

What?

## What?

We Know what we are. We are Lions that make up the World’s largest service organization. Our motto is: We Serve. Our motto is our result; we serve others, whether it is in our community or somewhere else in the world.

## How?

We hold fundraisers to provide service(s) to help better the lives of an individual, our communities, and others around the world.

## Why?

**Why is not how or what you do. Why is...Why do you do it? Why is it important to you?**

For example; **What** we do is provide food baskets to those cannot afford to have a special dinner with their family at Thanksgiving or Christmas. **How** do we do this? Well, we hold a pancake breakfast, which by the way are hands-down, the best in the District! But **Why** did you do that? The **Why** is because for some reason it was important to you that a family was able to share a special meal together that they could not afford without your help, and the smiles on the children’s faces when you delivered the basket was so heart-warming you knew why you do what you do. **What is your personal purpose? Your personal Cause? Your personal belief? The answers to these questions become the reason Why.**

The What, How, Why concept is called the Golden Circle by Simon Sinek, renowned motivational speaker and organizational consultant. He says that most marketing strategies work backwards, meaning that they tell you What they are offering, then they say How we are better or different and then expect some sort of gung-ho behavior *without telling you why you should buy into it*. Meh, not all that inspiring. Here’s an example of that strategy for going on an Eyeglass Mission. Lion Bob says to his neighbor Betty, “Hey, would you like to go on an eyeglass mission to Mexico? **What** we do is put glasses on about 8,000 patients, and **how** we are able to achieve that is by taking glasses that are donated to eyeglass recycling. Oh, and yeah, we work really long hours.” Betty responded, “**Why** in the world would I want to do that?” Why? If Lion Bob had started with the **Why**, and the personal experience and satisfaction of going on a mission, Betty would have had a different response or view, a feeling of why she would want to go on a mission. **People don’t necessarily buy into what you do; but will more likely buy into Why you do it!**

Simon said, Let us start with the Why, not the what and how to inspire others. Martin Luther King gave a I Have a Dream speech, not I have a Plan speech. There are leaders and then there are those that lead. Leaders hold a position of power or authority but those who truly lead, inspire us. We follow those that lead not because we have to, but for ourselves. If we start with Why...it will inspire those around us. The Why will help find those that may inspire you!

DISTRICT 25A GMT*It is all about people*

July 29, 2018

Congratulations to the Lions of District 25A. On June 30, 2018 District 25A has 8 more Lions helping People than on June 30, 2017. While the number seems small, the achievement great, This is the first time in many years District 25A ended the year with more Lions helping people..

Our approach in 25A is to reach as many Lions directly as possible. We asking Lions to sign a pledge sheet saying they will ask at least three people to become Lions. Lions that sign are eligible to win \$50. Lion Doug Smeltz won a crispy new \$50 at the District Convention. Those that sponsored a new Lion will be eligible to win an additional \$50 at the first 2019 cabinet meeting and clubs that end in a plus will be eligible to win \$100 for their Administrative fund.

We will focus on what is behind “membership”– *People helping People helping People.*

People Helping People – and their communities define Lions Clubs International and a Lions club. Lions perform miracles by giving the gift of sight, saving lives by eradicating measles, eliminating the pains of hunger, allowing the disable to become free by building handicaps ramps, replacing the tears on children’s faces with smiles, and making our communities a better place to work, live and raise children. And the list goes on. Lions need to know this so they can feel valued and they are making a difference. Lions Clubs need to be sure they are meeting the needs of their community and its people. A Community Needs Assessment can help.

People that help People - It was a shock to learn so many Lions leave, not because of health, time or moving, but because they do not feel valued and do not feel they are making a difference. Hard to believe, but true. 2018-2019 program will focus on keeping the members we have as well as getting people to become members. We will continue to focus on People in the coming months with a major initiative of keeping the people we have and them making feel valued and proud to be Lions knowing they make a difference.

We need to reimagine our clubs cultures and how they operate. The presentation - “People helping People helping People”, provides ideas and information on making clubs stronger by using tools such as “How are Your Ratings”, “Membership Satisfaction Guide”, “Your Club Your Way”, and other information such as “Ideas to Engage Members”. I ask all Zone Chairs to invite me to a Zone Meeting so I can provide each Club a package containing these tools and other information on how to keep Lions from leaving. It will include an effort to get Clubs to use new technology and to reinvent how they operate.

People Helping - Talks about the need for Clubs to use the technology to attract new people and keep the members we have. Using emails and texts messages to make decisions, approve minutes and treasures reports, can reduce the length of meetings, and make them more productive. Technology can help all Lions feel connected and valued. The LCI publication “Your Club Your Way” suggests clubs combining traditional meetings with gatherings designed to bring Lions together with each other and their families. Make the gathering a celebration of the Lions’ service to people and the community.

While we all look at numbers, we all need to look behind the numbers and see people – people with service to others in their hearts, minds, and souls. We need to let those people in our clubs know they are valued and are truly making difference and encourage them to ask others to join us as:

People helping People helping People.

It is all about people helping people. Our District ended with a plus 8 on June 30, 2018 with 1296 Lions. While that doesn't seem like much, it is an enormous accomplishment because the Lions of this awesome District reversed the trend of losing more Lions than we brought in. If District 25A falls below 1250 members, LCI will begin to take away some of our privileges and independence, and there is a possibility that we would need to merge with another District. There are also financial impacts which affect the incoming District Governor and the ability to effectively administer the district. Our challenge for 2018-2019 is to have 1320 Lions on June 30, 2019.

By believing it is all about people helping people We CAN meet and exceed this challenge.

The first step is “Ask Just Ask.” Attached is a Pledge sheet I hope all Lions will sign. Each Lion that signs pledges to ask three individuals to become Lions. As an incentive, all who sign will be entered into a drawing for a \$50 cash prize. In addition, sponsors of new Lions will be entered in a drawing to win an additional \$50. Will this be your \$50 or \$100 or some other Lion's? Sign up, meet the challenge, and make these dollars your dollars.

Pledge sheets will be sent to each club and to Zone Chairs to distribute to their clubs. Please ask the Lions in your club sign the pledge so District 25A continues as a viable community service organization. Completed Pledge Sheet must be returned to GMT Dick Silveira before January 30, 2019.



## Michiana Lions—Little Libraries

The libraries, boxes designed to look like buildings, are filled with books that can be borrowed, read and returned. They also serve as donation boxes for books. "The Police Department appreciates this partnership with the Lions to do something like this," Police Chief Mark Swistek said. "It's a great program and something that is good for the neighborhood and the kids."

The Michiana Lions have built and installed three Little Libraries so far this summer and are working on their fourth. The first went to 10th Street where the Lions help develop a garden. According to Michiana Lions President Jamie Miller "The area was a garbage-infested lot, and now it's a beautiful garden producing fresh food for the homeless and soup kitchens. The environment was cleaned; Boys & Girls Club summer camp kids were educated on healthy food growing; and it's providing food in a food desert"

And now the Lions are providing books – for adults and kids. Book donations have come from everywhere. There was some concern on whether the books would be returned, but the box fills and empties and then fills again. The most important point is they are being read – and shared.

And the books don't really belong to the Lions anyway, Lion Jamie said. "They belong to the whole city. It's the Michiana Lions' hope that our free libraries will bring a little more joy, a little more connection and a lot more books to our community."
