The following Institutes will be offered by Lions Clubs International.

Advanced Lions Leadership Institute

Advanced Lions Leadership Institutes focus on building the skills of Lions leaders to prepare them for leadership responsibilities at zone, region, and district levels. Qualified candidates are Lions that have completed a successful term as club president but have not yet attained the position of First Vice District Governor. Candidates must be willing to commit to all days of the institute.

Lions Clubs International will provide meals and lodging according to the dates and schedule of the institute. Please note that a non-refundable participation fee of US\$125.00 will be required to offset a portion of these costs for all institutes. Participants are also responsible to pay for their own transportation and other travel related expenses to and from the institute site.

Faculty Development Institute (FDI)

The Faculty Development Institute is a three-day institute that serves to develop and expand the number of skilled Lions faculty available for use in training at the club, district, and multiple district levels. The curriculum is designed to enhance training delivery skills and training techniques that will increase the quality of training and overall effectiveness of Lions leadership development programs. Lions who complete the FDI are expected to be able to effectively deliver training sessions with provided materials. They should not be expected to create their own training materials.

Qualified candidates are those Lions who have some experience as instructors at local Lions training events, have demonstrated basic instructional skills, and have a keen interest in further developing those skills. A candidate's training experience should include using PowerPoint to support training delivery. (Note: Participants will not be expected to create any materials while at the FDI, but it will be necessary to use PowerPoint and other provided materials for some activities.

Lions Clubs International will provide meals and lodging according to the dates and schedule of the institute. In compliance with board policy, a non-refundable participation fee of US\$150.00 will be required to offset a portion of these costs. Participants are also responsible to pay for their own transportation and other travel related expenses to and from the institute site.

2021 Regional Lions Leadership Institute (RLLI)

March 18 - 21, 2021

Holiday Inn-Detroit Lakes MN

We are looking for Lions from your district to attend the 2021 MD5M Regional Lions Leadership Institute!

Lions that are selected as participants in the Institute must be in good standing in a Lions Club and may not be a 1st Vice District Governor, District Governor, Past District Governor, International Director, or Past International Director.

The \$150 fee for the Leadership Institute includes the cost of materials, facility, staff, and four (4) meals. Room costs and additional meals are not included.

However, a \$75 rebate from MD5M, through a grant from LCI, will be given to

each participant that completes the program.

Participants MUST be available to attend ALL sessions beginning on
Thursday evening and ending Sunday afternoon.

Each district has the opportunity to send six (6) participants; however, if other districts do not meet their allotment, your district may send additional Lions.

The Institute will have a maximum of 72 participants.

Applications are available from your District Governor or on the MD5M Website and are due (without fees) by December 1, 2020.

Your District Governor will then make the final participant selection.

Institute graduates will tell you that the Regional Lions Leadership Institute is beneficial for you in every facet of your life and not just in your role as a Lion.

Participant SelectionGuidelines

The following guidelines are to be used by the District Governor in selecting participants for the MD5M Regional Lions Leadership Institute.

- 1. The applicant must be a Lion in good standing of a MD5M Lions Club in good standing.
- The following Lions are not eligible to attend: District Governors, Vice District Governors, Past District Governors, International Directors and Past International Directors.
- 3. The applicant must have never attended a Lions Club International Leadership Institute.
- 4. The purpose of the Institute is to provide Leadership Development Training to emerging Lion leaders. The goal is to search out at least six emerging leaders in each of the 12 Districts in MD5M. Special concern will be for club leaders and less experienced Lions on the District Cabinet who could benefit from an experience attending a Lions Clubs International Regional Leadership Institute. Specific goals for the training are:
 - Expand the leadership ability of current and future District Officers and Cabinet members.
 - b. Strengthen the Leadership Development programs in each District by providing a stronger base of qualified Lion Leaders within each District.
 - c. Provide and support an ever-growing base of potential District leaders that are qualified to fill future positions as District Governors.
- 5. There should be no more than one applicant from any one Lions Club.
- The applicant must be available to attend the entire MD5M RLLI. They must arrive on Thursday to register and attend the evening Icebreaker session, the Kickoff Breakfast on Friday, and all sessions through the closing session on Sunday.
- The applicant must complete the MD5M RLLI Application Form, have it signed and submitted to their District Governor on or before December 1, 2020.
- The applicant, once accepted, must provide a check for \$150.00 payable to MD5M Regional Leadership Institute to be submitted with their registration form on or before January 15, 2021.
- Each participant that attends the entire Leadership Institute (Opening Session, Kickoff Breakfast, all Institute sessions, the Celebration Banquet and Closing Session) will receive a \$75.00 reimbursement to help cover expenses.

