While we concentrate on bringing in new members we must always work to keep the members we have. So far this year MD25A added 55 members. Unfortunately, the District dropped 78 Lions leaving the District with 23 less people helping people than it started with on July 1, 2019.

So why do Lions leave? Yes Lions do pass away, and move, but most Lions t are dropped because they fail to pay dues, and/or attend meetings and events. The real question is why don't they attend events and pay their dues. On the surface the answers seem the same as always — long meetings that accomplish little, lack of agendas, lack of leadership, and all the other reasons we have been hearing for years and years. Before we drop them, do we make personal contact with them and ask why they are leaving or do we just say "oh let's drop them and get it over with?" Do we have no time to care for each other because we are very busy caring for others?

More than 48% of Lions say the leave because they did not feel valued and they were not making a difference. We need to change this attitude and get all Lions to understand just how big an impact they can make in the lives of people not only their community but throughout Indiana and even the world. Stop for a moment and think about that time when you became a Lion—not when joined and paid dues—but maybe that time when a child look up and smiled and said thank you for a toy or a food basket or a pair of eye glasses. Those times when someone thought no one cared and you and the Lions prove them wrong—Lions do care.

Communicating the good we do even within our own club seem too difficult for Lions to do. Try this approach:

At each meeting a Lion should speak on a club service project and how the project impacts an individual or the community. How and who did it help?

Read thank you notes clearly so everyone knows how the club makes a difference.

invite someone to speak about the impact of the club's project.

Many projects serve a number of people and organizations so find someone to speak to the project

This will help all Lions feel valued and proud to be Lions and they will stay active.

Eyeglass Mission to Mexico 2019

On February 16th, 37 Lions Club International members from District 25A left for Tula, Mexico, for their 2019 Eyeglass Recycling Mission. Local Lions were Butch and Rhonda Weston, Kurt and Lisa Crizer, and Pat Hanson from the Westville Lions, Joe Davila from Hanna Lions, Bo Zimmerman from Union Mills Lions Club, and Jenel Zepik from the Michiana Club. Prior to their arrival, 67,000 pair of glasses were shipped to Mexico to be used for this Mission; they will also be used for two more missions over the next two weeks. The 25A Eyeglass Recycling Program began in 2001 under the direction of Gene Rice of Wanatah and has now seen over 153,000 patients. Over one million pair of glasses have been shipped to Mexico, and two permanent clinics have been established using the remaining glasses from the missions.

The group arrived in Tula on Saturday and 800 patients arrived Sunday and the work began. When a patient arrives, they begin at the registration tables, where their personal information is gathered and recorded. The patient then goes for their acuity reading on the E chart. From there they go the autorefractor which gets a reading of their needed eyeglass script. The patient then goes to the doctor who screens the information and determines if the patient needs to go to the doctor for further screening or can proceed to get their glasses. Their information is then sent to the computer station where the script is entered into a database to find the closest script to match their script within parameters. That pair of glasses is then pulled from the inventory and matched up with the patient. They then go to the fitting station where the glasses are fitted and vision is tested with the new glasses. By the end of the week, 6,430 patients were seen by the Lions.

Tula, with an elevation of 6,700 feet, is located about two hours north of Mexico City, with a population of 125,000 residents. The interpreters with the Lions members explained that jobs are scarce in this area. The residents that came to the clinic were very friendly and appreciative when they received their new glasses. On the group's travel day, they visited a pyramid in Tula.

For some Lions Club members on Mexico Mission 2019, making this trek to Mexico is something they've done before. It is fulfilling. It is long volunteer hours but at the end of each day, you know you have truly made a difference in the lives of others. Each volunteer has had a part in delivering the gift of improved sight. For other members, it is something they have heard about but not yet experienced. This year, Lion Jenel Zepik who lives in Wanatah and belongs to the Michiana Lions Club had the opportunity to join the group traveling to Tula and experience her first mission. She has the following impression from her first trip.

From the Eyes of Lion Jenel Zepik

For my first time on the eyeglass mission, I was not sure what to expect but I went with the flow. I was assigned to work with Rhonda Weston to the reader's booth. This booth is where the patients come that are not required to get prescription eyeglasses by the eye exam. Rhonda and I each worked with patients one-on-one. We would pick out a few frames in different colors/ styles and then ask the patient which one interests them. Every day we had a Spanish translator as well. Once the patient picked the eyeglasses, they would try them on and read an eye chart to be sure the prescription works for them. I couldn't believe all the smiles I got to see once they put on the glasses; it was such an emotional feeling. So many gave handshakes, hugs, kisses on the cheek, and even said a blessing in Spanish. Basically, it was nice to turn the frown upside for them.

They came in for help, and they left able to see with our help! One lady I helped get a pair of readers left happy and then came back. She asked our translator how to pronounce my name. I told her, and I wrote it down on a piece of paper for her since she had it handy. Then she told the translator that she thought my name was beautiful. Her daughter is having a baby girl, and she wants to name her granddaughter with my name. I just thought to myself, "wow"! All the patients were so appreciative and kind.

Not only did I meet these great patients, I gained a lot of new friends that are residents of Tula and Mexico City and plan to keep in touch by Facebook. The staff of Tula and all the other Lions member from Mexico were great to work with. After the first day of the mission trip, I was already looking forward to future mission trips! I would have never thought to put the eyeglasses mission trip on my bucket list, but this is an experience everyone should add. I joined the Lions because they helped me to achieve getting my cochlear implant almost three years ago. Since I don't have the luxury to monetarily give back, instead I decided to give back my time to help others. This mission trip was a huge plus for me to give tremendous help to others. It felt good! I'm proud to be a Lion. ~ Lion Jenel Zepik
