Greetings Lions of 5M3,

As I'm writing this on Sunday evening I'm reflecting on the Mid-Winter Convention that was just wrapped up. Some thoughts that come to mind; AWESOME, GREAT PRESENTATIONS, FOOD, FUN, FELLOWSHIP WITH OTHER LIONS IN AND OUTSIDE OUR DISTRICT !!!!!

Every convention gives us an opportunity to renew friendships, visit with other clubs, learn about service projects, and discuss ways we can all continue to serve our communities, district, state, and country. You need to know that the DG does not and cannot put this together on their own. I am lucky to have a great core group of individuals willing to step up and serve in any capacity to put this convention on. To those that worked to make this a great time I can only say "THANK-YOU, you succeeded in making this a great weekend.

As of this writing we do NOT have anyone that has stepped up to be our district 2VDG. We need someone (YOU) to be that person (LEADER), to step up and say yes. It's important to start early to accomplish the training over the next couple of years. Please contact me if you would like additional information on this leadership role in 5M3. It goes fast, it's fun, it's a learning experience, and it's important to have the position filled in our district.

At the Cabinet meeting on Friday afternoon, a District-wide service project was approved. It's a service project for Childhood Cancer AND the great part is that every club in the District can participate!!! First, most clubs do a great job with service projects for Diabetes, Hearing, Vision, and Environment BUT most clubs don't have a project for Childhood Cancer. Why not, it's because it's difficult to know what to do. This project will fill that square. We are asking clubs for a monetary donation (sent to our District Treasurer and will be held in a restricted Childhood Cancer fund) then those dollars will be used to purchase fleece blanket kits. These in turn will be assembled at our 2021 Mid-Winter Convention in Fairmont by Lion members of 5M3 during the convention. The completed blankets will be donated to the Sioux Falls Children Hospital, Pediatric Cancer ward. We are asking that all clubs in our district support this project as it is a great and easy way to help serve others dealing with Childhood Cancer. Questions, please let me know. More information can be and will be found in this newsletter.....

There are seven (7) clubs that have not scheduled a Governor's visit yet. Please give me a call so we can discuss open dates. We would really enjoy visiting your club and talking to you about what is happening in 5M3 and MD5M. Here are a couple of items that you need to consider attending for great Lions training and information. The first is March 21st; Minnesota Lions Diabetes Foundation Research Update. It's held at the U of M and reservations are required. You can RSVP on line at www.rsvp.umn.edu/Lions2020. Great program. The next opportunity is March 28th, Lions Northern Pride, held at the Best Western Plus Hotel, St. Cloud, MN. This is a one day event where you have the ability to choose from 36 different seminars during the day. You will probably only be able to attend six, but a great way to learn. Officer training for ALL Presidents, Vice Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurer's AND Zone Chairs will start in April. The first training will be held in Windom at the BARC center on April 19th, starting at 2:00 PM and running till 4:00 PM. The second training is scheduled for April 26th, at the Marshall High School, again starting at 2:00 and running till 4. Now, even if you've been a officer for the past 2 plus years, if you HAVE NOT attended in the past you need to this year. Changes have been made to the reporting of your club activities. Don't be that person that complains about the system and yet doesn't take the time to get the training to learn....Another reason to get your elections done prior to April and it will help DGE David Janssen get a jump on his year as District Governor.

Our MD5M convention will be held in Rochester, MN, this year. It's close so a good reason to consider attending. The dates are May 1st through the 3rd. Registration is now open. There is additional information in this newsletter on how to register. It again will be a great learning opportunity. If you can't spend the weekend, look at the schedule and come over for a day....

Congratulations to Lion Robert Schirlinger, New Ulm Lions Club, as our Hall of Fame nominee for 5M3. If you know Lion Bob this is a well-deserved honor. He is very active in his club service projects, is the 5M3 Webmaster, and serves on the Minnesota Lions Diabetes Foundation (just to name a few projects he is involved in)....

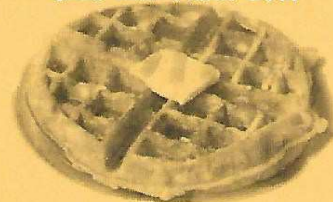

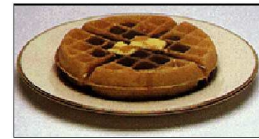

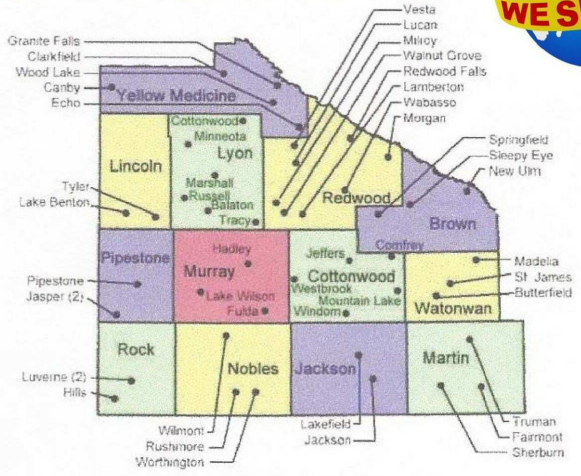
