By joining a team, you'll gain valuable knowledge and tools that will not only support your own club but also help our district move forward together. Your involvement matters—your club and district need you!

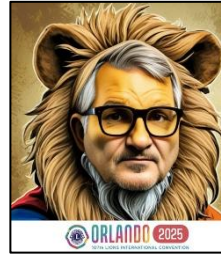

Why don't we promote our clubs?

Here are a few reasons why clubs often don't promote themselves as much as they can:

1. **Tradition & Humility** – Lions have always emphasized service before self. Many members feel uncomfortable “advertising” what they do, because they see service as something done quietly, without seeking recognition.
2. **Lack of Communication Skills or Tools** – Not all clubs have members with strong media, technology, or public relations backgrounds. Without clear tools or training, promotion can feel overwhelming.
3. **Focus on Service, Not Publicity** – Lions often pour their energy into projects, and when the project is done, they move on—forgetting to share the story.
4. **Fear of Being Seen as Fundraisers Only** – Some clubs worry that too much promotion will make the public think Lions just want donations, instead of highlighting our mission of service.

Why Promotion Matters.

Promoting our clubs is not about boasting. It's about sharing stories of service to inspire others—future members, partners, and supporters. When people don't know what Lions are doing, they may never realize that they too can be part of this global movement. Promotion connects directly to Mission 1.5 (our initiative to reach 1.5 million members by 2027). If we don't tell our story, people will never know how much Lions are changing the world.

SMART Goals to Help Promote Your Club.

Here's how your club can begin right away:

Specific – Choose one project this year to promote widely (ex: vision screening, food drive, diabetes walk).

Measurable – Set a goal to publish at least one article, one social media post, and one community newsletter update about that project.

Actionable – Assign a Publicity Chairperson or small PR team in your club who will take responsibility for gathering photos, writing short blurbs, and submitting them.

Realistic – Start small. Use free tools—Facebook pages, community newspapers, local radio, and your club website.

Time-Bound – Aim to post within 48 hours after each service activity. Timely news spreads farther than old stories.

Remember, promotion is not bragging, it is an invitation. Every picture, every story, every shared success says: “Come serve with us. You belong here.”

Matching Grant Application**

"The mission of the TEAM Sheehan Charitable Foundation (501c3) is to empower MD5M Lions clubs to provide greater service by boosting their ability to complete community projects with matching grants."

1. The Lions project must address an important humanitarian need and provide an opportunity to highlight Lions in the communities they serve.
2. Grant applicants must submit their project proposals using the TSCF MD5M Club Grant application form.
3. The maximum grant amount that may be requested is currently \$3,000.00. All grants are 50/50 matching grants.
4. Grant proposals may be submitted by any Lions club within Multiple District 5M. Applications submitted by a club shall be signed by the current club president. The appropriate meeting minutes at which the application was voted on and approved must be submitted with the application.
5. TSCF grant applications should be submitted to TSCF prior to January 1, April 1, July 1 or October 1 for consideration at the following TSCF board meeting to allow adequate processing time.
6. Lions and/or their families may not receive direct or professional benefit from TSCF projects or have proprietary interest in projects receiving TSCF assistance.
7. Projects receiving TSCF funding shall be clearly identified in marketing as being made possible by Lions and TSCF.
8. Upon project completion, grant recipients are responsible for submission of a report detailing project results, all receipts/expenditures and use of TSCF grant funds.
9. Projects should be completed within one year of approval by TSCF, unless otherwise requested by applicant.

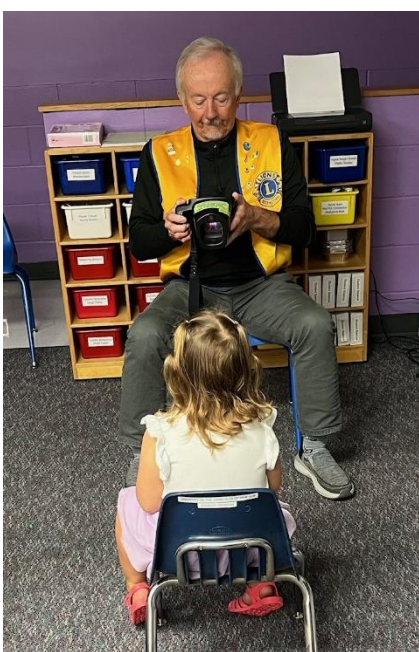


Combined Governor's Meeting held in New Ulm

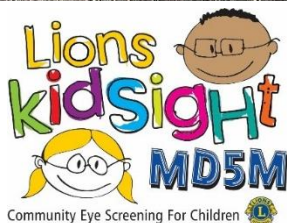
