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**About STARS** 

**STARS** (Shock Trauma Rescue Service) provides rapid. airborne and intensive care for critically ill and injured patients in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, Alberta and Eastern British Columbia. Currently averaging four missions per day, STARS responds when patients need us most, often landing in remote and challenging locations. Having begun flying permanently in Manitoba in 2011, STARS has flown over 500 missions to date. The CEO Island Rescue gives our supporters a real taste of the remote areas of the province as they are dropped off by a helicopter and challenged to reach a goal that will ensure their rescue.



#### The Challenge

STARS is recruiting up to 10 influential members of the business community for CEO Island Rescue, an event where participants are dropped by helicopter in a remote island location with only their smart phones to help them. By calling friends and colleagues for support, participants will race one another to raise \$100,000 in donations for STARS. Once players accomplish their goal, they will be 'rescued' by helicopter and delivered to a post event party and media event.


### **Fellow Lions:**



## Walk for Dog Guides

On Sunday, May 26<sup>th</sup>, about 150 people gathered at the park in Ste. Anne to enjoy the day and "Walk for Dog Guides". This is an annual event held across Canada in support of

> the "Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guide School.





Participants were able to gather monetary pledges either in person or on-line and then come to the park to both exercise themselves and their dogs as well as support the cause. There were 2 different areas to walk in and the distances were anywhere from 1 km. to 2.5 km. The variety of breeds of dogs big and small represented was incredible. Many walkers did not have dogs accompanying them but that did not dampen their enthusiasm in the slightest.

Local Dog Guide recipient Shianne and her partner Navy were in attendance. According to her mother Annette, Shianne was diagnosed with Hypermobility Syndrome and Hypotonia at an early age. Since Navy has been in her life, the family has noticed a great difference.

"We've seen Shianne become more independent and she does a lot more on her

own now. Navy is there to pick up

things that drop on the floor and help in many ways to make it easier in her day-to-day life" explained Annette.

Shianne and Navy led the walk again this year as about 100 dogs and humans made their way around town. Strollers were pushed, children toddled, bikes were ridden, and others young and old walked to show their support for Dog Guides.

This is the second year, the Steinbach and Area Lions Club organized the walk in Ste. Anne and they also provided free hot dogs and drinks to everybody who showed up.

New this year was a performance by the "Wild Dog Sports Team" from Winnipeg. They are a group of people who rescue dogs from shelters and then train them in agility and acrobatics. The show they put on was very entertaining with quite a few exciting moments as races were held and tricks performed. It is amazing how fast some of these dogs are and how high, even the smallest of them can jump.



## Lions Club International Dues Increase

### From Lions Clubs International

Dues increase:

A resolution to increase international dues to be phased in over two years was voted on and approved by the membership at the Lions Clubs International Convention in 2011. The second half of the dues increase will be effective July 1, 2013.

Dues will be billed as follows: MEMBERSHIP DUES.

- (a) Semi-annual membership dues of twenty-one dollars and fifty cents (US \$21.50) denominated in U.S. dollars shall be levied on each member during the 2013-14 term, beginning July 1, 2013.
- (b) For family membership programs as adopted by the International Board of Directors, the following dues shall apply:
- (1) The first family member, Head of Household, shall pay semi-annual membership dues as provided in sub-section (a).
- (2) Subsequent qualifying family members, not to exceed four additional qualifying members per household, shall pay semi-annual membership dues equal to one-half (1/2) of the total amount paid by the first family member as described in subsection (c)(1).
- (3) For student membership programs as adopted by the International Board of Directors, eligible student members shall pay semi-annual membership dues equal to one-half (1/2) of the total amount of dues as provided in sub-section (a).

International dues do not include district or state dues. Semi-annual dues are billed as follows: July - December and January - June.



## Introducing Diabetic Alert Dog Guides



Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides is constantly striving to find new ways to improve its service to Canadians with disabilities. After thorough research and careful consideration, the sixth Dog Guide program has been chosen: Diabetic Alert.

Over the last five years, the Lions Foundation has received consistence request from the community about Dog Guides that help with specific kin ds of diabetes. A solid foundation of research, which includes assistance from Medic Alert Dogs in United Kingdom, has laid the foundation for the launch.

Diabetic Alert Dog Guides are trained to assist people who have type 1 diabetes with hypoglycemic unawareness. These Dog Guides can detect fluctuations in blood sugar levels through scent. They are trained to detect sudden drops in their handler's blood sugar through scent and alert them so that they can ingest something sweet. They also bark for help or activate an alert system if needed. Their ability to detect and react to hypoglycemic episodes helps their handler's avoid loss of consciousness and subsequent life-threatening effects.

Training is set to begin in the Spring and applications are being accepted for late 2013 placement.

With the penny being phased out, Lions Foundation of Canada Dog Guides is calling out to all Canadians to put their change to work through the "Pennies for Puppies" program. The goal is to raise approximately \$20,000.00 or two million pennies, to cover the cost of placing one Dog Guide with someone with a disability. Coins can be donated to the Lions Foundation as loose change or rolled. The head office in Oakville, Ontario will be accepting the coins.
