

Fishing For Life on June 13 & 14



On June 13th & 14th of 2015, (9) blind or visually impaired youth gathered at the property of Lions Butch and Rhonda Weston. Some came up on the Friday June 12, to set up tents, eat pizza, and get to know each other. We sat around the campfire and talked, even after the power went out, on some of our goals we wanted to accomplish. Lion Butch had a generator to run the necessities.

Saturday morning came awfully early, I know of a couple of Leo's were up long before myself to start the coffee and get the fire going again. It had rained a little bit during the night, and the fire only had a few ambers left. We were to have donuts, along with other breakfast item's but with the power off the night before, the place we were to get the donuts from was not able to make them. So we improvised and scrambled around to make eggs, sausage, and pancakes, it worked out well and was enjoyed by all.

After breakfast we started the day by explaining the day's events. Many lions from around the district came out to help along with several Leo's. The Lions helped with the blind on putting the fishing poles together, even tying on the hooks and putting on the worms. We all were amazed how well they did. The Leos were then to partner up with a blind person and go down to the pond and see what they could catch, with the lions to offer assistance if needed. Amazingly enough, nobody got hooked, or lines tangled up. Where did the morning go, it was lunch time, and the 4-H group came along with the horses. So after lunch those that wished to rode the horses, while some went on a wagon ride. This was a free time for the Leo's and any others who wished to, go swimming.

After a short break, Lions Connie and Robin had planned paddle boat racing, with the blind person and a Leo in the paddle boat. The objective was for the blind person to steer the boat while the Leo gave the directions on which way to go. They had to paddle across the pond and touch the dock on the other side and come back. Easier said than done, by many. With only the winners of each to race again. This left an odd team with no one to race against them. Oh, but DGE Randy was there, a vote was taken, and we volunteered Randy, and Robin to go, but a blindfold had to be worn by one of them. Well the outcome was what we expected, they lost. DGE Randy kept losing his seat, and they kept going in circles in the pond.

A group of us met with the parents of the blind, to discuss any issues that they have with the child's education, and other problems. Some of the issues got solved, while others are going to take some time. Dinner came and went, all seemed a little tired, but managed to stay up for the evenings event. A talent show was presented to those that stayed. The blind entertained us with singing, dancing, jokes, and even self defense.

After another short night, where does time go, breakfast was ready, Awards were given out along with certificates for attendance, door prizes, and those that wished took their fishing poles home with them. After several more pictures were taken and hugs and thanks were given ,all departed for their journey back home. I heard a lot of Lions say WOW, I never knew much about this, but we will be back next year to help support this. TIME FOR CLEANUP!! We want to say thank you for those that stayed to help, it does not take long when we all pitch in to help. Also a huge thanks to Cabela's, Family Express, and everyone who helped with the shelter, and prepare and serve meals, to make this happen every year. Next year will be the fifth one, so we need to work on something special. The committee is open for suggestions.


