

#### **Big Check Presentation**

Representatives of the MN Lions Childhood Cancer Foundation present a symbolic "big check" to Dr. Kim Sadak and Dr. Luci Turcotte. The \$100,000 raised by Minnesota Lions was matched, dollar for dollar, by the University of Minnesota Foundation and the Children's Cancer Research Fund to make \$300,000 donated to the University of Minnesota Masonic Children's Hospital to fund research and services for survivors of childhood cancer. Presenting the check on behalf of the Foundation were President Jeannine McDonald, Secretary Linda Albrecht, Director Bob Knutson and Treasurer Tom McCarthy.

One of the innovative programs being funded by the Lions is a smart phone app to keep in touch with survivors as the leave the hospital program and move on with their lives. Dr. Karim Sadak, Director, Childhood Cancer Survivor Program at the Masonic Children's Hospital, has stated, "Funds from the Minnesota Lions Childhood Cancer Foundation have made it possible to create a way through mobile health to never let childhood cancer survivors slip through the cracks of the healthcare system."

We have 190 dogs and puppies currently in volunteer home while 5 of our prisons are closed. At this time, we have 350 active working teams who are currently receiving continuous follow-up and support from us. We will be holding a virtual graduation on the 24<sup>th</sup> of October. Halle has been managingType 1 diabetes for 23 years, after being diagnosed at just 4 years old. She has dealt with hypoglycemic episodes when her blood sugar level plummets, but she is unable to feel it happening until that "low" endangers her life.

Binx, a 3-year-old yellow Labrador Retriever, has become confident in realizing what Halle needs. He embraces his sense of smell to the extent that he can identify chemical changes in Halle's body before she notices them or her equipment detects them.

#### Faculty Development Institute (FDI)

The Faculty Development Institute is a three-day institute that serves to develop and expand the number of skilled Lions faculty available for use in training at the club, district, and multiple district levels. The curriculum is designed to enhance training delivery skills and training techniques that will increase the quality of training and overall effectiveness of Lions leadership development programs. Lions who complete the FDI are expected to be able to effectively deliver training sessions with provided materials. They should not be expected to create their own training materials.

Qualified candidates are those Lions who have some experience as instructors at local Lions training events, have demonstrated basic instructional skills, and have a keen interest in further developing those skills. A candidate's training experience should include using PowerPoint to support training delivery. (Note: Participants will not be expected to create any materials while at the FDI, but it will be necessary to use PowerPoint and other provided materials for some activities.

Lions Clubs International will provide meals and lodging according to the dates and schedule of the institute. In compliance with board policy, a non-refundable participation fee of US\$150.00 will be required to offset a portion of these costs. Participants are also responsible to pay for their own transportation and other travel related expenses to and from the institute site.

# HAVE YOU FILED YOUR FEDERAL TAX FORM (990-N) FOR 2020?

Lions: <u>PLEASE</u> remember that all **Lions Clubs**, that have annual gross receipts less than \$50,000 MUST file the E-Postcard. Please note that this is an IRS requirement. This has to be filed online, and for most clubs it must be filed before <u>November 15</u> of this year (there are a few Lion Clubs that have a calendar year as their fiscal year and your club must file each year by May 15).

To file, the easiest way to do it is to go to the following website: <a href="http://epostcard.form990.org">http://epostcard.form990.org</a>. Once you are at the site, you need to have the following:

Employer Identification Number (EIN), also known as a Taxpayer identification Number (TIN). Your secretary should have this, or you can get it for your club on the LCI website, <a href="www.mylci.org">www.mylci.org</a>, then pull up your club; it will have the number listed. This is a nine digit number.

- Tax Year Use July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020
- Legal name and mailing address
- 3. Any other names the organization uses.
- Name and address of the principal officer.
- 5. Website address if the organization has one.
- Confirmation that the organization's annual gross receipts are \$50,000 or less.
- 7. If applicable, a statement that the organization has terminated or is terminating (going out of business).
- 8. When you enter the site, it will ask for a User Name. Hopefully you wrote it down from the previous year. If not, you can create a new one.

You MUST complete this every year. If you miss for 3 years, your club loses its tax exempt status and you must pay a reinstatement fee to get re-registered. Avoid the pain, make sure that this is done at the latest by November 15 of each year, but do it early in case there is some glitch that needs to be dealt with.

- Donate a diabetes magazine subscription or diabetes-related books to your local library.
- Invite a role model with diabetes to a local school to talk about healthy lifestyle choices.
- Sponsor a child to attend a diabetes camp and/or supply a camp with needed supplies.
- Post monthly notices on your club or district website and social media accounts, sharing available community resources for people with or at risk of diabetes.
- Write about healthy lifestyle choices in your community or school newspaper.
- Organize a Strides: Lions for Diabetes Awareness event in your community.
- Develop a list of patient resources and services and distribute them to Lions and the public.

#### ACT // INTERMEDIATE

- Partner with healthcare professionals to organize a screening for diabetes, diabetic retinopathy and diabetic foot.
- Promote diabetes prevention through social media campaigns or radio announcements.
- Volunteer for a day at a diabetes camp. Visit www.diabetescamps. org to find a camp near you.
- Sponsor a healthy cooking demonstration for people with diabetes and pre-diabetes.
- Organize a weekly walking club at your place of work and share a healthy snack afterwards.
- Bring fresh fruits or vegetables to an elementary school classroom to encourage children to try a variety of healthy foods.
- Collaborate with a healthcare professional to organize a physical activity and promote exercise.
- Donate needed exercise equipment to a community center or school.

#### ACT // ADVANCED

- Organize a community support group for people diagnosed with diabetes and their families.
- Work with a healthcare professional to organize a mentorship program, pairing a younger person with diabetes with an older mentor.
- Organize a school or community vegetable garden to encourage healthy eating.
- Establish a fitness room or ongoing fitness classes at a community center or school.
- Sponsor a training program for community healthcare workers to learn about screening, community support programs and prevention of diabetes complications.