Barring any remaining impact from COVID-19 we are planning to hold the 2021 Regional Lions Leadership Institute at the Holiday Inn in Detroit Lakes MN, March 18-21. 2021

We have an experienced faculty committed to the Institute and are now in need of 72 participants!!! It is our intention that each participant will be an emerging leader in each of your districts. We plan to identify, nurture, and mentor these future leaders of MD5M!! Many of you have had experience with previous Lions Leadership Institutes and recognize the value of this experience!

We have attached an application for participation in the Institute. We expect that applications will be returned to you by December 1st, 2020. You will then need to identify six (6) participants from your District and provide them with the Participant Registration Form (also attached). You will then put any additional applicants on a waiting list. The six selected participants will need to complete the Participant Registration Form and forward to Executive Secretary Bob Harms no later than January 15, 2021.

The \$150 fee for the Leadership Institute includes the cost of materials, facility, staff, a buffet breakfast on Friday, a Buffett lunch on Friday and Saturday and a banquet on Saturday evening. Hotel room costs, \$84.99 excluding tax, and additional meals are not included.

A \$75 rebate from MD5M, partially funded by a \$4,500 grant from LCI, will be given to each participant that completes the program.

Each District is allocated six (6) participants at the Institute; however, if some Districts do not fill their allotment, participants will be chosen from waiting lists in other Districts. All 72 student slots will be filled.

RLLI Participant Selection Process

The following guidelines are suggested for selecting and enrolling participants in the MD5M Regional Lions Leadership Institute.

Provide Information:

Provide information on the Institute to all Lions in the District.

- Provide information on the Institute and a copy of the Application Form in the District Newsletter.
- Present information on the Institute at all Fall Zone Meetings. Distribute copies of the Application Form and Guidelines at the meeting.
- Send information on the Institute and Application to all Club Secretaries requesting that it be discussed at the Club meeting.

Solicit and Process Participant Applications:

Many Districts will have more than six Lions wishing to attend the MD5M RLLI. It is important to select the six participants who can bring the most value to their Lions Club and their District. The Participant Selection Guidelines spell out the criteria that should be used in the selection of the six Lions from each District. Following are some additional selections:

- Make sure that the information on the MD5M RLLI is made available to all Lions in the District.
- Form or select a committee to help in the selection process. This committee can suggest Lions
 who would be top candidates to attend the Institute and help in selection, from the applications
 that are submitted, the six Lions who will be chosen to attend.

Final Participant Registration:

By December 1st, all participant applications should have been received by the District Governor. At that point the District Governor, with the help of the selection committee, must screen the applications and choose the six participants that will be registered for the Institute. Two or three alternates should also be selected in case someone has to withdraw later. Alternated may also be selected if one or more Districts are not able to fill their six participant slots.

By January 15, 2021, the following must be submitted to Executive Secretary Bob Harms:

- The completed and signed Participant Registration Form for each participant.
- A check for \$150.00 payable to the MD5M Regional Lions Leadership Institute, from each of the six participants

NOTE: If a District does not register their six participants by January 15, their slots will be distributed to other Districts. All the 72 participant slots will be filled.

