Needs Assessment" which

- Tells clubs what kinds of volunteer services your community needs.
- Which Projects and programs are important to the people in your area.
- Whether your club's current service projects are still needed by the community
- If other organizations in your area are providing similar service.

After responses to these two surveys have been reviewed it is time for club members to determine what needs to be done to improve the excellence of their club. Then they select 2-4 goals for their club to work on and create an action plan that will accomplish these goals within a certain time limit. You are encouraged to select SMART (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Reasonable, and Time Bound) GOALS that can be accomplished in no more than 4 months.

Because the Club Excellence Process (CEP) helps clubs become more effective in service, communication, leadership and membership satisfaction, it is strongly recommended that each and every Lions Club participate in one of the two formats now being offered:

- **CEP Pro** is a facilitator-led workshop. It is designed for clubs that would like to have a trained Lion facilitator come in and guide members through the workshop.
- CEP Lite is a self-guided workshop. It is designed for clubs that would prefer to have a member of their own club lead

the workshop.

On October 18, 2013 twelve 5M11 Lions were trained to be CEP Facilitators so we are ready to help you. You will need to register with LCI, and get necessary materials to conduct the workshop.

Special Skills (bright yellow harness)—for people with a medical or physical disability

Seizure Response (black leather SSD with blue patch harness)—for people with epilepsy

Autism Assistance (maroon harness)—for children with autism spectrum disorder

Diabetic Alert (red harness)—NEW! Assist people 10 or older with type 1 diabetes with hypoglycemic unawareness

Lions Club of Winnipeg update

The Lions Club of Winnipeg has just concluded our 5th Annual 100 Hole Golf Marathon. Our total revenue this year was in excess of \$14,000 and over the past 5 years our cumulated total would exceed \$75,000. The first 3 years the profits were divided between the Canadian National Institute for the Blind and the Lions Eye Bank, The last 2 years have been devoted to the Lions Eye Bank, and the new Lions Children's Hearing Screening program.

We also continue to support the #6 Jim Whitecross Air Cadet Squadron, and have done so since about 1938. There are currently between 100 and 120 young male and female cadets enrolled in this worthwhile program. They are between the ages of 12 and 18, and among other things they



learn to be good citizens, while learning discipline, first aid, map-reading skills, and airmanship such as obtaining a pilot's licence, as well as a strong music program providing band instruction.

Our major focus right now is fund-raising by selling Grey Cup tickets and jars of honey. Lion Bud Wilk is in his glory when he has tickets and other things to sell. He is a master salesman, and we are fortunate to have him as a member of our club.

MD5M Hall of Fame Award

Purpose (October 2003)

To honor those Lion and Lioness members of character and substance who have demonstrated the highest level of commitment and dedication to the efforts of their club, district or multiple district and the motto of our association, "We Serve."

Award

There will be a maximum of one (1) recipient of the MD5M Hall of Fame Award per district, inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame each year. The award may be presented posthumously

Exception: During the 2003-04, 2004-05 and 2005-06 Lion years, each district will be allowed two (2) Hall of Fame recipients, at least one (1) of which must be honored posthumously. Following the 2005-06 Lion year, beginning in the 2006-07 Lion year, the number of Hall of Fame recipients per district will return to one (1) per district.

The MD5M Hall of Fame award recipients are to be inducted into the Hall of Fame at the annual MD5M Multiple District Convention during the Saturday noon luncheon. The first honorees will be inducted May 21-23, 2004 at the MD5M Multiple Convention.

MD5M Hall of Fame recipients will receive a MD5M Hall of Fame award plaque and a Hall of Fame lapel pin in recognition of their induction in the MD5M Hall of Fame. In addition, a complete listing of all MD5M Hall of Fame recipients will appear in the annual MD5M directory and a perpetual plaque, with the names of all inductees and the year of their induction inscribed thereon, will be kept in a prominent place in the MD5M office, when available.

The presentation of the MD5M Hall of Fame inductees will be the responsibility of the current International Director from MD5M, if there is one and he/she is in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention. If not, then the most recent Past International Director having served from MD5M in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

Criteria

A candidate may be a Lion or Lioness, must have been a member in good standing for at least 15 years, be at least two (2) years removed from the Council of Governors if a PDG, should have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavors, and he/she should be of good moral character and have a good reputation in his/her community. A nominee must be a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club in MD5M, or must have been a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club in MD5M at the time of their death.

Process

A candidate may be sponsored by any Lion, Lioness, Lions Club, Lioness Club, Zone, or District.

There will be a nomination fee of \$150.00 per each candidate nominated. The nomination fee will be returned to those sponsors whose candidates are not elected for induction into the MD5M Hall of Fame. The nomination fee for those selected for induction will be sent to MD5M and will be used to offset the cost of the award process, plaques and pin.

Nominations, including the nomination fee, must be received by the District Governor at least 30 days prior to the District's Mid-Winter Convention.

Each individual District will annually hold an election at their Mid-Winter Convention to determine the candidate(s), if any, to be inducted into the Hall of Fame for that Lion Year. Each sponsor will have an opportunity to give a brief presentation on the merits and biographical information of their nominee prior to the election. Those elected to be inducted into the MD5M

Hall of Fame will not be announced until their induction at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

All nominations will use the standard form, no others will be accepted. The nomination fee must be received at the time the application is received, otherwise the nomination will not be considered.

All successful candidates will be inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame at the next MD5M Multiple District Convention. The sponsor(s) and the respective District Governor will ensure that the honoree or a suitable representative be in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention when the honorees are inducted.

A brief biography of each inductee shall be announced to those in attendance during the induction ceremony at the annual MD5M Multiple District Convention.
