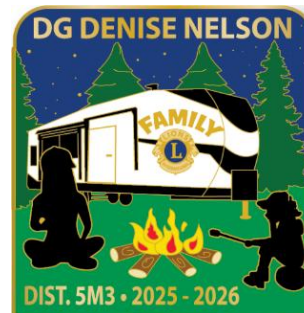

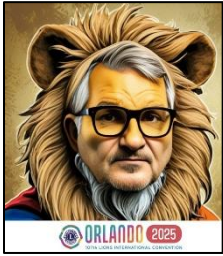

What a visit to Leader Dog, an unbelievable tour and learning experience on how the Lions are a major part of Leader Dog history and remain a significant part of their support and success. It was an enjoyable day of Lions fellowship, a history lesson of how 3 Detroit Lions started Leader Dog in 1939. Also, learning how to be a Human Guide, trying a white cane (did not become an expert user), and walking blindfolded with a guide dog. Excellent speakers and Leader Dogs, Lion Joey Johnson and LD

Tucker, and Lion Walker Jones and LD Loki. Even the "Dinner in the Dark" was a wonderful experience. No one spilled a glass of water or had many stains on their shirts or pants. It is a great opportunity for Lions to see how your donations are being used and what great things are being done to help the blind. There is a plaque on a wall at Leader Dog Stating "Room donated by Lion Multiple District 5M- Minnesota, NW Ontario, and Manitoba Lions Clubs. Greetings from the Global Service Desk

Welcome to the nice early fall weather that is taking place this morning, and the temperature was 57 degrees. The first cabinet meeting was held this past weekend with a nice turnout. The discussion was about membership and how to improve our membership in 5M3. The cabinet will work on this in the next month.

Reporting service was also brought up and the clubs need to enter more into the Lions Portal. Last year we finished with about 96 % of the clubs reporting. This year the reporting is at 26 % so we do have a lot of work to do. If your club is looking for service ideas, here are some that look very simple to do and could be a lot of fun. There is good information on service in the rest of the article.

Greetings Lions, New month, New Cause.

August is "Youth Month".

Many opportunities exist for youth and adults to collaborate on community service projects. These can range from hands-on activities like park cleanups and food drives to more skill-based initiatives like tutoring or teaching computer skills to seniors. Partnering with local organizations like animal shelters, hospitals, or homeless shelters can also provide meaningful service experiences.

Here are some ideas:

Hands-on Activities:

- * Park and neighborhood cleanups: Organize a group to collect litter and debris in a local park or neighborhood.
- * Food drives and meal preparation: Collect non-perishable food items or prepare meals for distribution to food banks or shelters.
- * Community garden maintenance: Help with planting, weeding, and harvesting in a local community garden.
- * Animal shelter support: Assist with tasks like walking dogs, cleaning kennels, or socializing with animals.
- * Hospital or nursing home visits: Spend time socializing with patients, reading, or playing games.
- * Car washes or yard work: Offer services like car washes or yard work to elderly or disabled individuals.

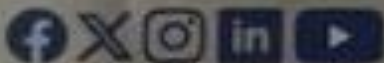
