

Lions Clubs International Club Excellence Award

As your District Governor I am very proud of all the Clubs in District 25-A. I think every club in this district is excellent. But LCI recognizes Clubs annually with a Club Excellence Award if you meet the criteria below. The Lions Clubs International Club Excellence Award is a prestigious recognition given to clubs that demonstrate outstanding performance in various areas. This award aims to motivate clubs to strive for excellence and contribute significantly to their communities.

Criteria for Club Excellence Award

To qualify for the Club Excellence Award, clubs must meet specific criteria in the following areas:

1. Membership:

o Achieve a net growth of two members or 10% or more members (whichever is greater) or charter a new Lions club within the current Lions year.

2. **Service**:

o Start a new service project, considering one of the global causes.

3. LCIF (Lions Clubs International Foundation):

 Contribute to LCIF an amount equal to or greater than the club's membership total multiplied by US\$10.

4. Leadership and Organizational Excellence:

 Ensure the club is in good standing (not in status quo or financial suspension: district dues paid and no unpaid balance with Lions International greater than US\$50 outstanding 90 days or more).

5. **Marketing**:

o Publish its service activities through local media and social media.

Application Process

The application process for the Club Excellence Award involves the following steps:

- Clubs must complete the application form, which includes criteria for both the Club Excellence Award and the Club 5 Star Excellence Award.
- Applications must be signed by the current district governor. If sent from the district governor's email, it qualifies as the signature on the application being submitted electronically.
- Applications are due by August 31, 2025.
- Awards will be mailed to the 2025-2026 district governor.





Instead of writing checks to each individual project you may now write one check to the district accompanied by the form that follows. If there is a project that you wish to donate to that is not listed write it in one of the "Other" boxes. Total the amount and write one check for that amount. This should simplify the process, eliminate questions of "who do I write the check to?" and your check will be cashed immediately.

Indiana Lions Foundation Matching Grants

The Indiana Lions Foundation's Matching Grants Benefit Many Lions Charitable Projects

The Indiana Lions Foundation completed its fiscal year with \$24,652 in matching grants awarded to twenty-five clubs and Camp Woodsmoke as well as a disaster assistance grant awarded to District E.

These grants resulted in many benefits to our fellow Hoosiers through the enabling of these clubs in pursuing many charitable projects through the use of their charitable funds supplemented by Foundation matching grants. As a results of this club/Foundation partnership:

- 1. Children 1) learned to appreciate reading through listening to stories in their public parks, 2) received their own book and 3) accessed new books placed in their library
- 2. Children learned how to fish
- 3. Children were screened for vision abnormalities and dyslexia in their schools
- 4. Children received beds to sleep in when they had no bed and were given food on weekends when no food was available in their home
- 5. Children were able to attend Camp Woodsmoke with a working infirmary
- 6. Communities benefited by 1) receiving information through the erection of informational signs 2) being able to use ADA compliant restroom facilities and 3) being able to use modern plumbing systems and kitchen facilities in their community centers
- 7. The uninsured were able to receive medical care in a free clinic with updated exam lighting.
- 8. Communities were enhanced with new tree plantings and entertained by Fourth of July fireworks displays
- 9. First responders benefited by being able to use a working beverage cooler in their firehouse and by being able to have 'blue bags' available to treat autistic victims and traumatized children.

LCIF Approves MCAT Grant for Texas Relief Efforts

While we fully respect and recognize the value of state foundations, it's important to remember they operate independently and are not officially affiliated with LCIF. Most significantly, they do not have the global grantmaking capacity that LCIF offers in times of crisis. That's why LCIF exists — to be ready and able to respond when disasters strike and communities need us most.

This newly approved MCAT grant is just one example of how LCIF can act swiftly and substantially, thanks to the generosity of donors like you and Lions across CAI and around the world. While local giving may feel more immediate, LCIF provides the structure, scale, and global reach to deploy major relief quickly and strategically — and ensures that every gift counts toward meaningful recognition through MJF.

Giving to LCIF's Disaster Relief Fund supports more than one crisis — it strengthens our ability to respond to the next one. That readiness is what sets LCIF apart, and that's the power of *your* Foundation.