NOTE: If you are selected to attend the Leadership Institute. your District Governor will require a check for \$150.00 before your registration can be forwarded to MD5M. Your District Governor must send the registration to MD5M Executive Secretary Robert Harms by January 15, 2021.

HAVE YOU FILED YOUR FEDERAL TAX FORM (990-N) FOR 2020?

Lions: <u>PLEASE</u> remember that all **Lions Clubs**, that have annual gross receipts less than \$50,000 MUST file the E-Postcard. Please note that this is an IRS requirement. This has to be filed online, and for most clubs it must be filed before <u>November 15</u> of this year (there are a few Lion Clubs that have a calendar year as their fiscal year and your club must file each year by May 15).

To file, the easiest way to do it is to go to the following website: http://epostcard.form990.org. Once you are at the site, you need to have the following:

Employer Identification Number (EIN), also known as a Taxpayer identification Number (TIN). Your secretary should have this, or you can get it for your club on the LCI website, www.mylci.org, then pull up your club; it will have the number listed. This is a nine digit number.

- 1. Tax Year Use July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020
- 2. Legal name and mailing address
- 3. Any other names the organization uses.
- 4. Name and address of the principal officer.
- 5. Website address if the organization has one.
- 6. Confirmation that the organization's annual gross receipts are \$50,000 or less.
- 7. If applicable, a statement that the organization has terminated or is terminating (going out of business).
- 8. When you enter the site, it will ask for a User Name. Hopefully you wrote it down from the previous year. If not, you can create a new one.

You MUST complete this every year. If you miss for 3 years, your club loses its tax exempt status and you must pay a reinstatement fee to get re-registered. Avoid the pain, make sure that this is done at the latest by November 15 of each year, but do it early in case there is some glitch that needs to be dealt with.

Another month ASSISTANCE DOGS has passed and I think most of us have survived. Hoping all is well with you. On the 12th of September we held our Woofaroo fundraiser and it was a huge success. We raised over \$70,000 from individual donors and sponsors to enhance the quality of life for people with disabilities. Our next event will be Fall graduation. That will be held on October 24th with another 18 teams graduating. Anyone from the public is welcome to join us online. The event will premiere at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday, October 24, 2020, and will last about 30 minutes. Visit graduation.can-do-canines.org. We will also be doing Tails to Tell presentations twice a month. If you are interested, please feel free to attend one of the presentations. Once you register you will be sent a link that will give you the tour.



This month we will join Mike. Mike was diagnosed with cerebral palsy at birth. Symptoms primarily affect his left side. He has difficulty using his left hand to grasp heavy or small items, so he uses his right arm, with his left being his "helping hand." His balance is limited due to decreased mobility in his left leg, and he tends to trip easily. If he falls, it becomes a dangerous situation since he has a hard time getting himself back to a safe

position. Despite these constant threats to his safety, Mike's determination to adapt enabled him to maintain employment and a sense of independence. He's able to move about without adaptive equipment, but he recently discovered that an assistance dog was just the right fit for his life. Mike's cousin first introduced the idea for an assistance dog, and an Internet search brought Mike to Can Do Canines. He applied for a Mobility Assist Dog in hopes of enhancing his quality of life to make it even better. He was soon matched with the endearing Ellie. A gentle soul to match, Ellie is a 2-year-old yellow Labrador Retriever whose greatest joy in life is just making her person happy. Her soft and kind demeanor are a perfect match for Mike, and the two have learned to support each other in all of their new adjustments to a flourishing partnership. Before Ellie, Mike struggled to carry bulky or multiple things. Ellie allows him to save his energy by tugging his laundry basket to him or bringing along items he can't carry. In public, Ellie will retrieve Mike's keys, wallet, or any object he's shopping for. Having Ellie to pick up and bring items to his hand means not compromising his balance to lean and reach for it. By tugging heavy or lower doors, she provides the same kind of security for him. Ellie loves accompanying Mike as much as possible, and Mike feels the same. He's been happy for their team from the first day. Until next month:






