District 25A's Mission To Mexico—2016

Four o'clock in the morning was an early start on February 13, 2016 when 33 Lions from 13 clubs headed out for the Eyeglass Mission to Mexico. Four of the members were first-timers! Our destination was Tulancingo in the State of Hildalgo, which is approximately 2.5 hours Northeast of Mexico City.

Upon our arrival in Tulancingo, we were greeted by several of their Lions members, who helped us get settled in our rooms at the Hotel Colonial. The hotel to the worksite was a short walk, less than five minutes. The worksite was an old dance hall that had been converted into a public parking garage by the Tulancingo Lions and was a source of their income. There was an upstairs area in the building that had been converted into their clubhouse. Interestingly, some of the dance hall décor stayed, like the wall statues, tiled flooring and the grand hall chandelier! The next day, Sunday, everyone pitched in to set up the worksite, including unpacking 59,651 pairs of glasses. We always have a few small problems such as electric, getting enough tables and chairs and such. When the work day started on Monday, we were ready to go and accomplished our goal, helping those see better than they did prior to our arrival. So, Monday through Friday of the first week the day started with breakfast at 7am and then working with the patients. The days were quite long and it would usually be 8 or 9 pm before we finished for the day.

With over 5760 patients helped that week, by Friday night it was time to relax a little with their club who provided dinner, drinks and entertainment, which included Butch Weston's favorite; a Mariachi Band. The dinner also included a formal reading of the Lions Code of Ethics in Spanish by one of their club members and in English by one of our mission members.

Now it was time to pack up all the glasses and equipment to make the move to the second week in the city of Apan, which was about an hour and a half drive from Tulancingo. We said goodbye to 10 of the members who were not able to stay the 2nd week. Apan was a little higher in elevation at about 8,300 ft. above sea level. After settling into our hotel, which was right downtown, we had dinner with the mayor and his staff. Once again we were welcomed with open arms. This week started the same as last with setting up the worksite by unpacking and setting up equipment and glasses. It was about a 20-minute walk to the worksite, so the local DIF provided transportation in their personal vehicles or an old converted ambulance for those who didn't want to walk. Days started with breakfast at 7 am at the worksite and ended between 8 and 9 pm each evening. By the time we were done, 4901 patients had been seen and helped with glasses. When we left, both towns were well pleased with all the hard work and dedication it took to get the job done.

In my closing words, as the mission leader, it was an honor to be a part of this mission group, which is second to none. They all pulled together despite a few problems here and there to make District 25A Lions a group to be proud of. A huge THANK YOU goes out to all the members and the District for their support.
