

# **1VDG Tom Haag**

My name is Thomas Haag. I am the 1st Vice District Governor elect for 5M3. I believe I am a stranger to most of you so let me start at the beginning. I was born and raised on the family farm south of Pipestone and graduated high

school from Pipestone. I then went to several different colleges changing my degree from electronics engineering to Criminal Justice. I eventually graduated from St. Cloud State with a Criminal Justice Degree. I started my career in law enforcement in January 1992 in the village of Akeley Mn as the Chief of police. In 1994 I was offered a position in the city of Park Rapids as a patrolman. I was living a few miles out of town in the village of Nevis. While in Nevis I was approached by a friend asking if I would like to join the local Lions club which had just chartered, I did. That was almost 18 years ago.

Mid-August we did a burger feed and added almost \$1200 to our account.



### A GUIDE DOG STORY - KASSON W., NEW YORK

"I'm 37, I just lost my sight in 2020 just before the pandemic because I was attacked on the subway. I went from seeing to not, just in a day. I'm a people person, I'm a Leo, I used to bartend and I'm the life of the party. I have a close-knit family and I'm a protector. It's been a roller coaster since I lost my eyesight. During the beginning when it was also the start of the pandemic, I thought I would be able to see again, but the eye doctor told me I wouldn't be able to see again. At first, I didn't know there was life after being blind. I have a close-knit family and they tried to do everything for me, and I couldn't handle that. I needed to get past them doing everything which led me to feeling helpless. Then a new season began. It was rough in the beginning; I'm still getting through it... I'm still processing it, but sometimes I think maybe it was blessing because I'm doing things and experiencing things I normally wouldn't do. I feel like new doors have opened for me, everything feels right. I'm going with it and I'm not fighting against it. Leader Dogs for the Blind found me the best dog. I came to get Odyssey because I wanted to be heard. I motivate and inspire a lot of people and now I'm thinking about speaking and helping others."

#### Lions District 5M3 "MN Lions Diabetes Foundation" Cabinet Report August 11, 2024 Meeting.

The MN Lions Diabetes Foundation: A combined Vision, Hearing and Diabetes Foundation Banquet was held on Friday July 26, 2024 at the Double Tree by Hilton Hotel in Roseville, MN. A doctor from each of the research areas of the University of Minnesota spoke about the research being done in their three respective areas. Dr Chow of the Department of Medicine and Institute for Diabetes spoke on Diabetes, Obesity and Metabolism.

The following day the MN Lions Diabetes Foundation held it first quarterly meeting of the year. It is was stated that there will be a combined Vision, Hearing and Diabetes booth in the educational building at the State Fair. A request for grant money from the U of M for Diabetes Research and maybe Camp Sweet Life will be coming later in the year. There are plans to have a state wide fund raiser for the MLDF in the near future.

MLDF Annual Diabetes Research Update will be planned again in March of 2025. Watch for details at a later date.

New Ulm Diabetes Walk: The New Ulm and Lafayette Lion Clubs will join together again to hold their 10th Annual New Ulm Diabetes Walk on Sat. October 5, 2024. If you haven't worked the State fair, it a great time working with Lions members and meeting new members.

The tree service project is up and running and is off to a great start. 5M3 had ordered 500 silver maple trees and they were delivered on April 23. Thirty-three Clubs participated in the tree project, and everyone enjoyed planting the trees and watching them grow. Sherburn Lions have planted their trees in the two city parks. It looks like maybe the rabbits had a good time and chewed the tops of trees and will have to be planted over.

Jackson Lions have put in over 100 ramps in are local area and they are well received. Sherburn Lions have started installing ramps also and been very fun project to do. Sherburn have install 4 ramps and it's fun to see the homeowners have a safe way to get around.

Grant applicants must submit their project proposals using the TSCF MD5M Club Grant application form.

 The maximum grant amount that may be requested is currently \$3,000.00. All grants are 50/50 matching grants.

4. Grant proposals may be submitted by any Lions club within Multiple District 5M. Applications submitted by a club shall be signed by the current club president. The appropriate meeting minutes at which the application was voted on and approved must be submitted with the application.

5. TSCF grant applications should be submitted to TSCF prior to January 1,

April 1, July 1 or October 1 for consideration at the following TSCF board meeting to allow adequate processing time.

Lions and/or their families may not receive direct or professional benefit from TSCF projects or have proprietary interest in projects receiving TSCF assistance.

Projects receiving TSCF funding shall be clearly identified in marketing as being made possible by Lions and TSCF.

 Upon project completion, grant recipients are responsible for submission of a report detailing project results, all receipts/expenditures and use of TSCF grant funds.

Projects should be completed within one year of approval by TSCF, unless otherwise requested by applicant.

#### Appendix 28.0 MD5M HALL OF FAME Procedure

#### Purpose

To honor those Lion and Lioness members of character and substance who have demonstrated the highest level of commitment and dedication to the efforts of their club, district or multiple district and the motto of our association, "We Serve."

#### Award

There shall be a maximum of one (1) recipient of the MD5M Hall of Fame Award per district, inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame each year. The award may be presented posthumously.

The MD5M Hall of Fame award recipients are to be inducted into the Hall of Fame at the annual MD5M Multiple District Convention during the Saturday noon luncheon.

MD5M Hall of Fame recipients shall receive a MD5M Hall of Fame award plaque and a Hall of Fame lapel pin in recognition of their induction in the MD5M Hall of Fame. In addition, a complete listing of all MD5M Hall of Fame recipients shall appear in the annual MD5M directory and a perpetual plaque, with the names of all inductees and the year of their induction inscribed thereon, shall be kept in a prominent place in the MD5M office, when available.

The presentation of the MD5M Hall of Fame inductees shall be the responsibility of the current International Director from MD5M, if there is one and he/she is in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention. If not, then the most recent Past International Director having served from MD5M in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

#### Criteria

A candidate may be a Lion or Lioness, must have been a member in good standing for at least 15 years, be at least two (2) years removed from the Council of Governors if a PDG, should have qualifications above and beyond the call of duty including social and human endeavors, and he/she should be of good moral character and have a good reputation in his/her community. A nominee must be a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club, or must have been a member in good standing of a Lions or Lioness Club at the time of their death.

#### Process

A candidate may be sponsored by any Lion, Lioness, Lions Club, Lioness Club, Zone, or District.

There shall be a nomination fee of \$150.00 per each candidate nominated. The nomination fee shall be returned to those sponsors whose candidates are not elected for induction into the MD5M Hall of Fame. The nomination fee for those selected for induction shall be sent to MD5M and shall be used to offset the cost of the award process, plaques and pin. Nominations, including the nomination fee, must be received by the District Governor at least 30 days prior to the District's Midwinter Convention.

Each individual District shall annually hold an election at their Midwinter Convention to determine the candidate(s), if any, to be inducted into the Hall of Fame for that Lion Year. Each sponsor shall have an opportunity to give a brief presentation on the merits and biographical information of their nominee prior to the election. Those elected to be inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame shall not be publicly announced until their induction at the MD5M Multiple District Convention.

All nominations shall use the standard form, no others shall be accepted. The nomination fee must be received at the time the application is received, otherwise the nomination shall not be considered.

All successful candidates shall be inducted into the MD5M Hall of Fame at the next MD5M Multiple District Convention. The sponsor(s) and the respective District Governor shall ensure that the honoree or a suitable representative shall be in attendance at the MD5M Multiple District Convention Saturday Luncheon when the honorees are inducted.

A brief biography of each inductee shall be announced to those in attendance during the induction ceremony at the annual MD5M Multiple District Convention.
