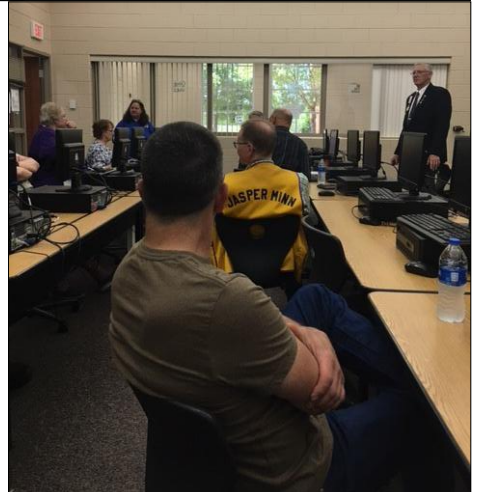

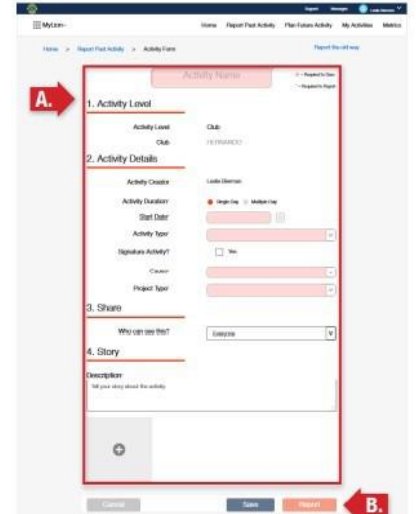

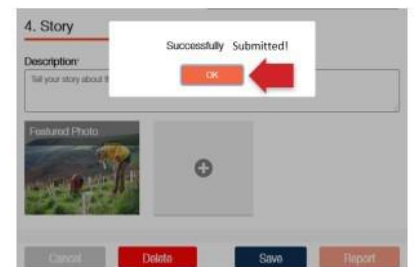

Greetings Lions of 5M3. By the time you read this I will be installed as the District Governor for 5M3. We will have attended the last two days of training prior to the LCI Convention, the Convention itself, and watched as the new LCI President is elected. If you don't know, the new International President is from Bird Island here in Minnesota. Our new President is Lion Brian Sheehan and his wife Lori. It will be an exciting year for Lions in Minnesota, as it's been 103 years since we have had a President from our State.

I and my wife, Di, are excited and looking forward to serving you as your District Governor. One thing that we need to emphasize is the need for communication between our clubs and the District Leadership Team. If you or your club is struggling in some areas, please don't hesitate to contact me or someone in the leadership team. We are here to help you succeed but we can't if we don't know. Use your zone chairs too. They are there to help you. Communications is key so don't be silent.

Some of you have asked about what our District Goals are for this year. First, these are not my goals, but ours. If you remember or attended the Mid-Winter Convention in February, the Sunday morning presentation was led by our incoming LCI President Brian Sheehan and PID Bruce Beck. What they did was a SWOT analysis (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, and Threats) for our District. Those in attendance gave them insight into what is going on in the district and what we need to do to improve. In short, our SWOT analysis developed our goals for 2022/2023. So here they are:

1. By the end of 2023 fiscal year, our district will increase the percentage of clubs reporting service to ensure that 50% of clubs are reporting. Our GST (Global Service Team) leader is PDG Dave Janssen. Need help please contact him.
2. By the end of 2023 fiscal year, our district will achieve a positive membership growth by
 - A. Chartering at least one new club with 20 Charter members by the end of the third quarter,
 - B. Our Clubs will induct 30 new members into existing clubs, (growth)
 - C. Our district will not surpass 20 dropped members.
 - Please note that dropped members means that retention of existing members will be key. It does not mean members who die or move out of our district.
3. By the end of the first quarter of the 2022/2023 fiscal year, our district will hold club officer and zone chairpersons training.
 - A. We will ensure that 100% of zone chairs attend training,
 - B. That 50% of Club officers, Presidents, Secretaries, and Treasurers attend training,
 - Two training sessions have been completed. Additional training maybe held at the club level if needed.
4. We will ensure that "individual" participation in our district to LCIF will increase by 5% and club LCIF participation will equal or exceed 80% of club in our district.
 - A. Our district will ensure that 1 club in our district will achieve 100%-member participation,
 - B. I will work to achieve a "Bronze" level LCIF Chairperson's medal
 - C. I will make a personal donation of \$100 to LCIF and I will ask that 10 members of my district cabinet to make a personal donation to LCIF.

OK, there you have it, OUR GOALS (not mine) for 2022/2023. Any questions please reach out to me. How do we accomplish them? By getting all members involved, educate the need, communicate and by bringing in help from the MD5M Leadership Team. Which we have already started. Hopefully some of you attended the three zone meetings where PDG Jay Norby (MD5M GMA Lead) spoke. We will also be using the MD5M New Club Development team in the future.

If you have not heard or know, 5M3 has its first two certified Lions Faculty trainers that are available for helping you with any training programs that you may want to do. PDG Wayne Radloff and DG Don Kuehl, have attended, passed, and certified as instructors for Lions Training Institute. Please reach out to us if you are interested in a particular training program for your club. To my knowledge, we are the first from 5M3 to complete this training.

It's going to be a busy year; I've got four club visits scheduled starting in July. Please call me to schedule your club. I'm looking forward to visiting you and your clubs and letting you know how we are doing as a district. Let's make this an exciting, fun, and successful year in 5M3. Also, as of this time we still need a zone chair for zones, 1 and 6, and a GMT leader. Any interest, please let me know.

Our new LCI President Brian Sheehan's theme is "Together we can" and I say, "Achieve More".
Let's do it.

Registration is now open for the October 2022 MD5M Regional Lions Leadership Institute (RLLI)

The institute is open to all lions who are members in good standing of a Lions Club except for Past District Governors, District Governors, or 1st Vice District Governors.

The \$150 USD registration fee for RLLI includes the cost of materials, facility, staff, and four (4) meals. Room costs, \$129 USD excluding tax, and additional meals are not included.

A \$75 rebate from MD5M, through a grant from LCI, will be given to each participant that completes the program.

Early Bird Discount: Register by July 1st and save \$25 USD

Participants must attend all sessions beginning on Thursday evening and ending Sunday Afternoon.

Each district can send six (6) participants; however, if other districts do not meet their allotment, your district may send additional Lions.

Applications are available from your District Governor or District Global Leadership Team Chairperson as well as on the MD5M website: lionsmd5m.org under resources. Completed applications must be submitted to your District Governor, without fees by August 31st, 2022. Your District Governor will make the final participant selection and you will be notified by September 15th if you were or were not accepted.

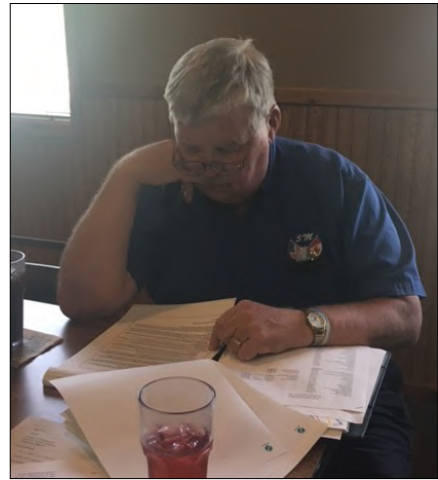
