Explore food waste composting options in your area in honor of **International Day of Awareness on Food Loss and Waste Reduction** on September 29. Learn how to avoid food waste ending up in landfills, and **how composting can reduce our impact on the planet.**



Partner with local schools to establish organic school gardens and a composting program to improve the quality of school meals and reduce waste. Download LCI's **guide to developing local partnerships** to get started.



Reach out to your local government officials to discuss participating in the UN Habitat's **Waste Wise Cities** initiative to address waste management on a global scale.



As electronic waste is one of the fastest growing waste streams in the world, visit the **World Health Organization's Electronic waste webpage** to explore how to responsibly recycle electronics in your community. Collaborate with your local recycling facility and waste management provider.



Work with your club, district, or Multiple District to identify where to recycle toxic items and share a collection schedule. Partner with city officials to paint "no dumping" signs near road drainage areas.



Plan a club service activity in honor of **Global Recycling Day** on March 18. Consider a community-wide recycling drive that mobilizes people to connect on a global day of service to protect the environment. Use the posters, photos, videos, and other assets provided by UNEP to raise awareness of the day in your community. Share your impact on social media using the #GlobalRecyclingDay hashtags.



Plan a monthly trash pickup event in a high-traffic area of your community, and distribute recycling bins & trashcans.



Donate food through food sharing apps. This helps unused food to go to those in need, while avoiding food waste and unnecessary production. Get inspired by a **food app project feature by the UN Climate Change.**

Guide Dog Myths and Misconceptions Explained

How much do you know about guide dogs?

- True or False: Once people get a guide dog, they no longer need their white cane.
- True or False: A guide dog already knows where their handler wants them to go.
- True or False: A guide dog should go anywhere and everywhere with their handler.

Assessing Readiness to Apply for a Guide Dog

- Does your routine include regular outings for work, school, errands, or exercise multiple times per week?
- Are you confident in your orientation and mobility skills, able to navigate routes independently, problem-solve, and use safe street-crossing strategies?
- Are you prepared to train and work with a guide dog long-term, using positive reinforcement techniques, providing ongoing care and advocating for both you and your dog?
- Do you have the relationship skills to build a strong bond with your guide dog and serve as the primary caretaker, providing daily physical and mental stimulation beyond guide work?

These are some of the questions prospective guide dog clients will find on Leader Dog's guide dog readiness assessment, **a tool that can help someone who is blind decide if a Leader Dog is right for them.** Leader Dog is one of only nineteen accredited guide dog providers in North America. Our guide dog program eligibility requirements ensure that clients are prepared to work with their Leader Dog for many years.

We are members of the International Guide Dog Federation (IGDF), a group of organizations who collaborate and champion the cause of vision around the world. **Together, we share best practices and resources to refine guide dog and handler training.** Leader Dog's guide dog program eligibility requirements are based on the standards set by IGDF. 

