

W. P. Woods Awards

At the November 12, 2016 meeting of the Indiana Lions Foundation, the trustees passed a policy to deal with outdated credits and moneys that are shown on the received funds list. These are credits earned by working at the State Fair, race track, etc., or money donated by clubs or individuals. The W.P. Woods Fellowship program began in 1995 and Lions have been working since to gain credits towards a W. P. Woods Fellowship.

Some of the credits or money were earned or donated as far back as 2006-2007 Lions year. In an effort to use these older credits and money, the Trustees are going to be contacting each of the holders of older accounts to see what they want to do with their credits or money. The policy will take effect July 1, 2017.

Every effort will be made to contact the account holders to determine what steps will be taken. Also you do not need to wait for a trustee to contact you about your club or individual account. You can contact them. You have three trustees in each district to contact. They are listed in your district governor's directory and the state directory.



THOUGHTS FROM THE CHAIR

The MD1 Host Committee has moved into a higher gear as we are within eight months of the 2017 LCI Centennial Convention. It is like someone expecting their first born. You are excited about the birth, but at the same time you are questioning if you will be ready for that responsible. We, too as a committee, is nervous about being ready to accept the responsibility that we are looking at as the host of this great celebration of our organization.

When things were going good and we were finalizing our plans, LCI threw us a curve and now we must reorganize to the new plans. There have been changes to the schedule of events that are effecting the Host Committee's responsibility. Those changes have been adopted by the LCI Board at their latest meeting that happen in October. Some of those changes are:

- The hours of the Convention Services and Exhibit Hall has been extended for additional hours per day. This change is to accommodate the high number of attendees.
- The Delegate Certification and Voting Procedures has been change. Instead of Certifying any time during the convention and then everyone coming to vote on the same day. You will now be able to get Certified and vote immediately. To date, we have not learned what that means for us as to the manpower that will be needed. That will come at a later date.
- LCI is considering using the main Exhibit Hall for the Plenary Session with no overflow hall as they have originally planned. This will limit the amount of volunteers needed per Plenary Sessions.
- LCI has added a Business Session on Saturday, July 1 following the parade. This session will be for the nomination of the candidates for International Directors. The third Vice President's nomination will take place at the Sunday morning session.
- DGE Schooling will be using additional venues as just the one as originally planned. Now there will activities at Navy Pier and McCormick Place. This will added more volunteers needed during the DGE Schooling prior to the start of the convention.

With these changes, we have the opportunity to demonstrate are ability to be flexible and ready for anything that LCI will need during the convention. As chair of this committee, I feels that we are up to that challenge. So, I hope that you too agree with me and help us achieve our goal of a success convention.

The more hands that we have helping, the easier it will be to look back and say how easy and fun it was to be that Host.
