

Also, please remember our district membership, leadership, service and LCIF goals. All clubs need to be working on growing our membership. Our goal is 66 new members. The district is currently at 21 new members. So we know it is possible to reach our goal. Although we have dropped 22 members. Our goal is to end the year with positive membership numbers. So we all have a little work to do. Remember to ask people to visit your club and see the great things you are doing.

All Club officers should be trained. If a Club Officer did not attend the district spring Officer Training sessions, please go into the Lion Portal and complete the training for your Office. Your officers should complete the officer training every year.

We need to get back to reporting our service. The percent of Clubs reporting has dropped this year. So please continue with all of your service projects, but also remember to report that service within the Lion Portal. Also, your club should try doing a new service project this year. If at all possible, the 2 pillars that our district is concentrating on this year Diabetes and Hunger are the two you could choose from. Concentrating on Hunger in the first half of this year and Diabetes in the second half of the year.

The LCIF goals for this year are to increase club and individual participation by 10%. The Club Excellence award requires a club to donate an amount equal to or greater than \$10.00 per member. We also need 10 of our District Cabinet members to donate to LCIF. Thank you in advance for helping our District to work toward these goals.

The district cabinet is still in need of a few Lions to step up. We still need a GMA Champion, a Zone 3 Chairperson, a Zone 4 Chairperson and a Vision Chairperson. Please think about helping our district with taking one of these positions.

I recently attended the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum. It was held in Louisville.Kentucky. The Forum

Every seminar is full of very useful information for our clubs and districts. If you ever have the opportunity to attend the USA/Canada Forum, I would highly recommend doing so.

September 20th and 21st are the dates for the Northern Pride LIons Forum in St. Cloud. It is basically a smaller version of the USA/Canada Forum. They have 13 sessions and 4 panels. This will be the first time that I have attended this Forum.

Also the Regional Lions Leadership Institute is November 14-17. It will be held at the Detroit Lakes Holiday Inn. 
### Membership Dues increase

"The mission of the TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation (501c3) is to empower MD5M Lions clubs to provide greater service by boosting their ability to complete community projects with matching grants."

- The Lions project must address an important humanitarian need and provide an opportunity to highlight Lions in the communities they serve.
- Grant applicants must submit their project proposals using the TSCF MD5M Club Grant application form.
- 3. The maximum grant amount that may be requested is currently \$3,000.00. All grants are 50/50 matching grants.
- 4. Grant proposals may be submitted by any Lions club within Multiple District 5M. Applications submitted by a club shall be signed by the current club president. The appropriate meeting minutes at which the application was voted on and approved must be submitted with the application.
- 5. TSCF grant applications should be submitted to TSCF prior to January 1,
- April 1, July 1 or October 1 for consideration at the following TSCF board meeting to allow adequate processing time.
- Lions and/or their families may not receive direct or professional benefit from TSCF projects or have proprietary interest in projects receiving TSCF assistance.
- Projects receiving TSCF funding shall be clearly identified in marketing as being made possible by Lions and TSCF.
- 8. Upon project completion, grant recipients are responsible for submission of a report detailing project results, all receipts/expenditures and use of TSCF grant funds.
- Projects should be completed within one year of approval by TSCF, unless otherwise requested by applicant.

#### Appendix 28.0 MD5M HALL OF FAME Procedure

#### **Purpose**

To honor those Lion and Lioness members of character and substance who have demonstrated the highest level of commitment and dedication to the efforts of their club, district or multiple district and the motto of our association, "We Serve."

#### Award

There shall be a maximum of one (1) recipient of the MD5M Hall of Fame Award per district, inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame each year. The award may be presented posthumously.

The MD5M Hall of Fame award recipients are to be inducted into the Hall of Fame at the annual MD5M Multiple District Convention during the Saturday noon luncheon.

MD5M Hall of Fame recipients shall receive a MD5M Hall of Fame award plaque and a Hall of Fame lapel pin in recognition of their induction in the MD5M Hall of Fame. In addition, a complete listing of all MD5M Hall of Fame recipients shall appear in the annual MD5M directory and a perpetual plaque, with the names of all inductees and the year of their induction inscribed thereon, shall be kept in a prominent place in the MD5M office, when available.

The presentation of the MD5M Hall of Fame inductees shall be the responsibility of the current International Director from MD5M, if there is one and he/she is in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention. If not, then the most recent Past International Director having served from MD5M in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

#### Criteria

A candidate may be a Lion or Lioness, must have been a member in good standing for at least 15 years, be at least two (2) years removed from the Council of Governors if a PDG, should have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavors, and he/she should be of good moral character and have a good reputation in his/her community. A nominee must be a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club, or must have been a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club at the time of their death.

#### **Process**

A candidate may be sponsored by any Lion, Lioness, Lions Club, Lioness Club, Zone, or District.

There shall be a nomination fee of \$150.00 per each candidate nominated. The nomination fee shall be returned to those sponsors whose candidates are not elected for induction into the MD5M Hall of Fame. The nomination fee for those selected for induction shall be sent to MD5M and shall be used to offset the cost of the award process, plaques and pin. Nominations, including the nomination fee, must be received by the District Governor at least 30 days prior to the District's Midwinter Convention.

Each individual District shall annually hold an election at their Midwinter Convention to determine the candidate(s), if any, to be inducted into the Hall of Fame for that Lion Year. Each sponsor shall have an opportunity to give a brief presentation on the merits and biographical information of their nominee prior to the election. Those elected to be inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame shall not be publicly announced until their induction at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

All nominations shall use the standard form, no others shall be accepted. The nomination fee must be received at the time the application is received, otherwise the nomination shall not be considered.

All successful candidates shall be inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame at the next MD5M Multiple District Convention. The sponsor(s) and the respective District Governor shall ensure that the honoree or a suitable representative shall be in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention Saturday Luncheon when the honorees are inducted.

A brief biography of each inductee shall be announced to those in attendance during the induction ceremony at the annual MD5M Multiple District Convention.


