

Basically, keep using myLion and myLCl until April 11". Make sure the data for your club is up-to-date. Between April 12" and May 12", LCl will be migrating all the data and users to the Portal. During that time, just note any new member and/or activity information to be entered into the Portal. Make sure to keep on the lookout for your Portal Invitation emails. On May 13" the Portal will be available – and the only tool to report your club membership and activities.

For more information, just go to www.lionsclubs.org, click on the and type in Portal.

You will be taken to links for Portal training videos and other information. Since it has been nine months since I first checked out the Portal, I will be reviewing the training videos. I recommend that all Club Officers do the same.

If you have any questions about the Portal, please feel free to contact either Lion Jim or myself. We will work with you and LCI to make sure all issues are resolved.

Even after all the training I have attended, I know that I will continue to learn as your District Governor. One skill I need to improve is conflict resolution. There are always going to be different points of view in a large group. However, we cannot allow those differences to separate or divide us. I know that dealing with conflict is not one of my strong points. As your DG I must be able to help resolve issues – not avoid them. Only then, will we all have a successful year!

THANK YOU FROM THE BOTTOM OF MY HEART. I really want to thank everyone for well wishes while I was laid up and not able to put any weight on my legs. As you know I am an amputee with a left below knee amputation. Well, on January 18 with some snow on the ground I slipped and fell and caught my right ankle and immobilized it during the fall. As a result, I twisted the ankle so severely I ended up breaking the ankle of my right foot in three places! Yikes! Now the question became—What's my good leg? I was told no weight bearing on the leg for 6-8 weeks. I worked really hard in rehabilitation and after six weeks I went to my orthopedic doctor who took an X=Ray that revealed the bones had mended and I could again weight bear on the broken angle. So back to rehab to learn to walk again and in one week I was discharged from rehab and sent home. Today I am walking without any assistance from crutches, canes, walkers, etc. The


only downside so far is that probably I'll be a great weather forecaster for rain. The ankle definitely tells me when the humidity increases.

Her pageant social platform was "Passion for Service: Promoting Community Service and Involvement". She traveled extensively during her year promoting community service and was named the National Goodwill Ambassador for the Children's Miracle Network. Miss Stam is married to Brian Irk and has three children.

J. Frank Moore III, of Daleville, Alabama, was elected as international president at the 2001 convention in Indianapolis. Children's Eye Foundation of AAPOS Selects Indiana Lions as Partner

The Children's Eye Foundation of the American Association of Pediatric Ophthalmology and Strabismus (CEF/AAPOS) and Indiana Lions Vision Services have agreed to partner and provide expanded vision care opportunities for Hoosier children.

This is the first statewide Lions partnership for CEF/AAPOS.

Under the terms of the agreement, CEF/AAPOS All Children See program will start accepting qualified referrals for pediatric ophthalmic care from the Indiana Lions' vision screening programs.

Children under eighteen years of age and either uninsured or underinsured would qualify for no cost or reduced cost care. This includes ocular surgery and other treatments for pediatric eye conditions.

Megan Pfefferle, Executive Director of CEF/AAPOS said, "The Lions of Indiana are simply amazing. They provide tens of thousands of free vision screenings per year to schools and preschools already. This screening makes early detection possible, so our two programs are a natural fit. They find kids that may need help, our doctors can diagnose them, CEF/AAPOS helps eliminate the cost barriers to care, and the kids get into treatment."

Charlie Short and Henry Rodriguez of the Indiana Lions both expressed how important the new partnership is. "Indiana Lions have worked to help the blind and visually impaired for over a hundred years. Now we have a national professional association's foundation as a partner. It's just terrific." said Rodriguez.

"Indiana is the first statewide Lions partnership for CEF/AAPOS and we couldn't be more pleased." said Short. "Bringing two large-scale organizations together to accomplish more is always a good thing, but when it's such a natural alliance, it's just like meeting a great new friend. We're all excited to get going."
